



SEC should push for vaccinated fans

All across the Southeastern Conference, administrators are counting on full stadiums for football this fall. After a season that lacked the pageantry and ambiance of a typical in-person experience, 2021 should look and feel like something close to normal and signal a real turning of the corner on the COVID-19 pandemic.

Like the rest of us, college football programs across the country are counting on the vaccination rates nationally to be high enough that COVID-19 is no longer a massive threat to both public health and their business model. But in the South in particular, college football should take an active role in making that happen.

A year ago, administrators and coaches said it was important to the morale of the country to play a college football season. Now, they can make an even more valuable contribution by having coaches aggressively promote the vaccines and requiring fans to be vaccinated to enter college football stadiums this fall.

Nowhere would that hit home more than in the SEC footprint. Looking at the numbers, it's badly needed.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Alabama trails the nation at 68,509 vaccine doses administered per 100,000 people over the age of 18, followed by Mississippi, Louisiana, Tennessee, Arkansas and Georgia in that order among the states. South Carolina has done slightly better than its neighbors, while Texas and Florida are a bit closer to the middle of the pack.

This is no longer an availability issue. There are enough doses out there that anyone who eagerly wants to be vac-

nated will be vaccinated by the beginning of summer. President Joe Biden set a target Tuesday of having 70% of the adult population get at least one dose by July 4. But with that number currently sitting at about 56% with demand slowing nationally since mid-April, that would likely mean some people who aren't planning on getting a shot changing their minds.

The national conversation on how to do that in recent days has centered a lot on trying not to demean people who are hesitant but figuring out how to incentivize people to get vaccinated. In fact, that's what is happening inside college football programs as we speak with coaches and administrators presenting a choice to their players: Do you want to continue getting swabs stuck up your nose and being subjected to contact tracing, or do you want to take the shot and avoid all that?

As the South lags behind the rest of the country, is there any single thing that could be more motivational than

telling people they need to show proof of vaccination to get inside Bryant-Denny Stadium or the Swamp?

That kind of move might be controversial in some quarters, but it wouldn't be particularly radical. Right now, if you want to go to a Brooklyn Nets game, you either have to show proof of vaccination or take a COVID-19 test shortly before or upon arrival at the arena. The Atlanta Hawks have rolled out a plan to have a section in the playoffs for fully vaccinated fans where no social distancing is required. There's been some discussion in Buffalo about local officials allowing full capacity at Bills games in 2021 – but only to those who are fully vaccinated.

These types of things are likely to show up in many areas of our lives over the next several months with certain types of businesses treating those who have been vaccinated one way and those who haven't another.

College campuses, in particular, are in a unique situation because football games bring tens of thousands of people

in contact with their community from various surrounding areas. If you're a campus health official who wants to keep potential variants out of the campus population, is there risk if a significant portion of fans coming into town haven't been vaccinated?

So far, there's been no serious conversation coming out of SEC schools about requiring proof of vaccination to attend games and, frankly, not a whole lot of vaccine advocacy, either.

Last month, Piedmont Healthcare in Georgia posted tweets showing several Bulldogs football players and coach Kirby Smart getting their shots. Other than that, you can't find any public service announcements from these high-profile coaches encouraging people to get vaccinated. Is there really nothing Nick Saban can do to get Alabama out of last place?

What's tricky about the current situation is that most schools are not ready to require COVID-19 vaccinations for students. Though a few prominent schools like Notre Dame and Rutgers have made that decision already, more are waiting until the Food and Drug Administration officially approves them rather than the current Emergency Use Authorization under which they're being distributed.

Unfortunately, though, the vaccines have been co-opted to a degree in political signaling. Colleges, particularly in the South, are very concerned about a severe backlash from fans if they required vaccination to enter the stadium. Rather than framing it as "This is how we get back to full stadiums, no masks and a return to normal," it becomes another battle in a right/left culture war that would lead Tucker Carlson's show on Fox News for days on end.

SEC football is a big enough incentive for so many Southerners that it could have a real impact on a part of the country that isn't getting enough people vaccinated. Schools should play that card while they still can.

Fans and Yankees get a measure of revenge

NEW YORK – Yankees fans – with resentment gurgling in their souls and their lungs burning with fury – taunted, jeered and cursed the Astros all night.

There may have been only 10,850 fans in the stands, the maximum currently permitted at Yankee Stadium during the pandemic, but Tuesday night's game had all the emotion and ambiance of a playoff game in October. It was an atmosphere not seen or heard in these parts since the Astros were in town two years ago for the 2019 American League championship series.

"The fans let them have it," said the Yankees' Giancarlo Stanton, who had a four-hit game. "They were definitely expressing some bottled-up emotions."

The Yankees, who believed they may have won the 2017 World Series title if the Astros hadn't cheated by illegally stealing signs and still question whether Houston was cheating when they were eliminated by the Astros in 2019, didn't express their anger in the same fashion but got their dose of revenge the old-fashioned way with a 7-3 victory.

"It felt like a playoff atmosphere," Yankees manager Aaron Boone said. "The energy they created, we haven't seen that since 2019. ... It was intense. You could feel it when you walked out there 15 minutes before the game. It got your attention."

Still, the game's outcome was nothing

more than a mere backdrop.

Luke Carrado of Long Island was buying a beer and chicken tenders at the concession stands in front of section 226 when he suddenly became incensed and screamed obscenities at a New Jersey family of six who had the audacity to wear Astros jerseys.

Those fans just happened to be the family of Astros reliever Brandon Bielak, who grew up in nearby Sayerville, New Jersey. They watched him pitch for the first time at Yankee Stadium when he entered in the fifth inning. "We took some heat walking in," said Brian Bielak, Brandon's father. "I just want people to keep calm and act like adults."

David Taub came to the stadium wearing an outfit resembling a human trash can. He donned a green "Oscar the Grouch" costume from Sesame Street, a black T-shirt with the name "TRASH-TROS" written on it, a picture of a small trash can underneath, and baggy pants saying "Scram."

"This game has been two years in the making," Taub said. "Those cheaters, I had to be at this game. It's the one game I'll go to all year. We got robbed of a World Series. This was our revenge."

Tyler Grimm wore an authentic Astros jersey, with No. 1 on the back. The name stitched across the back: "Trash Can." "How they got away with such a big thing," Grimm said, "I have no idea. Blame that on (Commissioner) Rob Manfred. And everybody knows how we feel about him, so I'll keep it PG."

Well, for a whole lot of the fans on hand, they didn't try to restrain their sentiments.

The most popular refrain, heard virtually every inning, was directed toward second baseman Jose Altuve, whose homer in Game 6 of the 2019 ALCS vaulted the Astros into the World Series.

"(Expletive) Altuve! (Expletive) Altuve! (Expletive) Altuve!" they chanted.

It didn't matter whether he was at the plate, in the field, stretching, standing in the on-deck circle or in the dugout. The chant reverberated throughout the stadium at least 20 times during the night.

"I wouldn't want to be on the other side of that," Stanton said. "They brought something heavy."

Loud, clear, and merciless. "At least there wasn't any violence," Astros manager Dusty Baker said.

"They can say whatever they want. It sounded like a packed house tonight even though it wasn't."

It was so outrageous that with fans chanting "MVP! MVP!" after Stanton's two-run homer in the first inning off Astros ace Zack Greinke, they immediately shifted into the Altuve chant.

Astros left fielder Michael Brantley, who was playing in Cleveland during the 2017 cheating scandal, instantly joined his teammates as a true Astros villain when he fielded a foul ball in the third inning. He was just a few feet away from the left-field stands, but instead of flipping the ball into the crowd for a free souvenir, he tossed it toward the Astros dugout, with the crowd cursing him.

Brantley got his revenge with a homer an inning later, momentarily quieting the crowd, until a fan threw the ball back into right field, drawing a monstrous ovation.

There were clever signs, like "Judge them Guilty." There were several inflatable trash cans confiscated before any could be thrown on the field.

Despite all the animosity the Yankees exhibited last spring when the Astros' cheating scandal became public, everyone on the teams was on their best behavior. There were no hit-by-pitches, knockdowns, brushbacks or even inflammatory words.

It there was any nervousness or apprehension, the Astros covered it up well. The teams mingled freely before the game as if nothing ever happened.

One victory won't bring back a World Series trophy, or lead to calls for a parade, but for a night it was a game every Yankees fan will savor.

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Spieth eagles 18, ties for Byron Nelson lead

McKINNEY, Texas – On a sunny Thursday, it was three longtime junior golf buddies, now PGA Tour young stars and multimillionaires, Dallas' Jordan Spieth, Will Zalatoris and Scottie Scheffler. All enjoying a relaxing, historic stroll at the TPC Craig Ranch during the first round of the AT&T Byron Nelson.

Together, they combined to play 199 times in Northern Texas PGA junior golf tournaments, with 63 wins between them. But before the opening PGA Tour round, they had never played in the same group in a competitive tournament, much less a professional event.

That was enough Lone Star golf history to bring out the vast majority of the 12,500 pandemic-limited fans, lining the fairways six-deep at points to see the former Dallas golf prodigies-turned-young PGA Tour kings.

Three major golf championships (Spieth), a rookie of the year honor (Scheffler) and a breakout Masters runner-up in your first appearance (Zalatoris) will do that for you.

World No. 3 Jon Rahm and defending Masters champion Hideki Matsuyama might as well have been in a witness protection program for the lack of fans following them all while playing at the same time as the Texas threesome.

Early first-round leader J.J. Spaun's 63 was merely a distant rumor.

All eyes were on the trash-talking, rib-poking, high-fiving group of friends.

"You could have given me that putt," Zalatoris, 24, told Scheffler, also 24, as

they walked off the par-5 fifth hole – after Zalatoris nearly holed an eagle chip. "I said, are we good?"

"Sorry, I tried," Scheffler replied with a wide grin.

Spieth, 27, could only smile at his buddies' trash-talking, adding in his remarks, while walking between holes, his thoughts on the recent Dallas Cowboys draft and the best places to eat near where all three live in Dallas.

"It's remarkable, it really is," said Northern Texas PGA executive director Mark Harrison, who followed the group. "To see three kids who started out as juniors, playing in front of thousands at home, you almost can't believe it."

How remarkable?

PGA Tour stats guru Jordan Ray estimated the odds of three players, who began in the same junior golf section, at the same time, playing in the Masters

tournament in the same year, as all three did in April, at 24 – then followed by 12 zeros – or an astronomical number.

"Play well," Zalatoris told Scheffler with a large dose of sarcasm on the first tee under the watchful eye of Peggy Nelson, the former wife of golf legend and tournament namesake Byron Nelson.

"You'll play better," Scheffler said, even more sarcastically.

"Yeah, right," added his constant golf buddy and comic foil.

"Scottie kicked my butt a lot more times than I kicked his when we were juniors," Zalatoris said before the round.

Spieth, who won their 2006 Ewing Junior Classic junior golf showdown in nearby Garland 74-77-86 over Zalatoris and Scheffler, respectively, could only chuckle in the background before quickly taking the lead again.

He poured in a 15-foot birdie putt on the par-4 first hole and never trailed in the opening nine holes, shooting a 31 on the front nine with Scheffler at 32 and Zalatoris at 35.

But Spieth finished off the day to the largest ovation as he buried a huge eagle putt on No. 18 to pull into a tie for the lead with J.J. Spaun.

Spieth said the fans ramped up their game as the day progressed, culminating with the roar on 18.

Scheffler also admitted that having large crowds following the group spurred him on. He finished 5 under on the day, including birdies on five of the last seven holes.

"Not this time," added Zalatoris, who finished with a 70 on the day.

Players seeking \$500M in grievance versus MLB

Just in case there was any hope of optimism that the cold war between Major League Baseball and the players union might be thawing, along comes the news that the union has filed a grievance against MLB in response to their shortened season of a year ago.

The Major League Baseball Players Association, just as it threatened last year, officially filed a grievance against MLB seeking about \$500 million in damages, two persons with direct knowledge of the grievance told USA TODAY Sports.

The persons spoke on the condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to speak publicly.

The grievance was first reported by the New York Post.

The union stated in the grievance that MLB did not act in good faith negotiating the pandemic-shortened 2020 season.

The union had originally proposed a 114-game season after the COVID-19 shutdown, and later an 89-game season.

MLB originally proposed an 82-game season with a sliding salary scale. Their proposal was reduced to a 76-game season at 75% prorated pay, and then to a 72-game season at 80% prorated pay.

The two sides failed to reach an agreement until Commissioner Rob Manfred stepped in. He imposed a 60-

game season, with the players receiving full pay, which amounted to players receiving 37% of their full salary. The teams wound up losing \$3 billion, Manfred said.

The union, which vowed to file a grievance last summer, argues that MLB did not make the "best efforts to play as many games as possible" as required by their March agreement.

MLB, which filed a countergrievance, said that the reduced schedule became necessary because of the pandemic, citing safety and health reasons.

The grievance, which is held by a three-person arbitration panel, could play a potential factor in their upcoming negotiations on their collective bargaining agreement that expires Dec. 1. The two sides have yet to engage in any serious negotiations, with their first meeting last month consisting of little more than slide-show presentations.

MLB could argue that any grievance could be a detriment in their economic proposals while the union could debate that it should play no factor given that MLB had dismissed any potential grievance as "frivolous" last summer.

No matter, it's simply the latest wrinkle in the strained relationship between the owners and players.

There are just 202 days remaining before their deadline. If no agreement is reached Dec. 1, and there is no deadline extension, there's the distinct possibility of a work stoppage.

Baffert assistant handling two Preakness horses

BALTIMORE – When Bob Baffert announced he'd skip Saturday's Preakness – not wanting to be a distraction amid the Medina Spirit drug controversy – he also knew he had a capable replacement.

"Jimmy can handle it," Baffert said.

"Jimmy" is Jimmy Barnes, who has served as Baffert's assistant since 1998.

When Baffert needs to leave Churchill Downs to return to his California home, Barnes stays behind. When Baffert has horses running at Santa Anita Park, Barnes is the one tending to others at Oaklawn Park or Keeneland or wherever else he's needed.

And while it's new for Baffert to skip a Triple Crown race, it's seemingly no big deal for Barnes to be in the Triple Crown spotlight at Pimlico Race Course this week.

"I'm used to it," Barnes said. "I travel all the time, and I'm always on the road. Bob's there sometimes, great. If Bob can't make it, I just have to pick up the slack and just march on and try to do my best and try to produce a win."

Barnes has spent the week tending to three Baffert trainees at Pimlico: Medina Spirit and Concert Tour for Saturday's Preakness and Beautiful Gift for Friday's Black-Eyed Susan.

Medina Spirit is the subject of controversy after winning the Kentucky Derby and then testing positive for 21 picograms of betamethasone, a banned

substance on race day. If a second sample comes back positive – which likely won't be known for several weeks – Medina Spirit will be disqualified as the Kentucky Derby winner, according to Churchill Downs.

With that story circulating nationally this week, Baffert chose to stay away from Pimlico. "I go to Baltimore to have a good time. It's a fun trip," Baffert told The Associated Press. "I don't want to take away from the horses. I think it'd be a distraction if I went. I think it'd be a distraction if I win."

Enter Barnes, who has declined to comment on the controversy.

While talking outside the Preakness stakes barn Thursday morning, Barnes was asked what it was like to break the news of Medina Spirit's positive test result to Baffert.

"I'm going to keep this interview to the horses," Barnes responded. "We have (been) training here for the Preakness, so if you can keep your questions to that, I'd appreciate it."

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who has longshot Ram entered in the Preakness, joked Thursday that he's serving as Baffert's "spokesperson" this week.

Lukas defended Baffert, saying he knows he didn't cheat because "he doesn't need to. He had the best horse in the Derby." Lukas did say he encouraged Baffert to attend the Preakness.

Barnes hopes his biggest challenge Saturday is having to saddle two horses and simply finding out which one is better.


