

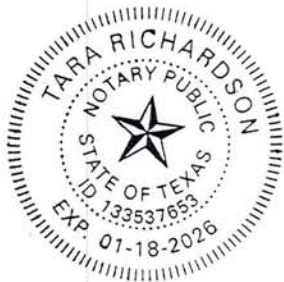

These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the City of Pittsburg.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about August 22, 2022 the City of Pittsburg will submit a request to the Texas Department of Agriculture for the release of Community Development Block Grant Program funds under Section 104 of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, to undertake a project known as sidewalk reconstruction and accessibility improvements on Rusk Street and Compress Street, under Contract# CDM21-0135 for the purpose replacing deteriorated and non-ADA compliant sidewalks resulting in hazardous pedestrian traffic. Contractor shall reconstruct and install approximately 890 linear feet of concrete sidewalk, 414 linear feet curb and gutter, 17 ADA ramps, install 14 streetlights including conduit, wiring and electrical service panel, reconstruct concrete drives, related pavement repairs, and all associated appurtenances. Project will also include all associated administration and engineering services, for an estimated cost of \$350,000.00 in HUD funds and \$25,500.00 in non-HUD funds. The project shall take place on Rusk Street from the corner of Fulton to City Hall and on Compress from the Corner of Church Street to the alley.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The City of Pittsburg has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The City of Pittsburg certifies to the State of Texas that David Abernathy in his capacity as Mayor consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. 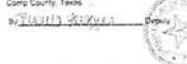

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

ties of this year," Elias said. "We have a shot at a wild card right now. But it is not a probability that we're going to win a wild card."

LOSER: Chicago White Sox

This is the most underachieving team in baseball, sitting in third place in the AL Central.

They picked up Diekman from the Boston Red Sox, couldn't stomach the prices for starting pitchers or sluggers on the market, and stopped dealing.

"We're disappointed that we weren't able to do more to try to improve this club," GM Rick Hahn said. "Anyone out there feeling a level of frustration and disappointment, I'm right there with you."

Just imagine the uproar in Chicago if they don't make the playoffs.

"We've lost a little bit of our swagger," Hahn said. "I'd like to see that come back."

LOSER: Chicago Cubs

Remember that emotional scene when the Cubs gave All-Star catcher Willson Contreras a standing ovation, with Contreras crying in the arms of teammate Ian Happ, thanking the Cubs for all the memories?

Well, it turned out to be nothing more than a dress rehearsal.

Contreras is back. So is Happ.

The only players to leave were relievers David Robertson to the Phillies and Mychal Givens to the Mets. That was it.

Cubs President Jed Hoyer put a high price tag on Contreras and Happ, and when no one blinked, Hoyer decided to simply keep them. Happ still is under club control for another year, but Contreras is a free agent and won't be returning.

So all they get back for Contreras, the best position player on the market not named Juan Soto, is a draft pick when they make him a qualifying offer.

"We were willing to listen if someone gave us a piece that could really help our future," Hoyer said. "We never crossed that threshold. Willson is a really valuable player. He's been a great Cub for six years now and we never got to that place where we felt comfortable making a deal."

LOSER: San Francisco Giants

The Giants are 37-44 since the start of May, and it looked like they were going to start a fire sale with the trade of power hitter Darin Ruff to the Mets, and then dumping injured catcher Curt Casalli to the Mariners, injured reliever Trevor Rosenthal to the Brewers and injured starter Matt Boyd to the Mariners. And stopped.

They listened to offers for All-Star starter Carlos Rodon and All-Star outfielder Joc Pederson but never budged.

They remain in no-man's land. They're not in the race, not out of the race, and just hangin' around, 4 1/2 games out of a wild-card berth.

"We're always kind of juggling the present and the future," team President Farhan Zaidi said. "There's a lot of moti-

vation to finish the year strong. And if we do, we have a chance to be a dangerous team. ...

"I don't see it as mixed message. We think we can compete with the guys we have so we think we're very much in the race."

LOSER: Milwaukee Brewers

You know it's a bad sign when the Brewers issue a lengthy statement on their social media account trying to calm their fan base on why they traded four-time All-Star closer Hader.

"Today's trade is about doing everything we can as an organization to continue our mission and our goal of giving our team as many bites at the apple as we possibly can," Brewers president of baseball operations David Stearns said.

"To sustain competitiveness and to avoid some of the down cycles that we've seen throughout baseball in the not-too-distant past. As we look around the industry, teams that have been able to sustain consistent competitiveness, get into the playoffs, compete for the playoffs every single year – these are

teams that at times have to make very difficult decisions."

The Brewers have All-Star setup man Devin Williams to replace Hader as the closer. He has gone 30 appearances without giving up a run, yielding a .115 batting average with 47 strikeouts in 28 2/3 innings.

Yet he made it clear to reporters that Hader should still be around.

Surprised by the trade?

"You could say that," Williams said. "Lots of things that don't really make sense, you know. I don't know."

"I want to win. That's the biggest thing to me. I don't really have much to say about it."

Sorry, getting late-inning reliever Trevor Rogers from San Diego, Matt Bush from the Texas Rangers and Trevor Rosenthal from the Giants hardly soothed his feelings.

LOSER: Boston Red Sox

You try to figure these guys out.

Are they in? Are they out? What in the world are they doing?

They traded catcher Christian Vazquez along with veteran reliever Diekman, but then turned around and acquired outfielder Tommy Pham from the Reds, spending \$4.1 million on his salary and player option.

Pham, who played for Red Sox GM Chaim Bloom, seemed like the natural replacement for J.D. Martinez. Only Martinez didn't go anywhere after trade talks with the Dodgers died.

Starter Nate Eovaldi, who would have been a great trade chip to land more prospects, stayed put.

And when Eric Hosmer vetoed his trade to the Nationals, the Red Sox stepped in and grabbed him, with the Padres paying the remainder of his \$44 million owed the next three years.

"When you get into a deadline period," Bloom said, "you never know exactly what it will bring. ... Simply put, we do think we have a chance to make a run."

"When we have a shot, even when it's not the shot we anticipated in April, we should take it."

You're not the only one confused after hearing that.

Playoff rankings: Padres face a steep climb in NL

They've opened up the Major League Baseball playoffs to 12 teams, yet it may be harder than ever to navigate.

A handful of teams found themselves well-equipped to attack October after major trade-deadline acquisitions. But their paths to glory may be blocked.

Did your team win baseball's trade deadline, or at least try? If so, congrats. It also won't mean much when the playoffs arrive and Commissioner Rob Manfred's bracket shootout becomes reality.

With that, in the wake of Tuesday's trade deadline, we take a look at the top eight clubs poised to win it all, a ranking based as much on path as it is talent:

1. Astros

You gotta get there to win it and nobody does that better than the Astros, who have reached five straight American League championship series and last year came two wins shy of a World Series title. This time, they'll have ace Justin Verlander in tow, and it's hard to argue anyone in the AL is throwing the ball better than the 39-year-old with a majors-best 1.81 ERA. They can stack the now playoff-hardened Framber Valdez, Luis Garcia and Jose Urquidy behind him – all after coasting to a division title and first-round bye.

2. Dodgers

They're merely 22-5 since June 1 go-

ing into Wednesday, administering knockout blows to opposing pitchers before many fans have taken their seats. A fearsome 1-2-3 in any combo – pull Mookie Betts, Freddie Freeman and Trea Turner's names out of a hat and go from there – is backed up by suddenly fearsome cleanup hitter Will Smith, who has a .821 OPS and a .906 mark in his last 35 games. The pitching is something of an adventure but the tonnage of arms will clear a path to the World Series, one way or another.

3. Yankees

Not sold on Frankie Montas as the

man to slay their longtime tormentors in Houston, but New York will coast to the AL East title and hold a significant advantage over their wild-card survivor. We're left to trust they know something about Jordan Montgomery that we don't, but his trade does make you wonder if they're again too smart by half.

4. Blue Jays

Bold pick here, but it's largely based on a 1-2 punch of Alek Manoah and Kevin Gausman that could make for a painless trip through the wild-card round, particularly if the Jays hold on for the right to host the best-of-three at Rogers Centre. A streaky team that will be volatile but fun in October.

5. Mets

Jacob de Grom is back, perhaps just in time for a natural ramp-up to join Max Scherzer as the problematic pitching duo Steve Cohen envisioned when he paid Scherzer \$43.3 million to pair with de Grom. Stubbornly, the Mets haven't yielded the NL East lead to Atlanta since April 12, in part because they are so well put together in every facet. Envisioning a long-awaited Queens star turn for shortstop Francisco Lindor.

6. Braves

They're way low here, and feel free to bump them up to No. 3 if you believe they'll win the NL East. At this point, we're not going to doubt whether Austin

Riley can carry the offense through a hot summer and challenging autumn, but he will need help. Ronald Acuna Jr., whose extra-base hit percentage has dropped from 12% to 6%, would greatly aid the cause should he regain his MVP-quality form.

7. Mariners

They made arguably the best trade-deadline pickup – and paid a decent price for it – in adding Luis Castillo to front the rotation. But questions dog the club, most notably if rookies Logan Gilbert and Julio Rodriguez stay healthy and avoid hitting the figurative wall and whether high-priced lefty Robbie Ray will resemble the shutdown guy they paid for and not the inconsistent one with a 4.11 ERA. Too many potholes to get through three series.

8. Padres

Juan Soto might be the greatest deadline pickup in history – or at least since the invention of MLB Trade Rumors. But the NL is a doggone snake pit and the Padres, trailing the Dodgers by 11 1/2 games, aren't winning the division. Those hitters? They face a steep mountain with Scherzer and de Grom, Max Fried and Kyle Wright, Clayton Kershaw and the Dodgers machine all plotting against them. Those pitchers? Yu Darvish and Joe Musgrove are a nice combo, but running a table of Braves-Mets-Dodgers, say, will expose the staff's overall depth.

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5 THINGS TO CONSIDER

Observations from LIV-PGA Tour hearing

While the most important thing to come out of the federal court hearing in San Jose, California, was that Judge Beth Labson Freeman wouldn't grant a temporary restraining order to allow three LIV Golf players to compete in the PGA Tour's FedExCup Playoffs, several other nuggets were discussed Tuesday that are worth another look.

LIV golfers Talor Gooch, Matt Jones and Hudson Swafford had requested the restraining order that was denied. They would have earned enough points in the season-long FedExCup qualifying to have made the playoffs, but they won't be allowed to tee it up Thursday in the FedEx St. Jude Championship after Freeman ruled their Tour suspensions would stand, at least for now.

From the amounts the players were paid by LIV Golf, which were apparently eye-popping for the judge but were redacted and not verbalized in detail, to the fact that some other players might have misled the media and fans in interviews about how their contracts and winnings mesh, there is plenty to dissect. Let's take a look.

No irreparable harm

Freeman said in her ruling that there was no irreparable harm to Gooch, Jones and Swafford even if they are not allowed to compete in the playoffs.

From the opening of the hearing, the judge pointed out that irreparable harm would need to be proved by the plaintiff golfers for her to allow them to compete and thereby change the status quo, which is that they are suspended by the PGA Tour. Without irreparable harm, they had no justification for a temporary restraining order to compete in the Tour events.

Freeman also repeated several times that money alone would not be grounds for finding irreparable harm, because money can be paid later if the ensuing lawsuit by LIV golfers against the PGA Tour goes in those golfers' favor.

The plaintiffs' lead attorney who presented their case Tuesday, Robert Walters, argued that the FedExCup Playoffs are an elite series of events. The players would be harmed from future earnings – and possibly the opportunity to qualify for major championships – if they were not allowed to compete in this year's playoffs.

The judge didn't buy into that argument enough to rule in their favor.

Freeman also pointed out the players had received large compensation packages upfront from LIV Golf and that the risk of missing PGA Tour events had been calculated when formulating the price that LIV must pay to attract such players. In essence, the players already had accepted compensation from LIV in lieu of playing in the Tour playoffs. The judge went so far as to call this an emergency of the players' own making.

Trial timeline for other LIV suit

A group of LIV players – including the three who requested the temporary restraining order as well as Phil Mickelson, Bryson DeChambeau and others – has joined to sue the PGA Tour to regain playing status and end suspensions. That trial won't begin anytime soon.

After ruling against the temporary restraining order, Freeman – who also is assigned that case – told the litigators the earliest a trial on that suit might begin will be August 2023. That would actually be a compressed timeline for such a trial, with various evidentiary dates and other hearings coming before that.

If the litigators are unable to prepare their cases on that compressed timeline, the case will be heard at the earliest in 2025 because the judge has other cases already on her docket. Basically, that suit is likely to drag out for years.

Is LIV player roster complete?

Walters was asked by Freeman why the plaintiffs didn't wait until the end of their annual PGA Tour contracts to sign with LIV Golf. He responded that LIV Golf's roster might be full and complete by that time, which comes at the end of the FedExCup Playoffs. If the trio of players had waited, they might have lost the opportunity to compete for LIV.

That statement – that LIV is full – comes at odds with speculation several more top players will defect from the PGA Tour to LIV after the playoffs. Players rumored to plan to jump ship include Cameron Smith, winner of the recent British Open, and his Aussie compatriot Marc Leishman. If those two players are able to join LIV after the playoffs and the completion of their annual PGA Tour contracts, why wouldn't the same hold for Gooch, Jones and Swafford?

The only explanation would be LIV plans to drop its lesser players as higher-ranked golfers might come onboard,

as soon as this fall. LIV has laid out plans for how players might be dropped based on performance, but there is no clear indication of how it plans to continue to stack its lineup and who might lose out.

About those LIV Golf contracts

At various times in Tuesday's hearing, Freeman commented on the high dollar figures associated with LIV contracts signed by players and their restrictive nature.

At one point, Freeman mentioned how the LIV contracts are worth more than the three plaintiffs have earned on the PGA Tour. The exact payments were redacted from public view, but the judge and the litigators were privy to the dollar figures. For comparison, Gooch has \$9.5 million in career PGA Tour earnings, Jones has \$18 million and Swafford has \$10 million.

The judge also at one point said the LIV contracts were more restrictive than PGA Tour contracts, effectively solidifying a point of speculation among some pundits in recent months. LIV golfers are required to play all LIV events, while the Tour allows players to pick and choose among a greater field of events. LIV plans to hold 14 events in 2023, while most Tour golfers are required to play at least 15 events each season. There is also speculation that LIV golfers will be requested to play in some Asian Tour events, as that tour is affiliated with LIV. Major championships count among the 15 events most PGA Tour players are required to play, while the majors would not count among the 14 events LIV golfers would be required to play. The judge effectively said that LIV's requirement to play all of its events is more restrictive than the Tour's requirements.

Another point about the LIV contracts: There has been speculation that tournament earnings count against an

LIV player's guaranteed bonus money. LIV has denied this, and several players also denied it when asked by the media, essentially saying all event prize payouts are in addition to the signing bonuses. But at one point in Tuesday's hearing, Walters told Freeman that players must win money on LIV to recoup against their contracts, and she seemed to agree after having seen the contracts. It's possible, of course, that he was misinformed about how the contracts work, but his statement comes after reading the contracts in detail and presenting them to the judge. LIV later issued a statement denying what Walters told the judge.

Is the PGA Tour a monopoly?

Much of the scuttlebutt in recent months has involved the question of the Tour being a monopoly, effectively trying to shut out LIV Golf illegally and deny players the opportunity to play wherever they like.

Freeman made it clear that Tuesday's hearing was not an attempt to rule on such larger issues as the Tour being or not being a monopoly. But the subject did come up several times. And the judge seems initially skeptical, at least by her comments.

Freeman mentioned early there is significant evidence LIV hasn't been prevented from entering the golf market, proved by the fact that LIV is holding tournaments and has attracted several top players. She mentioned several times that LIV projects itself to have a 20% market share by 2023 with greater compensation than is available on the PGA Tour – hardly the making of a Tour monopoly that has shut out fresh competition. She also pointed out the Tour's actions in its own interests do not necessarily make it a monopoly, and that there is no evidence at this early point that the Tour has conspired with the DP World Tour (formerly the European Tour) to shut down LIV Golf unfairly.

When Walters said his team had presented evidence that the PGA Tour had created a monopoly that had restricted trade and limited playing and earnings opportunities for players, Freeman told him point blank that she didn't believe he had made his case.

Elliot Peters, the lead attorney addressing the court on behalf of the PGA Tour, argued that "Exhibit A" of why the PGA Tour is not a monopoly is that LIV exists and relatively quickly has poached top PGA Tour players. He said a key ingredient to forming a monopoly is the ability to set prices, and clearly the Tour has not set prices for players' participation when LIV has been able to offer large guaranteed contracts that outpace a player's Tour earnings.

None of this early monopoly talk is in any way a definitive predictor for how things might go when the larger lawsuit is tried in 2023 or 2025, but Tuesday definitely provided some insight into how those arguments might begin.
