





Take precautions before and after your trip. During the 14 days leading up to your trip, avoid situations that could put you at risk for infection, such as attending large group events or using public transportation, recommends the CDC. Then, get tested with a viral test 1-3 days before you travel and keep a copy of your negative test results with you. After your trip, get tested again 3-5 days after arriving home and make plans to self-quarantine for 7 days after travel, regardless of your test results.

The CDC also advises getting vaccinated, if eligible, and waiting until two weeks after your final vaccination dose to travel.

Pack a "pandemic bag." Condé Nast Traveler recommends stocking up on pandemic essentials before you head out. Pack a bag with COVID-19 prevention staples including "hand sanitizer, face masks, disinfecting wipes, health insurance cards, a thermometer, latex gloves (for one-time use in public spaces), and hand soap." If you'll be on the road for extended periods of time, it's a good idea to bring drinks and snacks along too so as to avoid unnecessary stops in public places.

Make flexible travel plans. Flexibility is key during the pandemic. Be willing to pay extra for fully refundable flights, car rentals, and accommodations. Your plans may change last-minute due to an unexpected lockdown or infection.

Understand what travel insurance covers. CNBC reminds travelers that purchasing travel insurance is wise, but it may not cover every situation. Read the fine print or work with a travel agent to understand how your policy works. Most travel insurance will cover medical expenses if you get sick during your trip or the cost of your trip if you must cancel due to illness, but they may not cover the cost of your trip if you need to cancel because a state or city goes into lockdown unexpectedly. Read BBB's tips on buying travel insurance.

Opt for a road trip instead of a flying. Waiting in security lines and sitting on crowded flights will increase

your risk of infection, says Nerd Wallet. If you, or anyone you'll be in contact with, is in a high-risk group, it's best to drive. Road travel carries risks too, but it's much easier to mitigate them from within a smaller space you and your family control. Read BBB's tips on renting an RV and buying camping gear.

Book accommodations that make it easy to follow COVID-19 guidelines. Business Insider recommends speaking with the hotel or host before you book a stay. Find out what precautions and sanitary measures they are taking in between guests. Inquire about shared facilities, such as gyms, pools, spas and restaurants. In many cases, such facilities could be shut down until further notice. Make sure you are comfortable with the precautions any hotel or vacation rental has in place ahead of time.

Wear a mask and social distance. To protect yourself and your family, CDC advises travelers to wear a mask, avoid crowded areas and stay at least six feet away from others whenever you are in a public space.

Enjoy the great outdoors. Hiking and camping at state and national parks are a great way to enjoy warmer weather since they don't involve sharing indoor spaces with others. If you want to stay a few days, book your campsite well in advance. Parks have become a popular pandemic vacation option and spaces are limited.

BBB tips on making donations to help Ukraine relief

As the Russian invasion of Ukraine has begun, concerns grow about current and potential emergency needs of the Ukraine people. Generous donors want to help by supporting charities that are raising funds for assistance. BBB Wise Giving Alliance offers the following tips for donors to consider along with a list of BBB Accredited Charities that have announced Ukraine-related activities or plans on their websites.

BBB always encourages generosity to help the those in need but cautions donors to avoid questionable appeals by considering the following:

Can the charity get to the impacted area? Not all relief organizations will be positioned to provide relief quickly. See if the charity already has a presence in Ukraine.

Should you send clothing and food? Local drives to collect clothing and food to send overseas may not be practical as the logistics and timing to deliver and disperse such items will be challenging. Relief organizations are better equipped to obtain what is needed, distribute it effectively and avoid duplication of effort.

Does the relief charity meet BBB Charity Standards? You can verify a charity's trustworthiness by viewing an evaluative report completed by BBB Wise Giving Alliance. See the list provided below of charities that are soliciting for relief assistance for Ukraine and that also meet the BBB Standards for Charity Accountability.



Is the charity experienced in providing emergency relief? Experienced disaster relief charities are the best bet to help deliver aid as soon as possible. New entrants may have difficulty in following through even if they have the best of intentions.

Are you considering crowdfunding appeals? If engaging in crowdfunding, it is safest to give to someone you personally know and trust. Make sure you review the platform's policies regarding fees and distribution of collected funds. If the crowdfunding request is from a charity, check out the group by visiting Give.org. Keep in mind that some crowdfunding sites do very little vetting of individuals or organizations who post for relief assistance. Sites which take security measures will usually provide descriptions of these procedures.

Does charity claim to give 100% to the cause or program? Remember, charities do have fundraising and administrative expenses. Any charity claiming otherwise is potentially misleading the donating public.

Even a credit card donation will have a processing fee.

The following nationally-soliciting charities are BBB Accredited (i.e., they meet the 20 BBB Standards for Charity Accountability). Cryptocurrency scams climbed to second riskiest in 2021, according to BBB report

Online purchase scams remain #1 riskiest

Scams related to cryptocurrency jumped from the seventh riskiest scam in 2020 to second riskiest in 2021, according to the 2021 BBB Scam Tracker Risk Report, released today. Although cryptocurrency scams made up only 1.9% of the scams reported to BBB Scam TrackerSM in 2021, the average reported median dollar loss reported for these scams was \$1,200, much higher than the overall median dollar loss of \$169 for all scam types. The annual report analyzes scams reported to the Better Business Bureau.

A BBB report on cryptocurrency scams is expected to be released Thursday, March 24. The report will focus on digital currencies, the tactics scammers use to take advantage of people, and what consumers can do to protect themselves.

Online purchase scams maintained the top spot as the riskiest; this scam type made up 37.4% of all scams reported to BBB Scam Tracker in 2021, with 74.9% reporting a monetary loss. Employment scams dropped in 2021, from second riskiest to third. The susceptibility and median dollar loss of this scam type dropped slightly, while the number of reported scams increased from 7.1% in 2020 to 7.8% in 2021.

"Scammers shift their tactics constantly and appear to have expanded their use of cryptocurrency to perpetrate

fraud," said Melissa Lanning Trumpower, executive director of the BBB Institute for Marketplace Trust, which produced the 2021 BBB Scam Tracker Risk Report. "Cryptocurrency scams were riskier in 2021 with 66% of those targeted by this scam type losing money and a reported median dollar loss of \$1,200. Scammers are using social media and other means to promise investment opportunities with great returns and low risks, which is a huge red flag. We received many reports of people being targeted on a variety of social media platforms after their friends' accounts were hacked."

While susceptibility (the percentage of people who lose money when targeted by a scam) decreased in 2021, median dollar loss rose 47.0%. Credit cards remained the highest reported payment method with a monetary loss, followed by online payment systems. Payment made via cryptocurrency that resulted in a monetary loss more than doubled from 2020. The payment methods with the highest median dollar loss were wire transfer (\$1,540), cryptocurrency (\$1,200), check (\$900), and prepaid card (\$700).

Regarding age, online purchase scams were the riskiest for all age groups in 2021. Cryptocurrency scams were the second riskiest for ages 25-64. Employment scams were

second riskiest and third riskiest across several age brackets. Interestingly, investment scams were third riskiest for ages 18-24 for the first time since BBB began publishing the risk report. The rise of cryptocurrency scams as the second riskiest overall in 2021 may play a role in the rise of investment scams for this age group.

More than 44% reported losing confidence or peace of mind because of the emotional impact of being targeted by a scam and about 35% reported losing personal information. About the same percentage of people (55.5%) reported losing time as reported losing money after being targeted by a scam.

"Time is money, and our survey results reflected this," Trumpower explained. "We can't ignore the fact that there are many other non-financial impacts of being targeted by a scam."

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
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McLaughlin hopes win is the first of many

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. — A few years back, when Scott McLaughlin was dominating Supercars in Australia, Tim Cindric decided it was finally time to sit down and have “the talk.”

About his young driver’s future. An American future.

Weeks after Roger Penske bought a 51% stake in Dick Johnson Racing in late 2014, Cindric received an email from a polite 21-year-old. “Hey, I’m Scott McLaughlin,” it read. “I just want to introduce myself at some point, and if there’s ever an opportunity, I’d love to drive for you guys.” Cindric was keen on adding him to the expanding Team Penske stable. After McLaughlin took third in the championship in 2016, he announced he’d be joining The Captain in hopes of delivering a Bathurst 1000 victory and at least one championship.

It’d be three. Very soon into their relationship, it was clear McLaughlin was banging his head on the ceiling of his potential Down Under. There was little to do other than setting win, pole and championship records in a series with a small worldwide platform. Add in a new American girlfriend and a set of parents with an affinity for the USA, and his future goals were clear — or so he thought.

He’d been dominating Australia’s version of a stock car series, so in his eyes, a NASCAR career was the logical move. Though he’d watched fellow Kiwi Scott Dixon while growing up and fallen in love with IndyCar, a jump to open-wheel was not on his radar.

“Plus, I was fat,” McLaughlin said with a big belly laugh Sunday afternoon after his NTT IndyCar Series victory on the streets of St. Petersburg. Twenty-five pounds too heavy, he’d later be told, but Cindric, Penske’s kingmaker, had a different vision.

“He had his eyes on NASCAR, was always following NASCAR. He knew everything about NASCAR, and yet when we sat down at dinner I said, ‘Have you ever thought about IndyCar?’” Cindric told IndyStar. “I know him enough to know that 38-week schedule and the way he likes to live his life with time to himself and with his guys and family

and some ‘me’ time, that IndyCar schedule was very much like what he had in Supercars.

“His response was, ‘I never thought you’d consider me for an IndyCar ride.’”

‘That pole was exactly what he needed’

McLaughlin’s flawless run to the pole Saturday for the series opener, beating out Will Power (nine St. Pete poles) and Colton Herta (defending pole sitter and race winner), tied him with Penske open-wheel legend Helio Castroneves with 60, regardless of the circuit.

Still, Saturday night, as he meandered through the busy St. Pete downtown, hardly recognized among the vacationers and race fans, McLaughlin’s wife, Karly, said Sunday that “winning” wasn’t on his mind.

“After the pole, he said, ‘You know, if I get a top-three, I’d be happy!’ Even this morning, he said a top-five would make him happy,” Karly told IndyStar. “I don’t really think he thought the win was there. Most importantly, he drives off confidence, and after that pole, he was on cloud nine. That was exactly what he needed.”

It had been 12 years since McLaughlin had started a rolling start race from the front and you could tell talking to him Saturday that the nerves were there. “I’ll have to make sure I don’t overshoot (Turn 1) like an idiot,” he said.

He didn’t, holding the inside line while Herta gunned it for an outside pass. From there, McLaughlin held to lead the first 26 laps, by as much as six seconds. But as it often does in IndyCar, an early yellow and varying strategies muddled up the picture.

But as the green flag laps drew on and on, McLaughlin, his engineer Ben Bretzman, Cindric and Penske could start to see the victory taking shape.

“I just felt like, all weekend, I could really do what I wanted with the car, and that’s just a very special feeling for a driver,” he said post-race of topping the timing charts for the second practice in addition to the pole. “Last night, I had a great sleep, and I started telling myself, ‘I’ve done this before. Just with a roof over my head.’ Now, it was just a matter of feeling it. And it was after that start, away we went.”

For nearly two years, it had been building, climaxing on that final stretch down the Albert Whitted Airport run-

way toward the checkered flag. When he crossed it first, McLaughlin shook his fists, undid his visor and screamed. When he emerged from the car, he had to pause his live interview on TV to catch his breath. When he tried to leap off the car, he tumbled to the ground.

“I roly-poly’ed. I tried to jump, and my legs were jelly, bro,” he said with a hearty laugh. “When I hit the ground, I told myself, ‘I’m done,’ but I tried to make it as delicate as I could. I looked like a wombat, man! It was bad.”

A ‘competitive bloke who wants to win’

For McLaughlin, it was a release nearly two years in the making. When he last saw his parents, well known in the racing community for their vital reactions to any success by their son, in January 2020, McLaughlin was 26, had won only two Supercars titles and had spent a single day in an Indy car for a test at Sebring. The COVID-19 pandemic was far removed from the psyches of most of the world.

He last saw his sister in his final Bathurst 1000 race in October 2020.

There were highlights — qualifying fifth on the Indianapolis Motor Speedway road course and finishing runner-up in his first oval race at Texas Motor Speedway among them — but for such a fierce self-critic, the lows weighed harder on him. The Detroit doubleheader, where he crashed early in the first practice and finished 19th and 20th, and hot off a spin on pit lane in the Indy 500 ruined a great debut, were rock bottom.

“I had won straight back-to-back championships, and I know I was a rookie and I wasn’t kidding myself,” he said. “But at the same time, it’s hard to go from the mindset of, ‘OK, win every week and that’s all that matters, nothing less,’ to going, ‘Hey, I’d love a top-15.’”

“I don’t work like that. I’m a competitive bloke. I want to win.”

Added Karly: “It’s crazy to say, but when I met him in Australia, he was doing so well. I’d never really known a ‘losing Scott.’”

That version is no more, disappearing while holding back tears in victory lane on FaceTime with his parents in New Zealand.

Drivers wanted Next Gen to be challenge — and it is

When Erik Jones laid down the second-fastest qualifying lap on Saturday at Auto Club Speedway in Fontana, California, it resulted in an obligatory appearance in the media center. Jones didn’t mind the walk from pit road to its location. He needed the time to calm down.

“I felt sick to my stomach until I got over here,” said the Petty GMS Motorsports driver.

Jones wasn’t dealing with any sort of illness. Not unless you count the side effects of driving a brand-new race car.

“I was nervous before I even went out for practice just seeing those guys out there making mistakes,” said Jones. “A guy like Kevin Harvick is not going to go out and wreck on lap one in practice, especially in the old car. So, they’re challenging. It’s really unknown.”

“The driving style is 100% different. You cannot push (this) car as hard as you could (the other one), and there’s just a really fine line of pushing it hard to make speed and really stepping over that line, and when you do, it’s

hard to get it back.

“I don’t know how that’s going to change as the car develops and what goes forward with it. But it’s definitely the most challenging car I’ve driven in the Cup Series to this point.”

What Jones said and experienced over the weekend — and he wasn’t alone — should have resulted in viewer satisfaction. NASCAR racing is hard again and at Auto Club Speedway drivers were earning their paychecks.

Harvick backed his Ford Mustang into the wall less than two minutes into practice. It was a rare sight but just the start of the action; multiple drivers had single-car spins late in the afternoon during qualifying.

There were seven more single-car spins on Sunday afternoon and tire management was vital. The last Auto Club event in 2020 had three cautions, just one for a single-car incident.

The Next Gen car leaves little to no room for error. In years past the car would catch itself or allow the driver time to correct when getting out of shape. It seems much harder to do now. Side force is gone because the car is symmetrical, the car’s overall feeling and balance are different, and drivers are being forced to learn a new feel on the right rear.

The challenges of adapting to the

Next Gen have been welcomed by drivers like Brad Keselowski: “We got what we wanted.”

Christopher Bell smiled in his television interview after spinning in practice. He seemed right at home having to drive his race car and make the difference.

“Obviously, these cars are really hard to drive,” said Bell. “I’m excited about it. I think it’s going to be a ton of fun once we get going and get into a routine here.”

For all the good and bad changes NASCAR made over the years, the cars became easy to drive somewhere along the way. Driver talent took a back seat to speed, aerodynamics and downforce. So. Much. Downforce.

Suddenly, drivers weren’t making mistakes. Or if they were, they weren’t paying the price for making one.

If Cup Series drivers are indeed the best stock car drivers in the world, a little more effort shouldn’t be too much to ask. Seeing them find the absolute edge of the cliff without stepping over is good racing. And if a driver does go too far, it proves not only are they human and make mistakes, but the car isn’t going to save them.

Theoretically, the car being hard to drive should showcase driver talent and bravery.

To his credit, Carl Edwards was a big

proponent of having to drive the race car — racing shouldn’t be easy. As cool as it is to see Kyle Larson make a “video game” move at Darlington Raceway last season or Edwards do a similar thing trying to beat Jimmie Johnson at Kansas Speedway back in 2008, it shouldn’t be able to happen. Drivers should make what they do look easy but not have a car that makes it look like Sunday has an “easy mode” button like on the Xbox.

Keselowski has been the same way. Keselowski has never been afraid to muscle a car around, and he didn’t seem to mind having to do so in Fontana.

“The cars are hard to drive; they’re supposed to be that way,” he said. “I think a lot of the drivers asked for it and we got what we wanted.”

The comments about the difference in the car started to come out during testing. Drivers noticed right away they were no longer dealing with the Gen 6 or any of the previous iterations of car they’ve driven. Next Gen is unforgiving, and through multiple tests on the Charlotte roval and oval, drivers began saying it was harder to drive.

But drivers saying the cars are hard to drive during testing is one thing. Seeing it in action, as was the case throughout a race weekend, and having drivers sick about it, is another. And it is a beautiful sight.

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NWSL names former NLL, NHL executive as next commissioner

The National Women's Soccer League named Jessica Berman its next commissioner, the league announced Wednesday.

Berman will oversee all operations of the league and begin her four-year term on April 20. She spent the past two years as deputy commissioner and executive vice president of business affairs of the National Lacrosse League and prior to that spent more than a decade at the NHL in various roles.

"I'm honored to be the next commissioner of the NWSL and grateful to the owners for their confidence in me," said Berman. "Working on behalf of, and in partnership with, our players is my No. 1 priority. Having been involved in professional sports for many years, I know how critically important a genuine part-

nership with players is for us all to be successful and continue to grow. The successful conclusion of the league's first-ever CBA with our players is the perfect foundation from which to build that partnership, and I am grateful for Marla Messing's leadership in getting that done."

The league started its search in October when Lisa Baird and general counsel Lisa Levine resigned amid reports that several players accused former North Carolina Courage coach Paul Riley of sexual coercion and Washington Spirit coach Ritchie Burke was fired after allegations of verbal and emotional abuse.

The league agreed to eight demands from the players association, including a mandate that all personnel take part in the union investigation of sexual misconduct, with total transparency when it comes to other investigations. The agreement included the union's participation in selecting the next commissioner.


