FARADAY FUTURE UNVEILS ELECTRIC SUPER SPEEDSTER

But secretive company reveals little else about FF Zero 1 Concept car

LAS VEGAS Faraday Future unveiled a racy electric prototype Monday at a 2016 CES event that was as hotly anticipated as the Strip is scorching in summer.

Dubbed the FF Zero 1 Concept, the car looks like a cross between a futuristic Batmobile and a very real Porsche 919 Hybrid track demon. It is noticeably not a familyfriendly machine, but executives say that's by design.

Instead, the prototype is meant to showcase a modular design approach called Variable Form Ar-

> chitecture that allows any number of body styles to be built atop the same chassis, thereincreasing speed to market for a range of

The company also touted a battery-pack system that operates continuously even if one unit fails, a bit like Christmas tree lights that continue to shine even if one bulb burns out.

The message from Faraday brass was simple if a bit disappointing for those hoping to see a car that was ready for production: The company has the backing, staffing and drive to eventually surface as a player on the evolv-

ing and tech-driving automotive landscape.

"Apple didn't just transform the phone, they transformed the way we lived our lives, and we want to do that, too," Faraday Future product architect Nick Sampson told a packed house. "We are embarking on nothing less than a complete rethink of what mobility means."

Lead Faraday designer Richard Kim, who helped bring BMW's iconic new electric cars - the i3 and i8 - to life, pointed at a deep crease in the side of the concept

"This is what we call our UFO line, and it denotes that it's not really of this world. It will be a feature of all our cars.'

The invitation-only event included both the state's governor and this city's mayor, who both had a hand in helping negotiate a \$1 billion commitment by Chinese-backed Faraday to build its

first manufacturing plant north of the city. Executives here said they plan to employ 4,500 people and have a car ready within a few The event unfolded in a tented

area opposite the pyramidshaped Luxor Hotel. A purple-lit white interior throbbed with house music. On stage under a white sheet with the double-F logo sat what looked like a belt-high racing car, not a populist people

Media and other guests arrived more than an hour early, but those in the front row were soon asked to leave. Minutes later, a woman walked the row laying down placards bearing largely Chinese names and characters. If you're investing upwards of a billion dollars on a venture, you get front-row seats.

Faraday Future has rolled out in remarkable secrecy, a journey that only recently came into the media light with the announcement of the area plant.

Operating for 18 months now in stealth mode in Los Angeles, the team has quietly grown to 750, many of them poached from auto and tech giants such as Tesla, BMW and Apple.

What few reporters have been granted visits to these headquarters have not exited with a clearer idea of Faraday's mission, beyond quoting employees saying they're trying to shift the automotive paradigm and are building the most connected car around.

Ford partners with Amazon to connect cars with homes

LAS VEGAS Ford revealed it's working with Amazon to grant Ford owners unprecedented access to their connected-home devices from their cars, one of a handful of high-tech goals — including an aim to get self-driving cars on the road by 2020 - the Detroit automaker is pushing at CES this year.

In the Amazon deal, Ford hopes a car owner will soon be able to use the vehicle's Sync Connect system to use touch or voice commands to open a garage door, check a thermostat setting or turn on home lighting. While at home, that owner could ask a Ford smartphone app what the car's remaining driving range is or even program a time to start the engine.

The voice commands issued at home would be routed through Amazon Echo, a free-standing speaker that interfaces with Alexa, Amazon's cloud-based vir-

tual assistant, similar to Apple's Siri and Microsoft's Cortana.

Information about the status of a homeowner's various Internet of Things devices would be provided through Wink, a venture between General Electric and Quirky. Last fall, failing Quirky sold Wink to Internet of Things platform Flex. Wink's platform integrates IoT products from companies such as Nest, Philips Hue and Schlage.

"We are working to see if we can come up with a product that we can commercialize," Ford CEO Mark Fields told USA TO DAY. "The key is finding the right software protocols so that the integrations with Amazon Echo and Alexa work."

According to Gartner, some 21 billion IoT devices are expected to be online by 2020. Automakers, which traditionally lagged when it came to in-car electronics, are stepping up their efforts in the battle for buyers.

That push has even led to some collaboration, as with the news Monday that Toyota is among a number of automakers adopting smartphone software technology developed by Ford, which it has shared openly in order to push for a unified in-car app platform.

Ford is working with Amazon to develop a system that would allow drivers to connect with IoT devices via Amazon's cloud-based Alexa virtual assistant.

Chevy Bolt EV designed with Lyft in mind

Range, design make car well-suited to be part of a shared

LAS VEGAS Sitting in a barren parking lot under gray skies, Chevy's new Bolt electric car doesn't seem like a game changer. But looks can be deceiving.

The new four-door EV, which goes into production at the end of 2016, has been designed specifically with ride-sharing in mind, executives say, a fact that suggests General Motors may have been mulling its recent \$500 million infusion into San Franciscobased ride-hailing service Lyft for some time.

Monday, GM and Lyft announced that the former would not only provide a sizable investment in the company, but also roll out fleets of GM cars in select U.S. cities that will be available to anyone wanting to make money driving for Lyft. The agreement

includes the two companies teaming on self-driving car technology, a research area pursued by a growing number of auto and tech companies.

But it's the test-fleet project that seems tailored to the Bolt, which will sell for \$30,000 and federal rebates and has a 200mile battery range. Although it is a compact crossover, the vehicle features a range of touches that make it better suited than many small cars for ride-sharing duty, says Pamela Fletcher, GM's chief engineer for electric vehicles.

"This really is the first car purposely built for ride sharing," Fletcher says. She highlights an exterior "that seems shrinkwrapped around the interior," which provides rear-seat passengers with ample room for three; large door openings and flat floors, which make entering and exiting the car easier; and onboard cameras that on command project an image of a wide field behind the car onto the car's rearview mirror, which helps with safety when dropping off or picking up passengers in city traffic.

The car features self-sealing tires made by Michelin, which means Lyft drivers don't have to worry about stranding their fares. In the rear part of the armrest console closest to the rear passengers are two USB ports for those in need of a quick smartphone recharge.

"We think it's all about providing convenience," Fletcher says.

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
Oscar Hijuelos traces the path of the two greats as they discover new ideas in 'Paradise'

Even up to the day before his unexpected death in 2013, Oscar Hijuelos, the Pulitzer Prize-winning author of The Mambo Kings Play Songs of Love was at work on his weighty and intricately conceived final novel. In Twain & Stanlev Enter Paradise (Grand Central, 465 pp., ★★★ out of four), he imagines the intersecting lives of two of the 19th century's most famous men, from their meeting on the Mississippi River to their rise to pre-eminence -Mark Twain as America's foremost man of letters and Henry Stanley as the explorer who captured the world's imagination by tracking through unknown Africa to utter his famous line, "Doctor Livingstone, I presume?"

Though the two men get equal billing in the title, Stanley's life forms the novel's spine. Even at the time of his arrival in New Orleans as an impoverished Welsh orphan, Stanley, like Hijuelos, read widely and deeply, finding a home for himself in literature and ideas: "If some men went after women or became rhapsodic with alcohol, my addictions, I discovered, were to work and to read what I construed as literature." Little wonder that his chance meeting with Twain on the Mississippi would lead to a lifelong friendship, with each man in-



forming and expanding on the other's view of the world.

Twain is a charismatic, lively

figure, and Stanley comes across as studied and melancholy. But both men, as imagined by Hijuelos, showed broad empathy with the outside world, and one of

the greatest pleasures of Twain & Stanley is to watch the intellectuals' viewpoints evolve in tandem. They witness firsthand the beating of slaves during their early Mississippi River days, and threads of that foundation trace through their later work, from

Twain's depiction of

Jim in The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn to Stanley's complicated relationship to the colonial brutality in the Belgian Congo.

This is a novel, however, and for long stretches of the text the **Both men showed** broad empathy with the outside world, and one of the greatest pleasures of 'Twain & Stanley' is to watch the intellectuals' viewpoints evolve in tandem.

reader is left in a mediated and muddy place. Though this stylistically adventurous book ranges from diary entries to letters, as if it were a compilation of found documents, every word of the text is the product of Hijuelos's imagination, so it lacks the factual certainty that girds the backbone of non-fiction.

Though hamstrung by the double limitations of non-fiction and fiction, Twain & Stanley is illuminating reading for Hijuelos fans.

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



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
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
