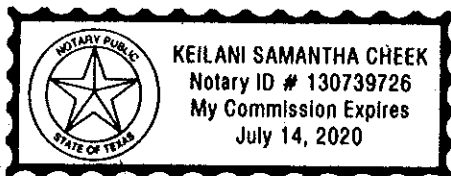

# Tips on how to keep children engaged over school breaks

Children in North America will spend, on average, more than 900 hours attending school in a given year.

The average school year in the United States lasts 1,016 hours, the equivalent of 42 continuous days. According to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, many developed countries begin their academic years in September and end them in June.

Some, like Australia, feature four terms with two-week breaks in between each term.

Others go to school for most of the year - with various holiday breaks in between - and then get the bulk of their time off during the summer.

As much time as kids spend in school, there will be times when they are left to their own devices, and during these times it's easy for them to forget classroom lessons.

Sometimes called "summer learning loss" or "summer slide," this forgetfulness sees many students fail to retain all of their lessons over prolonged breaks from school.

Studies indicate that students score lower on standardized tests at the end of the summer compared to their performance on the same tests at the beginning of summer.

Anywhere from between one to three month's worth of educational achievement can dissipate during prolonged breaks from the classroom.

To help ensure that those hard-earned lessons are not so easily forgotten, parents can help children remain intellectually engaged in various ways over school breaks. Stick to a schedule.

Try to maintain a schedule similar to school, with children waking at the same time each day and going to bed at similar hours.

This will make it much easier to get back into a routine when a new school year begins.

Encourage reading. Set aside time for reading each day.

All it generally takes is 15 to 30 minutes of reading per day for kids to remember their vocabulary lessons and maintain their fluency and comprehension skills.

Children may enjoy picking their own books rather than having a required reading list.

Keep a math book handy. On long car trips or rainy days, children can do a few math problems to keep their skills sharp. This will help keep learning loss to a minimum.

Math workbooks may be available at bookstores, or parents can look online or ask a teacher for a summer to-do packet.

Plan educational trips. Vacations and day trips can be fun, entertaining and educational all at the same time.

Science centers, museums and living history locations can bring to life information learned in the classroom, even on family vacations. Learn at camp.

Many children attend camp for a portion of their school breaks. Look for camps that do not simply babysit children, but engage them through enrichment activities.

Take a class. Children and families can learn together by exploring new skills.

Enroll in something educational and enjoyable, such as a music or dance class, a STEM seminar or something else that engages the mind and body.

This gives everyone a chance to learn something new and have a great time together as a family.

Parents and educators can reduce lesson loss over school breaks by encouraging families to remain intellectually engaged in any way they can.

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# Bio shows why we still can't get enough of Hemingway

For somebody best known for writing books, Ernest Hemingway was as famous as any movie star, sports hero or rock idol you can name in the last century — or this one. That's right. This one. It seems we still can't stop talking about him even beyond the millennium.

The April publication of *Hemingway's Brain*, a forensic inquiry into the physical traumas that led to his suicide in 1961, is being followed by Mary V. Dearborn's *Ernest Hemingway* (Knopf, 627 pp., ★★☆☆ out of four), the first full-fledged biography in 15 years.

It, too, is a kind of extended autopsy, not only of Hemingway's life, but his reputations as a model of American virility and an en-

during literary figure. All of these were subject to scrutiny by scholars, journalists and skeptics even when Hemingway was a living, breathing Nobel Prize winner.

Though some may wonder whether at this late date we need 600-plus pages on one of the most written-about lives in literature, Dearborn's contribution to the biographical corpus benefits from bringing up the rear of such a long parade. There can't be any new facts about the man everybody started calling "Papa" when he was still in his 20s, including the lifelong fetish he had for gender-switching, dramatized in his posthumously published novel, *The Garden of Eden*.

But there is always room for fresh perspective. And Dearborn, who has published life stories of two other exemplars of American machismo, Henry Miller and Norman Mailer, brings a keenly dispassionate, coolly discerning tone to her narrative.

She refuses to indulge Hemingway's odious behavioral tics. But she also persuasively explains why so many others did: "Simply put, people wanted him to like them, so he got away with more than other people did. His charis-

ma protected him from the consequences of his most outrageous actions."

So the contemporary reader has to take Hemingway with all his contradictions. James Joyce on the one hand described him as "a big powerful peasant, strong as a buffalo ... and ready to live the life he writes about." Edmund Wilson, who otherwise admired Hemingway's writing, called him "a real all-American S.O.B., mean and curmudgeonist, quarrelsome and extremely egocentric."

Dearborn's rendition of his life makes you admire Hemingway's headlong pursuit of authentic experience at work, at war or at play as a means to make his writing more honest. But you grow to detest the haphazard tantrums and

indignities he visits upon even those, such as F. Scott Fitzgerald and Gertrude Stein, who encouraged and promoted his work.

Most, if not all of Hemingway's bad behavior had clinical explanations. Dearborn, using research that's recently come to light, blames severe head injuries, with his fifth concussion, coming in the 1954 plane crash in Africa when the world at first believed he'd perished. If doctors had known then what they know now about chronic traumatic encephalopathy, would Hemingway have received better treatment? Dearborn says we can only speculate.

All we have, in the end, are his books, and on these, Dearborn's assessments pretty much follow what is now accepted wisdom: That Hemingway's short stories, his 1926 breakthrough novel, *The Sun Also Rises*, and everything in his subsequent novel, *A Farewell to Arms*, up to its flawed conclusion, are what will endure.

'Prisoner in His Palace' shows two faces of Hussein

Some U.S. guards saw Iraqi dictator like a 'grandpa'

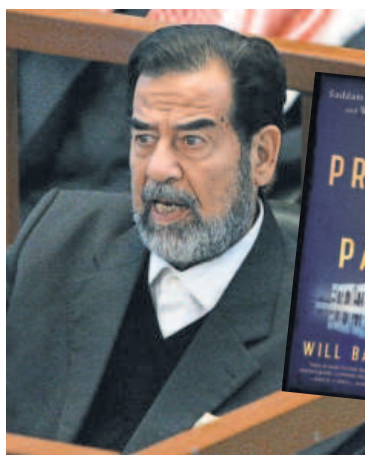
Stuck in his personal prison, Saddam Hussein seemed a benign presence to his 12-man band of U.S. guards who watched him as the former Iraqi dictator was tried for crimes against humanity.

Author Will Bardenwerper

deftly toggles from a non-stop supply of terror to occasional scenes of normal life throughout 'The Prisoner in His Palace: Saddam Hussein, His American Guards, and What History Leaves Unsaid'

Hussein's guards would sit and laugh with him when he told stories about punishing his son Uday by setting all of his expensive sports cars on fire, and then they realized the punishment was for killing Hussein's half-brother and a crowd of innocent Iraqis.

'Baghdad under Saddam Hussein had clearly become a largely unrecognizable place where over-the-top cruelty was routine,' writes Bardenwerper, a former Army Ranger, in a book that is a

brief, but powerful, meditation on the meaning of evil and power.

Each of the 12 military policemen from Fort Campbell, Ky., wrestled with these questions while guarding Hussein. They had trained for many missions,

but none of them expected to be watching the man whose alleged thirst for weapons of mass destruction triggered the U.S. invasions of Iraq in March 2003.

Some wanted to kill Hussein in his cell, while others lamented being stuck behind barbed wire and unable to fight in combat. Some wanted to transfer to other units. Many, grudgingly at first, began to admire him.

'The squad's youngest member, Tucker Dawson, quietly marveled, 'Out of all the people in the Army, how did I get chosen to do this?'' Bardenwerper writes.

Over the course of Hussein's detention and trial, each of the MPs would wonder the same thing. All watched with amusement or alarm the circus that sur-

rounded the former dictator. Hussein would lash out in the courtroom against the United States and its lackeys in the new Iraqi government. Then he'd return to his cell, fire up another Cohiba and chat with guards in his broken, but surprisingly passable, English.

One guard said the man responsible for the deaths of hundreds of thousands of innocent people seemed 'more like a grandpa.' Another said he felt like he let Hussein down when the captured dictator was executed.

In the end, Hussein walked to the gallows Dec. 30, 2006, wearing a white dress shirt and a dark overcoat, dried tears staining his cheeks. He taunted the small crowd about to watch him hang. Then, the floor dropped open, Hussein fell, and his neck snapped.

On that day, one of his captors resolved to leave the Army.
