



CFP RANKINGS WINNERS AND LOSERS

Six teams vying for coveted four spots

With the conference championship games left, it seems like we are realistically down to six teams that can make the College Football Playoff with two others way outside the cut line that would only be considered if there is a total meltdown of historic proportions.

We're at the point where only Georgia is safely in, with two teams that control their destiny in Alabama and Michigan. The third tier of teams includes Oklahoma State and Cincinnati, which must win their conference championship games and root for Georgia to beat Alabama. That's by far the most likely composition of the four-team playoff.

But what happens if Iowa beats Michigan, Houston beats Cincinnati and Baylor beats Oklahoma State? In that case, one of those open spots would likely go to Notre Dame, whose work is already done at 11-1. That would leave the committee to choose between several two-loss teams for the final two spots. Could Ohio State sneak back in, or would Michigan get in anyway because of the head-to-head victory last week? Would Baylor jump back up into the mix? Would defending champion Alabama be the default team for the final spot?

That's probably the only intrigue left in this deal, but if the favorites win Saturday it seems we're going to get a final four with three teams that have never been to the playoff before and Georgia, which has been only once. That's an exciting proposition for an event that has seen a lot of the same programs make it over and over again.

Here are the winners and losers from this week's final CFP rankings before the decisions are made for real Sunday.

WINNERS

• **Georgia:** The Bulldogs' work is (mostly) done. After finishing off a 12-0 regular season, they are going to be in the playoff regardless of what happens in the Southeastern Conference championship game. Of course, Georgia has plenty of incentive to go ahead and win the game. First and foremost, Georgia can deliver the final knockout blow to Alabama and not have to worry about facing the Crimson Tide again. There's also a lot of value for Georgia in making sure it gets the No. 1 seed and the preference of semifinal locations. If Oklahoma State or even Baylor is No. 4, Georgia would want to play in the Orange Bowl. If it's Cincinnati or Notre Dame, Dallas might be the preference. That may seem like a small thing, but Georgia wants to maximize every advantage it can as it pursues its first national title since 1980.

• **Michigan:** After the Wolverines' breakthrough win over Ohio State, they simply replaced the Buckeyes at No. 2. That means Michigan is probably going

to wearing the home uniforms in a semifinal game if it takes care of business this weekend in Indianapolis. Few could have seen this coming a year ago when it looked like Jim Harbaugh's tenure was spiraling toward a disappointing conclusion, but this is the reality of the situation: They're going to be favored in their next two games.

• **Ole Miss:** After beating Mississippi State in the Egg Bowl, the 10-2 Rebels looked like a lock for a New Year's Six game. That was confirmed when the committee ranked them No. 8, and with no chance of moving up or down more than a spot or two based on this week's results, they're for sure going to be above the cut line for either the Fiesta, Sugar or Peach bowls. That's a heck of a year for coach Lane Kiffin and quarterback Matt Corral – arguably the best in the modern history of the program.

LOSERS

• **Alabama:** The Crimson Tide remain at No. 3, but it feels like their window to actually make the playoff is getting narrower. When they debuted in the rankings at No. 2, the conventional wisdom was that Alabama could still make it with two losses if the SEC championship game against Georgia was

close. But Alabama's position seems even more tenuous than that after another shaky performance in last week's 24-22 four-overtime win over Auburn. It's hard to imagine that Alabama, no matter how competitive the SEC championship game is, would stay ahead of unbeaten Cincinnati after a second loss. Plus, Oklahoma State at No. 5 has upward mobility, too, if it beats No. 9 Baylor in the Big 12 title game. Alabama has already gotten some benefit of the doubt by staying at No. 3, but it's increasingly clear that beating Georgia is probably its only path to get in.

• **Notre Dame:** Brian Kelly's departure for LSU is a huge wrinkle for the committee to sort through should the Irish come back into play. The more immediate problem for Notre Dame is that its body of work is complete at 11-1 while being stuck at No. 6. The only way the Irish can move up is if teams ahead of them lose. If that happens, then the committee will have to discuss whether Kelly being gone diminishes Notre Dame's chances and whether someone like No. 7 Ohio State would be better.

• **Baylor:** The Bears have a chance to win the Big 12 title, but it's probably a bridge too far to get them in the playoff even in the most chaotic scenarios Saturday. Had the committee ranked them as high as No. 7 or No. 8, they might have had a chance of sneaking into the conversation. Instead, the committee moved Baylor down a spot after a closer-than-it-should-have-been 27-24 win over Texas Tech. If Baylor beats Oklahoma State, the Bears will leapfrog Ole Miss and probably Ohio State, but that might be as far as they get. On the flip side, if they lose convincingly, they could end up falling a bit – and potentially out of the New Year's Six conversation altogether.

Leading Tide's rally keeps Bryce Young at top

Michigan's drubbing of Ohio State means trouble for C.J. Stroud's odds of taking home the Heisman Trophy, which hit a new high after the Buckeyes' lopsided win against Michigan State.

He may not have been the top Heisman contender on the field in Saturday's loss. Instead, that honor may belong to Michigan defensive end Aidan Hutchinson, who had three sacks and countless quarterback pressures.

In a year when no one player has run away from the pack, there may be a chance for a defensive player to make real Heisman noise. Joining Hutchinson in that conversation is Georgia defensive tackle Jordan Davis.

But after leading Alabama to an overtime win against Auburn, second-year quarterback Bryce Young remains the player to beat in the Heisman chase. With one week left in the regular season, he tops the list of the best passers in the country.

1. Bryce Young, Alabama

He's still sitting at 40 touchdowns and just three interceptions for one of the best teams in the country. He struggled for about 58 minutes against Auburn and then delivered a touchdown drive that'll go down in Iron Bowl history to force overtime. Alabama's got a shot at beating Georgia and getting back into the playoff. A win against the Bulldogs locks down the Heisman for Young, and it may not be too close in the final voting.

2. Kenny Pickett, Pittsburgh

Pickett is also in play for his production and the Panthers' performance. With Pickett at the helm, Pittsburgh will reach the ACC championship game and play for a New Year's Six bowl bid. Breaking Dan Marino's single-season and career records is a nice selling point for his Heisman case.

3. C.J. Stroud, Ohio State

Last impressions matter, and while Stroud certainly can't be blamed for the Buckeyes' loss – he threw for 394 yards and two scores without an interception – that Ohio State was pushed around by Michigan could linger with voters. There's also the notion that Hutchinson could steal some of his thunder among voters inside the Big Ten footprint.

4. Desmond Ridder, Cincinnati

Ridder has a chance to cement his place alongside the best quarterbacks in Group of Five history by leading Cincinnati to one more win and a spot in the College Football Playoff. The American Athletic championship game against Houston will easily be Cincinnati's hardest test since Notre Dame. Ridder heads into Saturday having thrown multiple touchdowns in each of his last six games.

5. Matt Corral, Ole Miss

With an Egg Bowl win in the books and a New Year's Six trip ahead, Corral is close to ending his Ole Miss career

and heading into the NFL draft. The former five-star recruit has exploded under coach Lane Kiffin, shedding any thought that his recruiting hype was overblown to rank among the top passers in program history. (And there have been a few good ones to come through Oxford.) He's very likely a first-round pick and one of the top quarterbacks off the board this spring.

6. Carson Strong, Nevada

Strong ended the regular season with one of the best games of his career, completing 17 of 22 throws for 258 yards and four touchdowns as Nevada demolished Colorado State 52-10. This was the sixth time this year Strong has completed more than 70% of his throws and his sixth game with four or more scores, while his 13.1 yards per attempt set a career high.

7. Bailey Zappe, Western Kentucky

Zappe put up crooked numbers as Western Kentucky surged from a 1-4 start to the season to the Conference USA championship game. Most of that credit goes to Zappe and this pass-happy system, which was imported from Houston Baptist and yielded one of the top offenses in the country. With two games left, Zappe leads the Football Bowl Subdivision with 52 touchdowns and has a shot at breaking Joe Burrow's single-season record of 60 set in 2019.

8. Sam Hartman, Wake Forest

It's been a bit of a dodgy November

for Hartman as Wake Forest's schedule stiffened after a pretty smooth first two months. He came up big in Saturday's must-win conference game against Boston College, however, with 236 yards through the air, another 51 on the ground and four total touchdowns as the Demon Deacons clinched the Atlantic Coast Conference Atlantic Division and a spot opposite Pittsburgh to decide the conference championship.

9. Jake Haener, Fresno State

With his former coach, Kalen DeBoer, off to Washington, don't be surprised to see Haener follow suit and spend the 2022 season in the Pac-12. That would be a huge upgrade for the Huskies, who need competent quarterback play and will get one of the top players in the country. It would also send his career full circle: Haener signed with UW out of high school before transferring to Fresno State in 2019.

10. Hendon Hooker, Tennessee

Other options in this spot include Georgia's Stetson Bennett III, Virginia's Brennan Armstrong and UCLA's Dorian Thompson-Robinson. Picking Hooker reflects on his growth from backup quarterback to one of the most overlooked passers in the Power Five. As the centerpiece of Josh Heupel's offense, Hooker has nine games with multiple touchdowns, eight games with 200 or more yards and 10 games averaging at least 8.7 yards per attempt. Hooker has also helped Tennessee reach seven wins in Heupel's first season.

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NYCFC gives New York a title shot

MLS Cup: Big Apple team vs. Portland Timbers

Major League Soccer's 26th season will come to a close with Saturday's MLS Cup (3 p.m. ET, ABC and UniMás). For the third time in seven seasons, the Portland Timbers are in the league's championship game. However, this is the first time that the Timbers will host MLS Cup at their venerable home stadium, Providence Park, and in front of their famous supporters group, the Timbers Army. The Timbers won MLS Cup in 2015 in Columbus, Ohio, against the Crew but were defeated in the 2018 title game by Atlanta United.

New York City FC, which joined MLS as an expansion team in 2015, is appearing in its first MLS Cup.

Can the Timbers win a title on their home turf, or will NYCFC cap a remarkable postseason run with its first league championship?

Here is how USA TODAY Network experts see MLS Cup 2021 going down:

Pat Brennan, Cincinnati Enquirer: NYCFC 2, Portland 1. Portland has an obvious edge in hosting the 2021 MLS Cup final at Providence Park, but New York City FC regains a more important edge with the return of Valentin Castellanos, the best goal scorer who will be on the field for both teams. Prior to Castellanos' red card against New England Revolution in the Eastern Conference semifinals and subsequent suspension for the conference final win against Philadelphia Union, the 2021 Golden

Boot winner was in form with two play-off goals (versus Atlanta and New England). He'll be grateful to see competition again in the championship match after his suspension. NYCFC took out Philadelphia without Castellanos, so it's hard to imagine them getting knocked off from their title push with him back in

the fold. **Drake Hills, The Tennessean:** Portland Timbers 2, NYCFC 0. MLS Cup final experience and home-field advantage will play a big part in this outcome, but so will Felipe Mora. Portland's Chilean striker has 12 goals to his name this year and one can vividly envision Provi-

dence Park erupting in uncontrollable elation after a Mora goal to break the scoring deadlock. There's too much of a force from the Timbers, even though NYCFC's "Taty" Castellanos will be returning from his one-game suspension in the Eastern Conference final. Portland will get weird on Saturday and the Timbers will lift its second MLS Cup.

Jacob Myers, The Columbus Dispatch: NYCFC 2, Portland Timbers 1. Toward the end of their careers, what a send-off it would be for Diego Valeri and Sebastian Blanco to win MLS Cup on their home field. But I'm going with the upset on the belief that New York City has slightly better offensive firepower than Portland. This pick is somewhat of a bet that Valentin Castellanos comes back from a suspension with vengeance and will be the most dangerous man on the field. The city of New York gets its first major pro sports championship since 2011.

Jim Reineking, USA TODAY Sports: Portland Timbers 2, NYCFC 1. Let the Cascadia trash talk begin! With a victory Saturday, the Timbers would match their bitter archrivals, the Seattle Sounders, with two MLS Cup victories. The Timbers will enjoy as good a home-field advantage as any MLS Cup participant has enjoyed (Seattle in 2019 and Atlanta in 2018 also come to mind) at Providence Park and in front of the raucous Timbers Army. Not only will NYCFC have to contend with that, but the cross-country trip and third playoff game in 12 days are a big ask for a game of this magnitude.

FSU women celebrate 3rd soccer title

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — The wait was definitely worth it for the Florida State women's soccer team.

The Seminoles got a warm welcome home that was two years in the making Tuesday evening when they arrived back on campus. The Marching Chiefs and a large crowd of FSU fans awaited them after they won the program's third national championship Monday night in Santa Clara, California.

As FSU exited the bus in front of the Unconquered Statue led by team captain Jaelin Howell carrying the NCAA trophy, it was a moment of pure exultation from players, staff members and fans alike.

"Seeing all these fans supporting our team and our program, I don't know how you can ask for a whole lot more than that," FSU head coach Mark Krikorian said. "We as a team are grateful for the support that we have here in the community and the university as well."

Less than seven months earlier, the Seminoles fell in a penalty kick shootout to Santa Clara in the national championship match, coming up one win short of the first undefeated season in program history.

There was no undefeated season this time, but FSU avenged last season's demons this fall, finishing off a 22-1-2 season with a 4-3 penalty kick shootout win over BYU in the College Cup to bring home the program's third NCAA title, all of which have come since 2014.

"It never gets old, does it? It's a joy,"

FSU director of athletics David Coburn said of winning the title, which he said is FSU's 18th national title across all sports.

"I will say this: National championships are tough. They are hard to win in any sport, at any level. When you get to the Final Four, I don't care who you are, you're going to play some tough competition. This is a team that lost in the finals last year and came back and decided it wasn't going to happen again."

For Coburn, it's a fitting send-off as he nears retirement after three-plus years as FSU's AD. It's also an ending fitting the start to his tenure as the FSU soccer team won its second national title while he was still the interim AD in December 2018.

For new FSU President Richard McCollough, it was quite the introduction to FSU's championship pedigree

less than four months into his tenure in Tallahassee.

Over the last two seasons — a period that has included a COVID-19-affected season, the 2020 NCAA Tournament being pushed to spring of 2021 and a short offseason before the regularly scheduled 2021 season — the Seminoles have amassed a 35-2-4 record, two national title appearances and one NCAA championship.

"Like the rest of the Florida State family, we were on the edge of our seats. But we had no doubt that you'd bring home the title," McCullough said at the ceremony at FSU's Champions Club following the team's arrival.

"Coach Mark, you've built the best soccer program in the country and brought such prestige to Florida State University. To win three national titles in (eight) years is simply amazing."

Dating back to the start of this year's preseason camp, the Seminoles didn't shy away from discussing their season's goal of avenging the prior season's deflating ending.

"This made the aftermath of Monday's win for the Seminoles, who returned all but one player from that team that came up one win short, that much sweeter."

"We weren't gonna come back home this time without a trophy," Howell said. "It's the goal every year. It's the standard every year for this program. Especially since we did lose so close in the spring, it was in the back of our heads always. As we were meeting, as we were training, everyday we were working hard, it was always in the back of our heads."

Notre Dame men defying expectations

SOUTH BEND, Ind. — The Notre Dame men's soccer team has been defying expectations all season long.

It was picked to finish last in the Atlantic Coast Conference preseason poll. It was seeded fifth in the conference tournament, only to go on and win without allowing a goal in four games.

And Saturday, in its men's NCAA Tournament Elite Eight game at home against No. 5 Pittsburgh, Notre Dame battled back from a 1-0 deficit to win 2-1 in a penalty kick shootout, advancing to its first College Cup since 2013.

Time and time again this season, the Irish have exceeded whatever ceiling people outside of their locker room have placed over them.

"We had a chip on our shoulder, and that chip isn't going anywhere until we win the national championship," defender Paddy Burns said after the win.

That chip is headed to Cary, North Carolina, where No. 4 seed Notre Dame will play No. 8 Clemson. No. 3 Georgetown will play No. 2 Washington in the other semifinal.

Blowing a lead in the season opener to No. 2 Indiana. An overtime loss at Virginia Tech. Falling behind for the first time in the NCAA Tournament, but inside Notre Dame's locker room, there was a belief this season would end with the Irish determining their destiny, no matter what polls or pundits said.

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
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
