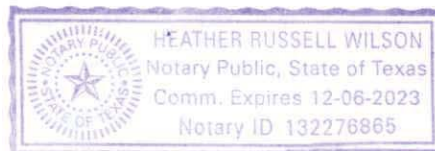

Camp CAD Appraisers will begin field work. The Camp Central Appraisal District is beginning its field appraisal work in certain parts of the county for the 2022 year.

The Appraisal District divided Camp County into three regions for the year of reappraisal. Region 1 covers properties within the city limits of Pittsburg and properties along Lake Bob Sandlin. Region 2 covers properties north of Highway 11 (with the exception of properties in Region 1) and Region 3 covers properties south of Highway 11. Properties in Region 3 are scheduled for inspection for the 2022 tax year.

The re-appraisal plan requires an on-site property inspection at least once every three years, and the CCAD conducts its reappraisals according to the regions listed above.

With the number of properties to be seen, appointments are not made. Camp County has great neighbors that look out for each other, and word will get around when the staff is in a particular neighborhood.

Appraisers will not ask to enter homes, but will go to the door to make anyone who is there aware they are on the property if they need to measure a new structure or re-measure an existing one.

Each appraiser is required to carry appropriate identification listing their TDLR issued number and a photo ID issued by the district. In addition, field appraisers will have "CAMP CENTRAL APPRAISAL DISTRICT" signs on their vehicles with the district's phone number.

Property owners are encouraged to contact the CAD office at 903-856-6538 to confirm an appraiser's identity if there is any question.

The appraiser has a checklist for each property, which includes measuring or re-measuring structures. In addition, based on the field manual, appraisers are to "ensure correct classification, condition and depreciation of all structures; identify if there are any additional issues regarding the structures or the land; ensure correct leveling and identifiers on manufactured homes"; and take a current photograph if necessary.

The appraiser will NOT be able to discuss the value of the property. Valuations are based on sales information and cost schedules that are applied later in the year. At this point, the appraiser is gathering information and performing visual inspections, not setting a value. Exemption applications are not available in the field, but will be mailed to you upon request or when property's ownership changes.

The staff works diligently to gather accurate information, however, with locked gates or pets, some dimensions may be difficult to confirm in the field. The appraiser will then estimate the measurements using the district's mapping system.

Each year, new construction, permits and requested rechecks are done, but property in the Reappraisal Zone must also be completed. There is a strict timeline to accomplish this task and the field staff will need to move quickly to be completed by March. Plans call for completing the reappraisal zone by the first week in February, and then start rechecks and permits.



# Ex-player sues Wash. State coach

Former Washington State football receiver Cassidy Woods has filed a federal lawsuit against WSU and its head coach, Nick Rolovich, accusing them of breach of contract, violating his civil rights and covering up COVID-19 cases in athletics.

Woods, who recently transferred from WSU to Northern Colorado, left the team last year after a public spat with Rolovich stemming from his decision to opt out of the 2020 season because of health concerns related to the pandemic, according to the lawsuit.

When Rolovich and Woods had a conversation about this in August 2020, the lawsuit said Rolovich “responded not to Woods’ health concerns, but by asking if Woods was a part of the #WeAreUnited group,” a group of players who were advocating for social and racial justice issues, including pandemic safety protocols.

After Woods confirmed his involvement, he said Rolovich asked him to clear out his locker because his involvement with that group would send “mixed messages to the team.”

“Rolovich’s message is clear and further demonstrates Defendants’ actions under the color of state law to chill public discourse on matters of social and racial justice,” Woods’ lawsuit states. “To Defendants, if a player is on social media and posts regarding players who have opted out, or is supportive of #WeAreUnited and then opts out of playing for any reason, that player’s athletic services contract funds will be terminated unless that player expressly and publicly takes a stance in opposition of the #WeAreUnited movement.”

The lawsuit seeks punitive and actual damages for the harm to Woods’ athletic career, such as “lost scholarships and lost educational opportunities as a result of defendants’ unlawful conduct.”

WSU issued a statement Wednesday that said it was aware of the complaint but will not comment on any pending or ongoing legal matter.

The suit was filed Aug. 20 in Dallas, near Woods’ hometown of Addison, and becomes the latest public controversy involving Rolovich, who has declined to be vaccinated for COVID-19 at a university that requires it. In July, he was the only head coach in the Pac-12 Conference to not attend a media day event in person because of his refusal to abide by the vaccination requirement. Under a new state mandate in Washington, he faces additional new pressure to get vaccinated unless he cites a medical or religious exemption. Rolovich said he will follow the state mandate but has not said he will get vaccinated. He said the reasons for his decision are private.

In his lawsuit, Woods described a culture of covering up COVID-19 issues. Woods said he has sickle cell trait,

which heightened his risk from exposure to the virus.

“Not only were athletes already testing positive for COVID-19 without notification to other players, Woods’ own roommate had been exposed just two days prior to Woods’ arrival on campus,” the lawsuit states. “Woods’ roommate indicated to Woods that roughly 10 football players had tested positive at that time. His roommate felt that Woods should know about the positive cases even though Defendants strictly ordered the players to keep silent to the media and others – including players who had not yet reported back to Pullman – regarding positive COVID-19 cases that were occurring within the program.”

Washington State finished the 2020 season with a 1-3 record after the season opener was delayed until November because of the pandemic. Woods last played in 2019, when he caught six

passes for 58 yards as a redshirt freshman.

Last September, after WSU revealed that 60 athletes had tested positive for the coronavirus, the lawsuit states that those cases “occurred during the time that WSU was ordering athletes to conceal the truth or otherwise face retaliation and to abstain from support of the #WeAreUnited movement that questioned this very activity and demanded change.”

After entering the transfer portal, the lawsuit states Woods was notified almost immediately by Washington State that his “contract for athletic services” would be prematurely terminated at the end of the fall semester.

The suit also references a phone call he recorded with Rolovich from August 2020, when they discussed his decision to opt out and #WeAreUnited. The recording was leaked to the news media last year.

“OK so that’s going to be, that’s gonna be an issue if you align with them as far as future stuff, ’cause the COVID stuff is one thing,” Rolovich said on the call, according to the lawsuit’s transcript. “But, um, joining this group is gonna put you on a, on a – that’s obviously, you know, you get to keep your scholarship this year, but it – it’s gonna be different. You know, if you, if you say, ‘I’m opting out ’cause of COVID and health and safety,’ I’m good. But this group is gonna change, uh, I guess, how things go in the future for everybody, at least at our school.”

WSU released a statement from Rolovich last year after the recording came out.

“Without knowing the concerns of the group, I regret that my words cautioning Cassidy have become construed as opposition.

“I’m proud of our players and all the Pac-12 student-athletes for using their platform, especially for matters they are passionate about.”

# Phongsavanh aiming for gold in javelin

Justin Phongsavanh wasn’t always concerned with meters, centimeters and breaking world records.

At 18, he was an electrician’s apprentice in Ankeny, Iowa. On Oct. 24, 2015, he was shot and left paralyzed from the waist down, and his outlook shifted.

Soon after, he was throwing javelins, breaking records and is now in Tokyo preparing for his first Paralympics. His first event, the F54 seated javelin throw, is set for Thursday at 8:30 p.m. ET.

On that fateful October day in 2015, he was at a McDonald’s with a friend, Nick Culver. They joked around, Culver pretended to throw a tantrum and Phongsavanh filmed it. As the two friends were leaving, Gabriel Coco, a 36-year-old Iraq veteran, pistol-whipped Culver in the head and shot at him five times.

Coco then shot Phongsavanh twice. The first shot hit his thigh. The second shot went through his right arm and into his torso where it lodged into his vertebrae and severed his spine.

“That’s when I just plummeted,” Phongsavanh said. “I tried to sit up and I tried to run away from the guy who was shooting at me and I couldn’t move. So I accepted my fate.”

Phongsavanh was in the hospital for four months, including rehabilitation. Phongsavanh wasn’t consumed by his fate handed to him. He decided he had no choice but to move on, and adaptive sports was the avenue he knew would help him better deal with his paralysis.

## Turning to sports

He had a rocky childhood. Phongsavanh’s biological parents were in and out of prison, he was in the foster system and was eventually adopted. The trouble, however, continued as his adopted father physically abused him and his brother until he was 13.

Sports anchored him. He started wrestling at 6 and then bounced from one sport to the other. Phongsavanh, who grew to be 6-foot-2, also played football, rugby and track and field.

He was all-conference as a defensive end in football and wrestled. In track and field, Phongsavanh threw the discus and shot put, with records still standing at his high school. He also ran the 100 and 200. Back then, he never had his sights set on the Olympics. And he’d never heard of the Paralympics.

After the shooting, it was never about how he was going to recover from being

shot, but what sport he would use.

He first tried wheelchair basketball and it wasn’t a fit. He didn’t shoot and dribble basketballs growing up; he wrestled and tackled others.

Through Adaptive Sports Iowa and the Challenged Athletes foundation, Phongsavanh rediscovered track and field. It was through this organization that he was provided a throwing chair, a \$3,000 device designed to stabilize his lower body while he throws.

Because of adaptive sports, he found a community.

“It gave me a team. It gave me friends. It gave me connections and resources,” Phongsavanh said. “When I think of what sports has done to me, it’s grounded me, it’s given me a foundation.”

He tried throwing discus and shot put but he realized he would be at a disadvantage because competitors had more function than he did. That wasn’t a concern for the javelin. He would go on to win his first national title in 2017 and was named the 2017 Iowa Adaptive Sports Athlete of the Year.

## Training for the Paralympics

Since January 2019, Phongsavanh has lived at the Chula Vista Elite Athlete Training Center in California with his white-haired golden retriever, Morgan.

Morgan is trained to pick things up because Phongsavanh doesn’t have abdominal muscles. She also pulls him up steep hills. But the two might as well be conjoined. Phongsavanh introduces himself as “the guy with the dog.”

Phongsavanh moved to California to

chase a dream, although he returned home to Iowa during the pandemic. He and girlfriend Bethany Nelson would travel to a relative’s home to throw into a cornfield.

Phongsavanh would record each throw so he could send videos to his coach in California. It was frustrating not to have the instant feedback. However, he would jot detailed notes in a black, spiral-bound notebook.

Because of restrictions brought on by the pandemic, Phongsavanh was alone at the U.S. Paralympic Team Trials for Track and Field in Minneapolis in June. The 33.29 meters (109.2 feet) he threw the javelin established a world record.

## Moving on from shooting

Phongsavanh isn’t worried about thinking of what could have been had he never been shot.

He used to be angry at Coco, especially after he was not convicted of attempted murder. Coco initially faced a maximum of 25 years in prison for the attempted murder charge, The Des Moines Register reported. However, the jury convicted the Army veteran of assault with intent to inflict serious injury, a Class D felony that is punishable for up to five years in prison. Coco, who admitted he had been drinking that night, said he had a traumatic brain injury and struggled with PTSD after Iraq. Coco served less than two years in prison and was released in August 2019.

But that’s the past. Phongsavanh left the Trials hungry. Only a gold medal can satisfy his cravings.

# Stricker confident with 6 Ryder Cup rookies

Is it time to start worrying about the U.S. Ryder Cup team?

After all, in about two weeks, the team that has lost to Europe in nine of the last 12 matches will arrive at Whistling Straits in Wisconsin with half the team making their debuts.

Seriously? The Ryder Cup is where grown men are shaken to their core under the enormous weight of playing for country, flag, team and captain. It's three days when heads spin, hands shake and hearts race. And the U.S. is going in with six players who've never dealt with anything like the Ryder Cup? "Captain America" Patrick Reed and Webb Simpson were passed over for rookies?

Really? Well, U.S. captain Steve Stricker isn't worried.

Throughout a one-hour news conference Wednesday from Whistling Straits, Stricker confidently ticked off reason after reason that the red, white and blue newbies will be a strength and not a hindrance.

Look at the six, Stricker said in so many, many words. Four of his captain's picks announced Wednesday will make their debut — Xander Schauffele, Daniel Berger, Harris English and Scottie Scheffler. Only Schauffele and Scheffler didn't win in the just concluded season, but Schauffele won the gold medal in the Tokyo Olympics and Scheffler, whose worst finish in his six starts in major championships is a tie for 19th, took down world No. 1 Jon Rahm and Ian Poulter en route to his runner-up finish in the World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play in March.

the game isn't played on paper. It will be played on the rugged links-style Straits Course hard by Lake Michigan that is long and demands length off the tee, strong ball-striking skills and superior shot-shaping ability. Which is just fine with Stricker.

"We are looking to the best players to perform here at Whistling Straits, and these six guys that we picked, we feel like they fit Whistling Straits to a T," said Stricker, who consulted his vice captains, the six automatic qualifiers and his analytical team before making his final decision on his picks.

"We have done some analysis of rookies since 2008, and U.S. rookies are a 40-29-17 record in Ryder Cup. So rookies fare very well in this type of format, and we're excited to have these rookies. Some of them aren't really rookies. They have played in past Presidents Cup teams. Some of these guys have match play competition under their belt.

"They bring in an excitement level that is unmatched, and they are eager, they are willing to learn. (Rookies) just come here with eyes wide open and a 'put me in Coach' kind of attitude. So it's refreshing. It's great to see."

It certainly was in 2008 when Stricker was one of six rookies at Valhalla Golf Club in Kentucky when the U.S. thumped Europe.

And all 12 players are versatile, giving Stricker a bevy of options to fill out his foursomes and four-balls lineups. Although it's obvious he has two teams already in mind: Spieth and Thomas, who provided one of the few bright spots in Europe's pasting of the U.S. in Paris in 2018 by going 3-1 as a team, and Cantlay and Schauffele, who were 2-0-2 as a team in the 2019 Presidents Cup.

And the 12 are eager. Stricker said all of his troops and their caddies will be at Whistling Straits this Sunday and Monday for practice rounds, team bonding and to just get comfortable with the surroundings.

"My message from Day 1 has been to try to outprepare the other team," Stricker said. "Let's get in as much practice as we can here. Maybe take a little bit of the stress of Ryder Cup week off our plates by getting our work done now earlier than Ryder Cup week and get some rest that week.

"We'll go out, have a good time, get to learn the course a little bit. Work on some pairings during that time."

Stricker is confident the rookies won't let the USA down.

The rookies are just as confident.

"I'm excited to run with all these boys," Schauffele said. "By definition, yes, it's a new environment. It's something I haven't done, which is to compete in a Ryder Cup. Do I mentally feel like one? No. I've been playing for quite some time, and it's a dream to play in a Ryder Cup, and I think whatever rookie feelings I have will quickly go away with all my fellow teammates pushing me along."

One last thing: The six rookies have no scar tissue.

"I've been a rookie and had success in the event, and all these guys have contended in the biggest tournaments in the world and won the biggest tournaments in the world," Spieth said.

"I think they are going to have a blast and really hope to be on that 2016 side of things where Phil Mickelson is pouring champagne in your mouth while you get to celebrate with all the American fans."

# 2001 Yankees recall 9/11, lament how apart we are

Joe Torre, manager of the Yankees at the time of 9/11, grew rueful this week as the 20th anniversary of the terrorist attacks approached.

Oh, he fondly recalled how the Yankees resumed play against the White Sox in Chicago a week after the Sept. 11 attacks.

"The New York Yankees, you either love them or hate them," Torre told USA TODAY Sports. "There's no middle of the road with the Yankees. And we showed up in Chicago that day to play the White Sox and they had signs and banners, 'We Love New York.'"

It was the same story when the Yankees arrived in Baltimore, and then Tampa Bay, and, in a poignant reflection of national unity, felt like most of the country was rooting for the Yankees as New York's beloved baseball team reached the postseason and ultimately the World Series.

Now Torre looks around America and sees discord.

The attack on the U.S. Capitol. Division over athletes who have protested during the national anthem. Democrats and Republicans regarding each other with more animosity than the Yankees and Red Sox ever did.

"Unfortunately, as a country, we're not wearing the same uniform, it seems," Torre said.

He won four World Series titles as a manager, but none was as memorable as the year he lost one.

That was the 2001 season, when Torre's Yankees won three electric games at Yankee Stadium only to lose the series to the Diamondbacks in

Game 7. That team, Torre said, could serve as an important lesson today.

"I know still that success really relies on everybody pulling together and caring for each other," he said. "And I can just tell you, as a baseball manager, you don't have to like each other on a baseball team, but you certainly need to respect each other. And as I say, I had a special group (of players) that maybe didn't go out and socialize together, but when they got on the field, they knew what they needed to do."

In one of the most indelible sports moments in the aftermath of 9/11, President George W. Bush threw out the ceremonial pitch before Game 3 of the World Series at Yankee Stadium. Todd Greene, then a backup catcher for the Yankees, caught the pitch.

But while recalling what he considers the highlight of his career, Greene lamented the state of the country.

"It's just such a shame that we have to have a tragedy like that for our country to be united," he said. "And we're just so divisive now with everything, and it's refreshing to think back how united our country was after such a tragedy occurred."

"We've never been more united as a country than we were for those couple of months after that happened."

With a chuckle, former Yankee Paul O'Neill said it probably became acceptable to hate the Yankees after the 2001 season.

"But at that time, it seemed like everybody was kind of respectful and like rooting for us to get through what was going on in New York," he said. "It was like we were playing for the country."

passed away: Al Kaline, Tom Seaver, Lou Brock, Bob Gibson, Whitey Ford, Joe Morgan, Phil Niekro, Tommy Lasorda, Don Sutton and Aaron.

Yet reflective of these times, Bench was absent from the ceremonies for the first time since his induction, testing positive for the coronavirus last week despite having been vaccinated. Many of the Hall of Famers on stage, but not all, wore masks. And most of the eldest Hall of Famers, such as Willie Mays, Whitey Herzog, Luis Aparicio, Sandy Koufax, Bill Mazeroski and Brooks Robinson, elected to stay at home instead of risking their health.

Simmons, who had to wait all these years before he was inducted, perhaps delivered the most eloquent speech. He even quoted the Beatles to thank his wife, Maryanne: "In the end, the love you take is equal to the love you make. ... We finally got here sweetheart."

Walker easily had the most humorous speech, even before he began, wearing a SpongeBob pin on his suit and taking out his cellphone to shoot video of the crowd before speaking his first words. He talked about not knowing the rules of baseball growing up in Canada, telling the story of running behind the pitcher's mound instead of retouching second base on his way back to first base on a fly ball to the outfield that was caught. He talked about going on social media trying to get into the Hall of Fame with a hashtag, "Fergie needs a friend," and turned around and thanked Fergie Jenkins for being the first Canadian into the Hall of Fame. And he joked about those report cards filled with D's and F's.

Simmons thanked those who helped him along the way, including late Padres executives Kevin Towers

and Bill Bryk, while also making sure to honor those who courageously paved the way for free agency: Curt Flood, Catfish Hunter, Andy Messersmith and, of course, Marvin Miller.

"Marvin Miller made so much possible for every player," Simmons said. "I could not be more proud to enter this great Hall with this great man."

Don Fehr, former executive director of the players association, delivered a passionate 23-minute speech for the Miller family, with Miller dying in 2012, describing the man who every player will forever be indebted to. "He was easily the most practical person I ever saw," Fehr said. "He was quiet, soft spoken; I never heard him raise his voice except to me once or twice in exasperation. Never to players, owners, fans, media or staff. He was polite, thoughtful, deliberate, fiercely and incredibly intelligent, extraordinarily meticulous, well-prepared, incisive and decisive. The man had an endless reserve of patience."

He talked about Miller's trust toward the players, which they reciprocated. "Baseball was not the same after your tenure as it was before," Fehr said, "it was and is much better for everyone. You brought out the best of us, and you did us proud."

The 2½-hour ceremony ended with Jeter thanking the fans and delivering a message to the active players.

"This is a game that requires sacrifice and dedication, discipline and focus," Jeter said. "It's a game of failure that teaches you teamwork and teaches you humility. One thread with all of us here on stage that we understand is there's no one individual bigger than the game."

"The game goes on. And it goes on because of the great fans we have. So take care of it. Protect it. Respect it. Don't take the time you have to play for granted."

"Remember the most important thing: It's more than just a game. The greatest ever to play in the Hall of Fame family — they're all watching."


