Drive sober this Independence Day, and every day

Pittsburg, Texas — This Independence Day, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service's Watch UR BAC and the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) want to remind drivers that Buzzed Driving Is Drunk Driving. Unfortunately, summertime festivities can create dangerous road conditions, as some drivers hit the streets after drinking alcoholic beverages.

Make sure to celebrate the birth of America safely. Drivers found under the influence of any substance, and still recklessly choose to get behind the wheel of a vehicle, put everyone on the road in danger, including themselves.

According to NHTSA's Fatality Analysis Reporting System, drunk driving accounted for 29 percent (10,511) of motor vehicle traffic crash deaths in 2018. With Fourth of July celebration wrapping up in the evening or late at night, more vehicles will be on the road at night. In 2018 alone, 193 people died in motor vehicle traffic crashes over the July Fourth holiday period (6 p.m., July 3, to 5:59 a.m., July 5). Forty percent (78) of those fatalities occurred in alcohol-impaired-driving crashes. This compares to 2017, when 38 percent of the July Fourth holiday period fatalities occurred in alcohol-impaired-driving crashes.

Buzzed driving is drunk driving

The Camp County Extension Office wants you to have a happy and safe Independence Day — one that they'll remember for years to come, for all the right reasons. We've partnered with NHTSA to help remind drivers that Buzzed Driving Is Drunk Driving. Under no circumstance is it ever OK to drink and drive. This behavior is illegal, it is deadly, and it is selfish. Do everyone in your community a favor: If you've been drinking at a Fourth of July party, or for any occasion, find a sober ride home."

During the Fourth of July holiday, make sure to plan for a safe weekend of festivities.

If you are drunk or high, or even a little buzzed, we are begging you: Stay off the roads. Drunk driving is deadly. If you plan to be the sober driver, then don't indulge — your friends are relying on you.

Prepare for July Fourth

This Fourth of July, the Camp County Extension Office and NHTSA urge drivers to designate a sober driver before heading out for the evening. For people that plan on drinking, plan how to safely get around without driving, too.

Remember these tips for a safe night on the roads:

It is never OK to drink and drive. Even if you have had only one alcoholic beverage, designate a sober driver

or plan to use public transportation or a ride service to get home safely.

- If available, use your community's sober ride program
- If you see a drunk driver on the road, contact 9-1-1.
- Do you have friend who is about to drink and drive? Take the keys away and make arrangements to get your friend home safely.

This Fourth of July commit to driving 100 percent sober — because Buzzed Driving Is Drunk Driving.



Essence magazine changes CEO amid claims of abuse

Dennis to leave position, but still owns publication

Essence magazine named new temporary leadership days after someone claiming to be an employee posted anonymous allegations of mistreatment and abuse within the company.

The beauty and lifestyle publication, which caters to Black women, said in a statement to USA TODAY on Wednesday that its interim CEO Richelieu Dennis will be replaced by Caroline Wanga.

Wanga had joined the company just days earlier as chief growth officer after serving as a diversity and inclusion officer at Target.

While Dennis, a hair care mogul, is vacating the CEO position, he still owns the publication.

Wanga will oversee all operations until a permanent CEO is identified.

"Out of an abundance of caution and an unwavering commitment to transparency, ESSENCE is in the process of hiring law firms and other independent external experts to assess and review the company's policies," Essence said in a statement that was posted on Twitter by news commentator Roland Martin.

The news of the CEO change comes just days after Essence refuted claims of a toxic workplace environment.

On Sunday, an anonymous essay was posted on Medium.com under the byline "Black Female Anonymous."

The blog post alleges that senior staffers at Essence mistreated Black female employees for the past two years.

It said there was sexual harassment, pay inequity and bullying within the company.

Black Female Anonymous said: "We present ourselves under the condition of anonymity for fear of retaliation, intimidation & the maligning of our media careers."

Essence immediately denounced the allegations on Monday. The publication released a statement calling the claims "unfounded attempts to discredit our

brand and assassinate personal character."

Dennis took on the interim CEO role in March after Essence Communications, which runs the magazine, announced that Michelle Ebanks was stepping down. Ebanks left to pursue a position at its parent company Essence Ventures.

The process of finding a permanent

CEO was delayed due to COVID-19, according to the publication.

The first issue of Essence magazine was launched by four Black businessmen in 1970. Time Inc. acquired 49% of the company in 2000 and bought the remaining 51% by 2005.

Dennis, who founded the hair care company SheaMoisture, bought it for an undisclosed amount in 2018.

Students get a break as loan rates hit historic lows

College students who must cope with a new way of doing things in light of CO-VID-19 can take heart in one thing: Federal student loan rates are hitting historic lows.

As of Wednesday, rates on federal student loans have tumbled to reflect the Federal Reserve's move this spring to push short-term rates close to zero percent.

The Fed noted in its emergency March 15 rate cut: "The coronavirus outbreak has harmed communities and disrupted economic activity in many countries, including the United States."

Now, for the 2020-2021 academic year, the interest rate on federal student loans for undergraduates has dropped to 2.75%, down from 4.53% last year.

"The 2.75% interest rate is a new historic low," said Mark Kantrowitz, publisher and vice president of research for Savingforcollege.com. Savings could be as low as a few hundred dollars, depending on the type and the amount of debt, to up to a few thousand dollars. One calculation estimates possible savings of \$669 for undergraduates to \$2,797 for graduate students taking out federal PLUS loans, according to estimates from Credible.com, an online marketplace to shop for lenders.

The new rates do not apply to private student loans or to federal student loans that were taken out earlier to attend college.

The new lower rates apply to federal student loans taken between July 1, 2020, and June 30, 2021.

What's happening to college game plans?

Convincing someone that they still want to go to college in the fall could remain a hard sell even in light of lower rates. Many parents are worried about sending their children away to school if the COVID-19 outbreaks continue.

And college game plans aren't what they used to be. Some families have seen widespread layoffs and job cuts during the pandemic; some college students aren't making the kind of money they expected in hours or tips this summer. For some families, though, it may be a better year to borrow a bit more money, perhaps, if the student already is in college and able to limit borrowing in future years if interest rates edge back up in 2022 or 2023. Some well-off families might want to give their investments more time to recover. One calculation estimates possible savings of \$669 for undergraduates to \$2,797 for graduate students taking out federal PLUS loans.

much is unknown about the longerterm economic impact of COVID-19.

How do you calculate how much to borrow?

Some old guidelines still apply when it comes to deciding how much to borrow for college. You still want to borrow as little as possible — controlling your debt by selecting an affordable school, tapping into savings, living like a student while in college, working some in school and applying for scholarships.

A good rule of thumb is to aim to have total student loan debt at graduation what you expect to earn with your degree."

If you have that information, you can use the Department of Education's loan simulator to see what your monthly payment and total repayment costs will be in any of the government's repayment plans. See studentaid.gov/loansimulator.

The coronavirus pandemic is forcing universities to reconsider everything from how classes will be held to the 2020 college football season.

And it's also possible that you might now qualify for more financial aid, too.

"My best advice is to appeal for more financial aid if you've been affected financially by the coronavirus pandemic, especially if the parents have lost their jobs or experienced a furlough or pay cut," Kantrowitz said.

Remember, many college students likely applied for financial aid before COVID-19 preventive measures shut down much of the economy.

College students were eligible to begin applying for financial aid for the 2020-21 school year in October, long before the job losses and wage cuts that we've seen during the economic shut down that has been part of the fight against the coronavirus.

"The previous record low was in 2004-05 when interest rates were as low as 2.875%."

Graduate students are looking at rates of 4.3%, down from the old rate of 6.08%.

The Parent PLUS loan rate is 5.3%, down from 7.08%. The rate is the same for graduate PLUS loans.

How much can you save with lower rates?

Borrowers are expected to save billions of dollars over the next 10 years given the lower rates. But there's no guarantee that the stock market won't drop further in future years or rates won't stay low for some time. We have to recognize that that is less than your annual starting salary, according to Kantrowitz. If you do that, you should be able to repay your student loans in 10 years or less.

And keep careful track over the years of how much you've borrowed in federal student loans, as well as private loans if you tap into those loans, too.

"Students should start putting together a plan for repaying their student loans before they graduate," said Robert Humann, general manager for Credible-.com.

"You should have a good idea of what your total student loan debt will be, the interest rates on each of your loans, and The 2020-21 FAFSA is based on 2018 income, Kantrowitz said.

And he noted that the 2021-22 FAFSA – which students will start filing Oct. 1 – will be based on 2019 income, which also was pre-pandemic and might not reflect economic reality now.

So it may be more important to file the FAFSA but then contact your college to discuss how your financial situation has changed. The school's decision would be the final say and cannot be appealed to the Department of Education.

Because MLB is not playing ball

A group of 50 minor league baseball teams and their vendors are just the latest to sue. According to their lead attorney, Andrew Sandler, it wasn't coronavirus that ended their season. It was MLB.

"The teams are unable to play because they're not getting their players from MLB," said Sandler, an attorney with Mitchell Sandler LLC in Washington, D.C. "That is classic business interruption.

"This is no different than cases after 9/11, Hurricane Sandy and Hurricane Katrina," Sandler continued. "The courts view it very dimly when insurers collect premiums then when a major catastrophe hits, they say they can't pay."

A spokesman for Philadelphia Indemnity Insurance Co., the lead insurance carrier named in the lawsuit, said his firm does not comment on pending litigation.

The teams involved in the lawsuit average about 20 employees and more than \$2 million in annual expenses, according to Jason Freier, the chief executive of Hardball Capital, an Atlanta company that owns three of the minor league teams. Some of the teams in the league own their own stadiums and all the concessions stands that sell everything from t-shirts and jerseys to hotdogs and hamburgers. Others lease the ballparks from the cities in which they operate and contract out to vendors.

Players are not part of their payrolls. They are paid and managed by MLB, which can withhold players if it chooses to do so, and that's exactly what happened late last month.

In terms of fans, league attendance has surpassed 40 million for the last 15 years, according to the lawsuit. "These ballparks are among the largest community gathering places in town," Freier said.

The stadiums are also major employers.

"Large numbers of people cycle through seasonally – ushers, concession workers, cleaning crews," Freier said. "There are literally hundreds of people that rely on the activity in season for some portion of their income, and now that the season has been canceled, it's going to be a struggle for them."

Freier said his company has faithfully paid business interruption insurance for 35 years.

"It's frustrating when you keep paying your premiums in the hope that you won't need it and then something comes along and you think this will get you through," Freier said. "Now we've gotta find some other way to mitigate the damage." also pointed to microorganism and pollution exclusions in the contracts.

The first exclusion voids coverage for any claim arising directly or indirectly out of a microorganism, and "the coronavirus is unquestionably a microorganism," court documents state. The second exclusion "precludes coverage for any claim related to substances that pose a threat to human health," and coronavirus is unquestionable a threat to human health.

What's more, attorneys representing Lloyd's accused restaurant owners of lying in their pleadings by saying that government forced them to close their restaurants.

"Plaintiffs were never required to cease delivery, take-out or pick-up services," documents filed on behalf of Lloyds state. "No government order prevented plaintiffs themselves, or their employees, from entering the properties, and indeed certain of the orders actually encouraged access."

Thus far, most cases filed against insurance companies are still pending, with attorneys on both sides expecting to be litigating for some time.

"In terms of business interruption insurance, we're in the top of the first inning of a nine inning game," said Sandler, the lead attorney representing minor league baseball teams in their lawsuit against insurance companies.

Like after 9/11 and Hurricanes Katrina and Sandy, insurers worked hard to discourage small businesses from pursuing claims by denying coverage, Sandler said. Then after those businesses sued, insurers tried to get courts to interpret their exclusions as broadly as possible and to dismiss the cases. That's where we are now, Sandler said. In the end, however, many of the cases were resolved through settlements, allowing businesses to recover some or all of what they were owed.

to provide relief.

Besides the complaints, these restaurant owners also filed dozens of lawsuits.

In New Orleans, Houghtaling filed one of the first suits against underwriters at Lloyds of London on behalf of his 500-seat Oceana Grill restaurant in the heart of the French Quarter. He argued that he paid for an "all risk policy" that "only excluded losses due to biological materials such as pathogens in connection with terrorism or malicious use." He, therefore, concluded that his insurance company should provide coverage for the pandemic.

As to whether coronavirus does longterm damage to property, the Houghtaling suit concluded that the virus physically infects and remains on surfaces for up to 28 days, particularly in humid areas of the country like Louisiana.

"It is clear that contamination of the insured premises by the coronavirus would be a direct physical loss needing remediation to clean the surfaces of the establishment."

Lloyds of London disagreed.

In ensuing lawsuits, such as one filed by the owner of El Novillo restaurants in Miami against Lloyds of London in April, owners expanded on the same themes.

They claimed it was the actions taken by government to stop the spread of coronavirus, and not the pandemic itself, that put them out of business. They insisted that the virus attached itself to property making it unsafe for the general public to enter and required remediation; and they maintained that insurers Children's Academy, a day care center based in Warrington, Pennsylvania,
 sued Philadelphia Indemnity Insurance
 Co., accusing it of refusing to pay bene fits under its business interruption pol-

icy. The day care center says in its lawsuit that it was forced to shut down on March 15 and has remained closed ever since, incurring "a substantial loss of business."

In a letter to the daycare center, Philadelphia Indemnity's property claims supervisor Karen Grocott counters that no day care employee was sickened by the virus and "there have been no reports of physical damage to your property." She also noted an exclusion in the contract "due to virus or bacteria."

"We will not pay for loss or damage caused by or resulting from any virus, bacterium or other microorganism that induces or is capable of inducing physical distress, illness or disease," Grocott wrote. "Further, because physical damage by a covered cause of loss did not occur to property, the coverage provided under the (government shutdown) provision is not triggered."

Gabriel Gillett, an attorney with Jenner & Block LLP in Chicago who represents clients that have been denied business interruption claims, believes many more lawsuits will be filed before the battles between companies impacted by government shutdowns and their insurers are over.

"One thing we're finding is that when some people get that denial letter, they think that's the final word," Gillett said. "But they need to know that insurers are

Battle royale: restaurants vs. insurers

Owners of restaurants have been equally frustrated with insurance companies regarding the refusal to pay business interruption insurance. They also have been exceptionally vocal about it.

In April, a group of famous restaurateurs led by Thomas Keller, Wolfgang Puck, Daniel Boulud, Jean-Georges Vongerichten and John W. Houghtaling II formed the Business Interruption Group, and they complained all the way to President Donald Trump about the devastation wrought by the pandemic and the failure of insurance companies never intended to honor their commitments.

Attorneys representing Lloyds of London battled back, saying that business losses could be covered under their policies only if there was "physical loss or damage to the insured properties," and that no property was damaged in any way by the coronavirus.

"There is nothing to repair, rebuild or replace," court documents filed by attorneys representing Lloyds in the El Novillo case state. There isn't "any mention of what physical damage occurred, how the physical damage occurred and when the physical damage occurred."

In their motion to dismiss, attorneys

The depth and variety of the companies filing lawsuits against insurance companies are hardly limited to restaurants and minor league baseball teams.

On May 18, for example, the company that owns and operates Central Bucks

denying everyone everywhere and that their denial is susceptible to a challenge.

"In their policies, insurers simply did not choose to exclude coverage for the loss or damage caused by the unprecedented government shutdown orders. Restaurants and other businesses who bought insurance for business interruption reasonably believed they would get such coverage."

The policies do offer coverage in the case of these government shutdown orders, Gillett says. And, in his view, insurers can't keep client premiums and deny coverage just because they claim they can't afford to live up to the terms of the contracts.




