Meditating, self-care helped this Japanese pop star after coming out

In a weekly series, USA TODAY's The Essentials, celebrities share what fuels their lives. • Even trailblazers such as Shinjiro Atae have to do their best to avoid burnout. • The Japanese pop star made waves last summer when he came out as gay at a fan event in Tokyo. In Japan, where LGBTQ+ people still face discrimination in schools, workplaces and elsewhere, few public figures have come out. • "I was so tired of being in the closet," says Atae, who now is based in Los Angeles. "It's kind of like I had two lives. In LA, (I was) a little more open, but still not fully open; I came out to some friends but not to everybody. But in Japan, I couldn't come out to anybody, so I felt a little uncomfortable being there.'

Despite the liberating revelation, Atae says there also was a dark side to coming out.

"After I came out, for a full three months. I was actually in a bad place mentally," Atae says. "I was like, 'Oh, what did I do? I shouldn't have done that. I feel so sorry for my fans.' ... I think I was a little depressed."

But Atae would find a savior in self-care.

"Before I moved here, I didn't even know the word 'mental health' cause in Japan, we don't really talk about it," Atae says. "I'd never done yoga or meditation kind of stuff, but it really helped me so much. I can't live without it now. Usually, I'm a very positive, optimistic person, but lit sometimes tough." rson, but life is

Here are Atae's essentials for self-care:

Atae keeps his cool with yoga and meditation

Atae typically kicks off his day with a five-minute meditation session, a practice that has helped the singer around himself in self-control.

"I was very impatient," says Atae of his introduction to meditation. "I'm always impulsive. If I want something, I want it right now.'

Meditation paved the way for Atae's next wellness staple, yoga. While he "used to hate" the physical activity, yoga has become a mainstay of Atae's

Dartmouth basketball votes to form first college sports labor union

Dartmouth men's basketball play-ers voted on Tuesday to form the first labor union in college sports, a historic decision that could trigger a huge shift in the longstanding NCAA amateur model

The 15-player roster voted 13-2 in fa-vor of unionization. In terms of any collective bargaining determinations, the men's basketball players will be represented by the local chapter of Service Employees International Union, one of the largest labor unions in the neurotric in the country.

In the country. The vote requires Dartmouth "to bargain in good faith with their em-ployees' representative and to sign any collective bargaining agreement that has been reached," according to the Net end Lyber Lyber Dard the National Labor Relations Board The parties involved have five busi-ness days to file objections to Tues-day's election, and if no objections are filed the NLRB will certify the union as the workers' bargaining representative

Dartmouth can appeal the ruling in a federal appeals court. But the deci-sion to unionize marks a seismic and likely influential move away from amateurism and toward an "employee model for some athletes.

"For decades, Dartmouth has been proud to build productive relation-ships with the five unions that are cur-rently part of our campus community," rently part of our campus community, the university said in a statement posted on X. "We always negotiate in good faith and have a deep respect for our 1,500 union colleagues, including the members of SEIU Local 560.

"In this isolated circumstance. however, the students on the men's basketball team are not in any way employed by Dartmouth. For Ivy League students who are varsity athletes, academics are of primary importance, and athletic pursuit is part of the educational experience. Classify-ing these students as employees sim-ply because they play basketball is as unprecedented as it as inaccurate. We,

Imprecedenced as in a index intervent, we, therefore, do not believe unionization is appropriate." The vote to unionize was praised by the Major League Baseball Players As-sociation. "The MLBPA applauds the Dart-menth, meach backets

The MLBPA applauds the Dart-mouth meris basketball players for their courage and leadership in the movement to establish and advance the rights of college athletes," execu-tive director Tony Clark said in a state-The director long Clark said in a state-ment. "By voting to unionize, these athletes have an unprecedented seat at the table and a powerful voice with which to negotiate for rights and bene-fits that have been ignored for far too hard = 0."

The vote came one month after a regional director for the National Labor Relations Board ordered a union elec-tion for the program, writing that "be-cause Dartmouth has the right to control the work performed by" the play-ers and "because the players perform that work in exchange for compensa-tion," they should be recognized as school employees under the National

Labor Relations Act. The regional director, Laura A. Sacks, wrote in her ruling that Dart-mouth "exercises significant control mount exercises significant control over the basketball players' work," and that the school's student-athlete handbook "in many ways functions as an employee handbook." She cited examples of the way the

school, university administrators and coaches determine what the players can do and when, noting that for Dart-mouth players, "special permission is required for a player to even get a hair-cut during a trip."

cut during a trip." The university argued that these types of regulations were necessary for players' safety and "no different from the regulations placed on the student body at large." Sacks rejected Dartmouth's argu

Sacks rejected Dartmouth's argu-ment that describing men's basketball players as school employees could lead to students who participate in a variety of other extracurricular activ-ities also being considered school employees. "No evidence in the record suggests

that other students receive the extent of individual support and special con-sideration received by those individuals who participate in high-profile Division I collegiate athletics," she

The Dartmouth case marked the second time in the past decade that an NLRB regional director has ordered a NLKB regional director has ordered a union election involving athletes in an NCAA program, following an election for the Northwestern football team in March 2014. The results of that elec-tion were never made public.

The NLRB's Los Angeles office has The NLRB's Los Angeles office has another case pending against the Uni-versity of Southern California, the Pac-12 Conference and the NCAA re-garding employment status of foot-ball, men's basketball, women's bas-

bai, men's bassetoan, women's bas-ketball players. There are additional NLRB cases occurring in the Chicago office, which is investigating an unfair labor prac-tice charge filed last July by the College Basketball Players Association against Northwestern, and in the Indi-anapolis office, which is investigating an earlier charge filed by the CBPA against the NCAA.

New MLB Las Vegas stadium design unveiled as 'spherical armadillo'

While significant hurdles remain to be vaulted before the Athletics play a game in Las Vegas, the club announced Tuesday it was partnering with a Dan-ish design firm to build its proposed 33,000-seat ballpark on the Strip. The A's on Tuesday released long-de-

layed renderings for a ballpark designed layed renderings for a balipark designed by Bjarke Ingels Group, an audacious design for a cozy 9-acre parcel. While it vaguely resembles the Sydney Opera House, the club has dubbed its hoped-for addition to the Vegas scene "a spherical armadillo."

The team's move from Oakland to Las Vegas was approved by Major League Baseball owners in November, and the club has secured \$380 million in state and Clark County funds toward the development of its proposed ballpark, to be constructed on the current site of the Tropicana Las Vegas Casino Resort. But the road to Vegas is not without potholes.

A Nevada teachers union is mounting a second challenge to the Athletics' state funding, suing to question the legality of the bill. A's owner John Fisher has also not specified how he will fund the remaining \$1.1 billion or so to construct the stadium; in a Las Vegas appearance last month, he suggested the club would welcome additional investors to raise capital.

Amid all that were long-awaited sta-Amid all that were long-awarded sta-dium renderings that were expected to be released in December, when the A's scheduled an event that included Fish-er, the governor, county commissioner, UNLV's president and labor and tourism bardene leaders

Yet the A's abruptly canceled the Dec 4 presentation, strangely and perhaps cynically citing the recent deaths of Ne-vada state troopers. There was virtual silence on any renderings since.

At least until Tuesday. The stadium, which was intended to be a retractable-roof dome but instead has a fixed roof perhaps owing to the small parcel of land, is expected to include a view of the New York New York casino skyline. Ac-

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cording to BIG, it will feature "the world's largest cable net glass wall." The AI-generated humans in the ren-derings are staring out at what the club touts as MLB's largest video board, al-

though it appears aligned more for an opening crawl in a "Star Wars" movie than to quickly inform fans of a pitch's velocity.

BIG and the A's have a history; the bit and the As have a fistory, the Danish firm also provided the render-ings for the club's 2018 rendering rollout of a ballpark at Oakland's Howard Ter-minal. That model has haunted the city since, as Fisher's dreams of a \$12 billion multituse project faded and he pivoted toward a far less ambitious project in Nevada Nevada

Even that remains but a vision. The team will play the 2024 season at Oak-land's Coliseum, after which its lease will expire. The club is in negotiations with Oakland to potentially extend its stay, while also pondering Salt Lake City and Sacramento as temporary homes for the 2025, '26 and '27 seasons as the Las Vegas park is constructed.

Las vegas parts constructed. The renderings showed an image of promising A's second baseman Zack Ge-lof on the Jumbotron, a fine choice given his talent and youth. Yet Gelof would be eligible for salary arbitration and entering his fifth full season in 2028. Fisher's track record indicates a strong chance

he'd be traded by then. For now, he lives on as a Las Vegas Athletic, even if only in the imagination.
