



This application was submitted to the TCEQ on September 10, 2014. The application will be available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ central office, TCEQ Tyler regional office, and the Pittsburg-Camp County Public Library, 613 Gultman Street, Pittsburg, Camp County, Texas, beginning the first day of publication of this notice. The facility compliance file, if it exists, is available for public review in the Tyler regional office of the TCEQ.

The executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. In addition to the renewal, this permitting action includes the incorporation of the following authorizations or changes to authorized facilities related to this permit: amendments. The reasons for any changes for incorporations, to the extent they are included in the renewed permit, may include the enhancement of operational control at the plant or enforceability of the permit. For more information about this permit application or the permitting process, please call the Public Education Program toll free at 1-800-887-4040. **The TCEQ may act on this application without seeking further public comment or providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.**

PUBLIC COMMENT You may submit public comments, or a request for a contested case hearing to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. **The deadline to submit public comments is 15 days after newspaper notice is published.** After the deadline for public comments, the executive director will prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's jurisdiction to address in the permit process.

After the technical review is complete the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. If only comments are received, the response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will then be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or who is on the mailing list for this application, unless the application is directly referred to a contested case hearing.

In 'Rebels,' the Empire pre-emptively strikes back

Animated series chronicles exploits before 'Star Wars'

Star Wars is in an Empire state of mind.

The nefarious galactic government that gave us Darth Vader, a couple of Death Stars and a horde of marching AT-ATs in George Lucas' original movie trilogy returns in the new animated series *Star Wars Rebels*.

The cartoon kicks off with a one-hour Disney Channel premiere special Friday (9 p.m. ET/PT), then begins its first season Oct. 13 on Disney XD.

Rebels takes place before the

events of the original 1977 *Star Wars* movie and focuses on the nascent Rebel Alliance — namely, the crew of the starship *Ghost*, led by the Jedi-trained Kanan (voiced by Freddie Prinze Jr.).

The good guys are cool and all, but "people are just glad the Empire's back," says Dave Filoni, one of *Rebels'* executive producers along with Simon Kinberg and Greg Weisman.

As seen in Lucas' final prequel, 2005's *Revenge of the Sith*, the Empire rose and had a decade of military expansion. For many, the initial public perception is the Empire is a good thing that brings stability and safety.

The Emperor, however, is building his first Death Star in secret during *Rebels* as he consolidates power, the Outer Rim of the galaxy is oppressed by Imperial forces, and Vader and his minions

are charged with wiping out any remaining Jedi.

As part of a new generation of *Star Wars* projects, *Rebels* will tie in with future stories, including next year's *Episode VII* movie. Yet it also reflects the franchise's past. It shares many aspects of the first *Star Wars* trilogy, from the Jedi Fighters and Star Destroyers to Stormtroopers who can't shoot straight.

The introduction of the Jedi-hunting Inquisitor (Jason Isaacs) showcases a ruthless throwback to the calm villainy of Vader.

What makes him really creepy is "everybody he encounters is so far beneath his skill level that it doesn't tax him," the actor says. "I wanted him to enjoy the chase and enjoy the hunt. He can take on any number of adversaries and still have time to read the newspaper and get his nails done."





TV star Stephen Collins faces molestation investigation

New York police say they have an open investigation into allegations that veteran TV actor Stephen Collins molested a teenage girl in the early 1970s.

David says the case remains open, but no charges have been filed. TMZ reported Tuesday that Collins, 67, discussed the incident in a therapy session with his estranged wife, Faye Grant.

also included allegations that her husband admitted the molestation in documents filed in their divorce case last year. In the wake of developments, cable television networks, including UP TV, said Tuesday they would not broadcast reruns of Collins' series 7th

Heaven. Collins' lawyer Mark Vincent Kaplan did not return phone messages seeking comment Tuesday. TMZ reported that Collins had resigned a leadership post with the SAG-AFTRA actor's union, and Entertainment Weekly reported he had been fired from the movie Ted 2.
