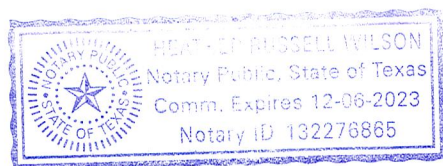

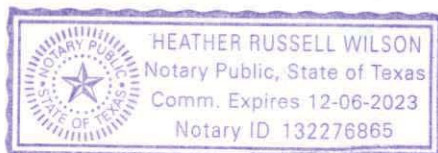

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Camp CAD Appraisers will begin field work. The Camp Central Appraisal District is beginning its field appraisal work in certain parts of the county for the 2022 year.

The Appraisal District divided Camp County into three regions for the purpose of reappraisal. Region 1 covers properties within the city limits of Pittsburg and properties along Lake Bob Sandlin. Region 2 covers properties north of Highway 11 (with the exception of properties in Region 1) and Region 3 covers properties south of Highway 11. Properties in Region 3 are scheduled for inspection for the 2022 tax year.

The re-appraisal plan requires an on-site property inspection at least once every three years, and the CCAD conducts its reappraisals according to the regions listed above.

With the number of properties to be seen, appointments are not made. Camp County has great neighbors that look out for each other, and word will get around when the staff is in a particular neighborhood.

Appraisers will not ask to enter homes, but will go to the door to make anyone who is there aware they are on the property if they need to measure a new structure or re-measure an existing one.

Each appraiser is required to carry appropriate identification listing their TDLR issued number and a photo ID issued by the district. In addition, field appraisers will have "CAMP CENTRAL APPRAISAL DISTRICT" signs on their vehicles with the district's phone number.

Property owners are encouraged to contact the CAD office at 903-856-6538 to confirm an appraiser's identity if there is any question.

The appraiser has a checklist for each property, which includes measuring or re-measuring structures. In addition, based on the field manual, appraisers are to "ensure correct classification, condition and depreciation of all structures; identify if there are any additional issues regarding the structures or the land; ensure correct leveling and identifiers on manufactured homes"; and take a current photograph if necessary.

The appraiser will NOT be able to discuss the value of the property. Valuations are based on sales information and cost schedules that are applied later in the year. At this point, the appraiser is gathering information and performing visual inspections, not setting a value. Exemption applications are not available in the field, but will be mailed to you upon request or when property's ownership changes.

The staff works diligently to gather accurate information, however, with locked gates or pets, some dimensions may be difficult to confirm in the field. The appraiser will then estimate the measurements using the district's mapping system.

Each year, new construction, permits and requested rechecks are done, but property in the Reappraisal Zone must also be completed. There is a strict timeline to accomplish this task and the field staff will need to move quickly to be completed by March. Plans call for completing the reappraisal zone by the first week in February, and then start rechecks and permits.

NBA gifts Lakers-Nets to fans on Christmas

The NBA packed star power and marquee matchups into its Christmas Day schedule.

Lakers-Nets, Knicks-Hawks and Mavericks-Jazz are among the Dec. 25 games announced Tuesday.

Also that day: the defending champion Bucks will face the Celtics, and the Suns will host the Warriors.

Consider the names in the Lakers-Nets game: LeBron James, Anthony Davis, Russell Westbrook, Kevin Durant, James Harden and Kyrie Irving. There are six All-Stars and future Hall of Famers in that group.

The Hawks-Knicks game is a rematch of their first-round Eastern Conference series won by the Hawks — and the first time the Hawks have played on Christmas since 1989 when Atlanta's Dominique Wilkins, Spud Webb and Moses Malone each scored at least 20 points in a victory against Cleveland.

The Jazz-Mavs contest features two of the biggest young stars in the league — Dallas' Luka Donic, already an MVP candidate at 22, and Utah's Donovan Mitchell, a two-time All-Star at 24.

On the season opening night Oct. 19, the Bucks host the Nets nearly five months after eliminating them in the Eastern Conference finals in seven games. In the late game, the Lakers will host the Warriors.

After missing the playoffs for two consecutive seasons, the Warriors are expected to have a fully healthy Stephen Curry, Klay Thompson and Draymond Green along with veteran Andre Iguodala, second-year center James Wiseman and rookie forward Jonathan Kuminga. The Lakers acquired veter-

ans Russell Westbrook and Carmelo Anthony this offseason in hopes to boost their chances to win an NBA title for the second time in three years.

As for the Bucks and Nets, the matchup could become more competitive after Harden and Irving nursed injuries throughout their playoff series. The Bucks then won the NBA title after beating the Suns in six games, their first championship since 1971.

The NBA's 2021-22 regular-season will run from Oct. 19 through April 10, followed by a play-in tournament (April 12-15) and the playoffs (April 16). The NBA will release the full schedule later.

USWNT star Rapinoe 'thinking' about retirement

Megan Rapinoe is unsure about the future of her soccer career and will "need to take some time to think about it," the U.S. women's national team and OL Reign forward said Tuesday on ESPN's "Spain and Fitz" show.

The 36-year-old scored two goals in the United States' 4-3 win over Australia in the Tokyo Olympics bronze medal match on Aug. 5. It was her second Olympic medal after winning gold at the 2012 London Olympics.

"Just in terms of my whole career, I don't really know yet. I need to take some time to think about it," Rapinoe said on "Spain and Fitz."

Rapinoe returns to playing with her National Women's Soccer League team, the OL Reign, on Saturday against NJ/NY Gotham FC. Should both women see the pitch in the matchup, she'll face off against fellow USWNT forward Carli Lloyd, the only player older than Rapinoe on the Tokyo squad.

Lloyd announced her retirement Monday, stating that she'd play out the rest of the NWSL season with Gotham FC as well as four USWNT friendlies across September and October.

"She has so many appearances, so many goals. So many memorable goals as well. It's all good and well to score five goals against teams that don't really matter, but I think Aaron Heifetz, our media relations guy, said that every medal match Carli played in she scored a goal," Rapinoe said Tuesday of Lloyd. "That's the greatness. She's unbelievable."

Showing up in the biggest moments, that's what you want from your biggest players."

Many believed the Tokyo Olympics would be the last major international appearance for Rapinoe and Lloyd, though only the latter hinted about retirement following the Games. Lloyd is the second-most capped player in world soccer history having started her career with the USWNT in 2005.

Rapinoe though, has not yet made up her mind about whether she's ready to be done playing soccer. It's a decision she said is more complicated than it seems.

"They always say, 'You'll know when you know,' but it's not really like that, because you could kind of keep going, and it's like 'Aw yeah, you've accomplished so much, you'll be fine stepping away,'" Rapinoe said. "But the conversation is always anguished in your mind. Or people just don't think about it. I've been thinking about it a lot."

NBA Rookie of the Year doesn't regret his path: School's not your priority

As a 16-year-old, LaMelo Ball opted to leave high school and skip college in favor of playing professionally overseas — first in Lithuania and then in Australia.

His unorthodox path, which evaded playing for a blueblood college basketball program like his brother Lonzo at UCLA, is one that ultimately paid off as the Hornets star just won the NBA Rookie of the Year award after being drafted No. 3 in last year.

A 19-year-old now, Ball said he has no regrets and dismissed the appeal of a traditional pathway to the league.

"You wanna go to the league, so school's not your priority," he told GQ magazine in a story published Tuesday. "We not trippin' off school. We not dumb. We know how to learn. We don't need school. And school not even teachin' you (expletive) — what the (expletive) is school?"

Ball also told the magazine he believes the NCAA must change to allow more options for elite players to make money en route to the NBA. The interview took place before the the Supreme Court ruled this summer that the NCAA could no longer bar modest payments to student-athletes.

There's been a growing trend of players in recent years, including 2021 No. 2 pick Jalen Green, who opt to play for money (Green played in the

G League), further pushing away the one-and-done narrative that NCAA Tournament exposure equates to being a lottery pick.

Ball, who finished out his high school career at Spire Institute in Ohio before going to Australia, averaged 15.7 points, 6.1 assists and 5.9 rebounds a game for the Hornets in 2020-21.

'Summer of Gold' documents 1996 impact

Sue Bird believes her life would be very different if it wasn't for the 1996 Atlanta Summer Olympics.

But the five-time gold medalist didn't make her Olympic debut until 2004.

On the first episode of "Summer of Gold," a new documentary podcast, Bird discusses the impact she believes the 1996 Games had on the future of women's sports and her life trajectory.

"I don't think there's a WNBA without the '96 Olympics," Bird said. "Without a WNBA, without professional sports in the U.S., I'm not sitting here. Who knows what I'm doing, but I'm not sitting here talking about these things. Seriously, I really believe that."

Across six episodes, "Summer of Gold" celebrates the 25th anniversary of the 1996 Olympics and the impact it had on American sports, culture and female athletes.

The series is being released by Dear Media in partnership with sports and culture media platform TOGETHXR. Bird and USWNT forward Alex Morgan serve as co-producers.

TOGETHXR was founded by Bird, Morgan, Olympic swimmer Simone Manuel and Olympic snowboarder Chloe Kim. The media and commerce company is targeted at Gen Z and millennial women as a place where "culture, activism, lifestyle, sports and badassery converge."

"Summer of Gold" is hosted by retired Olympic figure skater Michelle Kwan, who navigates listeners through sound bites to piece together the impact the 1996 Games had on women in sports. Episode one, "Be It. See It." features Bird, sportswriter Molly Yanity,

retired U.S. gymnast Dominique Moceanu, TOGETHXR chief content officer Jessica Roberts and former USWNT players Julie Foudy and Briana Scurry.

A particular focus in the first episode is the 1996 U.S. women's gymnastics team, now known as the Magnificent Seven, that won gold. It was the year Kerri Strug captured the eyes of the world when she performed vault on an injured ankle to secure first for the Americans.

"I mean, that is just an iconic sports moment," Yanity said in the episode. "Not, you know, women's sports moment, not Olympic sports moment. That is an iconic sports moment."

Strug and her teammates became instant celebrities, laying the foundation for a U.S. gymnastics dynasty that still lives on today through athletes like Simone Biles and Tokyo all-around gold medalist Suni Lee. Moceanu was just 14, the youngest member of the team, when she competed alongside Strug for that gold medal.

"We felt like rock stars," Moceanu said. "I mean, there was a crowd of fans outside of every single stop. We had fans coming into our hotels that we didn't even know and they would wait for us."

Kwan also explains the stardom that the 1996 USWNT was propelled to, with help from Foudy and Scurry. Despite the gold medal game not being broadcast on NBC, the USWNT's 2-1 victory over China was played in front of 76,000 fans and created a firestorm of support for the team in ensuing years.

Other episodes of "Summer of Gold" will also feature Team USA basketball player Sheryl Swoopes, gymnast Shannon Miller and more. You can listen on Apple Music, Spotify and Amazon Music.

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Americans set for Paralympics in Tokyo

It's the Paralympics' turn to take the stage in Tokyo.

As with the Olympics, the Paralympics were postponed a year as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

There will be some fans, with Japan allowing some students to watch the Paralympians compete. This year, more than 4,000 athletes representing at least 134 nations will pursue medals across 540 events that began Tuesday and will end Sept. 5.

From world records to dreams come true, 240 athletes will represent the U.S. in Tokyo. The 2021 U.S. roster features 129 returning Paralympians and 105 athletes making their Paralympic debut and the delegation holds a combined 233 medals from 51 Paralympic champions.

Here are five athletes to watch in Tokyo.

Will Groulx, road cycling

He served in the U.S. Navy from 1995-2001 before a motorcycle accident left him paralyzed from the chest down. Groulx is a five-time Paralympian, having appeared in each competition since 2004.

He discovered wheelchair rugby seven months after his accident and competed on that team for his first three Paralympics. He captained the 2012 London team.

Groulx then switched to road cycling for the 2016 Rio Games and won three medals.

Over the course of his Paralympic career, Groulx has won two gold, two silver and two bronze. In 2009, he was nominated for an ESPY in the Best Male Athlete with a Disability category.

Road cycling will begin on Aug. 31.

Anastasia Pagonis, swimming

Fully sighted until she was 9, Pagonis began experiencing slight changes in her vision. Two years later, she began losing her eyesight to Stargardt disease.

She was told to transition away from soccer to a "less contact" sport by a doctor who suggested swimming as an alternative. But further loss of vision led Pagonis to nearly abandon swimming.

With the support of family, she got back in the pool. Now, the 17-year-old will make her Paralympic debut and compete in the 100-meter freestyle and the 400-meter freestyle. She enters Tokyo with five American records and two gold medals from the 2020 World Para Swimming World Series.

Swimming begins Wednesday.

Jessica Long, swimming

The 13-time Paralympic champion is appearing in her fifth Paralympics after bringing home a gold and five other medals in Rio in 2016.

Long's legs were amputated below the knees when she was 18 months old because she was born with fibular hemimelia and didn't have fibulas, ankles, heels and most of the other bones in her feet.

She was 12 years old when she competed in her first international swimming competition, the 2004 Athens Paralympics. Overall, the 29-year-old has accumulated 23 medals.

This year, she'll compete in the 50-meter freestyle, 100-meter freestyle, 400-meter freestyle, 100-meter backstroke, 100-meter breaststroke, 100-meter butterfly and 200-meter individual medley under the S8, SB7 and SM8 classifications.

David Brown, track and field

He's known as the "fastest blind man

in the world," and Brown hopes to retain that title in the Tokyo Paralympics. He earned the nickname after he became the first totally blind athlete to run under 11 seconds when he ran a 10.92 in 2014.

Brown was diagnosed with Kawasaki disease at 15 months old, resulting in glaucoma. He would lose his sight by the time he was 13 years old. Brown was inspired to become a Paralympian when he won an essay contest to attend the 2008 Beijing Paralympics.

A three-time gold Paralympian, Brown won gold in the 100-meter (T11) in Rio 2016. He has won five medals, two

gold and three silver, at the world championships.

Track and field begins on Friday.

Steve Serio, wheelchair basketball

When he was 11 months old, Serio had surgery on his spinal cord to remove a tumor, and the operation left him partially paralyzed.

The three-time Paralympian began playing wheelchair basketball when he was 14 years old. He would eventually lead his high school team to a championship and starred during his career at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign where he won a national championship and earned several honors.

Serio began playing for the national team when he was 17 and has won gold in Rio and bronze in London. He also has won four medals, (three silver, one bronze) in the world championships.

In 2017, Serio was the first wheelchair basketball player to win the ESPY Award for "Best Male Athlete with a Disability."

Wheelchair basketball begins Wednesday.

Diamondbacks' Smith suspended for foreign substance

PHOENIX – Diamondbacks left-hander Caleb Smith has been suspended for 10 games and fined an undisclosed amount by MLB for violating the league's foreign substance policy.

Smith has appealed the suspension. The discipline will be held in abeyance

until the process is complete.

Umpires inspected and confiscated Smith's glove after the top of the eighth inning of the game on Aug. 18. Crew chief Tom Hallion told a pool reporter the umpires found two dark, sticky spots on the inside heel of the glove.

Diamondbacks manager Torey Lovullo, who allowed by the umpires to inspect the glove before it was confiscat-

ed, acknowledged the sticky spots and said Smith "maintained that those little areas, those little hot spots, were a result of the rosin bag."

Smith told reporters after the game that they were nothing more than dirt.

League rules explicitly prohibit the presence of rosin on gloves. Rule 6.02(d) reads, "neither shall the pitcher nor any other player be permitted to apply rosin

from the bag to his glove."

It is unclear if the league has performed testing on Smith's glove to determine the exact nature of the spots, but it seems clear the commissioner's office had no doubt it stemmed from an illegal substance.

Smith was adamant that he did not intentionally put a sticky substance on his glove.

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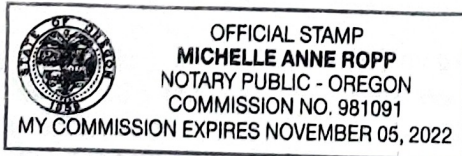



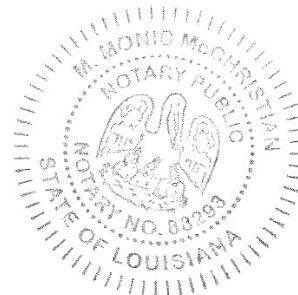
