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

# K-State takeaways from loss against KU

The Kansas State men's basketball team was unable to keep up with the KU Jayhawks during a 90-78 loss on Tuesday at Allen Fieldhouse.

K-State battled hard until the end of the game, but KU was simply the better team in Round 2 of the Sunflower Showdown

this season. Jalen Wilson led the Jayhawks with 20 points and DaJuan Harris added 18. Markquis Nowell had 23 points for the Wildcats and Keyontae Johnson

ored 22. The Wildcats (18-4, 6-3 Big 12) have lost three straight road games in

straight road games in conference play and are now in a tie for second place in the league standings along with the Jayhawks (18-4, 6-8 big 12).
K-State has not defeated KU on the road since 2005.
The Wildcats will try bounce back in its next game on Saturday against Texas at Branlage Coliseum. Until then, here are some takeaways from Tuesday's action:

#### IEDOME TANG WISELY PICKED UP AN EARLY TECHNICAL FOUL

what happened midway through the first half in-side Allen Fieldhouse.

Shortly after junior forward Ismael Massoud was whistled for a foul while trying to defend KU guard DaJuan Harris, Tang had some words for John Higgins on the sideline. The Big 12 official didn't like what Tang was saying or how he wa saying it and quickly as-sessed the K-State coach

with a technical. That meant KU could nd Gradey Dick to the foul line for a pair of free throws in addition to the shots Harris was about to get. The Jayhawks capital ized by going on a quick 6-0 run that featured three free throws and a

Three KU players fouled out, and the Jayhawks were the opposite of versatile during the closing few minutes.

It was a much different story in the rematch. This time, Self used nine different players, and they all scored. Only one of them

scored fewer than five

scored fewer than five points. DaJuan Harris was particularly strong on his way to 18 points. Tang couldn't scheme up a way to slow down the balanced KU attack. Wil-son led all scorers with 20 points and the Jayhawks flirted with triple digits. K-State needed to play K-State needed to play much better on the defen sive end to have a chance in this game. 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# Payton sets the tone on Chiefs-Broncos rivalry on Day 1

Chiefs coach Andy Reid had nothing but good things to say about the Broncos' hiring of Sean

Payton as coach. Reid was asked at Opening Night festivities ahead of Super Bowl LVII about Payton, the former Saints coach, taking over

in Denver. "I think he is a great

football coach and he's coming into a great organization," Reid said. "He's good for the National Football League. And it's always good when Denver's good. So, that's gonna be a real plus."

Chiefs fans may not agree with Reid's asser-tion that it's good when the Broncos are playing well. The Chiefs have we well. The Chiefs have wor 15 straight games against the Broncos, and Denver hasn't made the playoffs since 2015 and hasn't finished above .500 since 2016. During that time, the

Chiefs have ruled the AFC West. While Reid welcomed

Payton to the AFC West. Payton made it clear from his first news conference Monday that he is not a fan of the Chiefs.

Payton was asked about

finishing up his work for Fox Sports during Super Bowl weekend, and he shared his plans for the network — and then made it clear he wants the Chiefs to lose Sunday.

"Tonight I'll be doing my
last bit of work for Fox and
then Saturday and Sunday,
so I'm kind of carrying two
lunch pails here," Payton
said. "I'm picking the Eagles. We never want anvone in our division to win anything, right? "The perfect weekend

for saying Broncos quar-terback Russell Wilson's personal coach won't be welcome at the team facil-ity. That coach is Jake Heaps, the former Kansas Jayhawks quarterback. "I'm not too familiar with that," Payton said when asked about Heaps

when asked about Heaps coming to the Bronco facility, per KSL Sports. "Yeah, that's foreign to me. That's not gonna take place here. I'm unfamiliar with it but our staff will be here, our players will be here, and that'll be it."

By the time he hired coach Andy Reid and, soon, general manager John Dorsey 10 years ago last month, Hunt already had fired three coaches and two general managers in his tenure. But if that was trial by

fire, or firing, as the ca may be, it was serving its purpose in forging Hunt's evolution.

"I think about that period frequently," he said.
"And I knew that we were going to have a tough time, because when I took over we had a very old roster and we had not drafted well for several years. So the cupboard was literally empty.
"And I'd like to second-guess myself that I should have done that. (But) I'm not sure it was correctable in those first few years, although there were definitely some decisions I wish I'd made differently."

In several ways and on multiple levels as Hunt practices moving forward.

Particularly after the chaos of the Scott Pioli regime as general manag-er, he reconciled to change the organizational flow chart and have both the GM and the coach report directly to him instead of the more traditional format of coach to

GM to owner. While Hunt didn't specify why he came to that specific decision, his an-swer Tuesday spoke volumes about it

"NFL teams that have the structure that we do (now) have a better (now) have a better chance of hiring a head coach who's a good fit with ownership, right?" he said. "Because in the other structure where that's been delegated to the general manager, there's a disconnect.

"And you also end up in

And you also end up in a scenario where the head coach wants to circumvent the general manager on some issues and go directly to the owner. And that undermines the relationship, as you can imagine, between the GM and the head coach." He added, "I'm much more informed about what's going on with the football team than I was under the other structure. Because in the other structure. Because in the other structure. Because in the other structure. Now he speaks to both Reid and GM Brett Veach on a weekly basis to get their independent perspectives. And if they're not on the same page, which he noted they "mostly are," then he's aware of it.

But another crucial way Hunt prospered by those painful years was esciding to change his persones in the hiring process itself. Instead of

process itself. Instead of just being "someone who's consulting and approving," he said, he wanted to "be the guy doing the interviews and making the decisions."

making the decisions."

Which brings us to a
Philadelphia-area airport
on Jan. 2, 2013, three days after Reid and the Eagles resolved to part ways after 14 seasons and Hunt had fired Romeo Crennel.

The interview between Reid and Hunt, along with several other Chiefs repre-sentatives, was scheduled

to last three or four hours. From the start, Hunt was hearing much that he liked — including that Reid would embrace the new structure despite having long also been the GM in Philadelphia and exercising strong control over personnel even after he'd put aside the title.

As the session went on and on and on, though, Hunt grew curious about a plane with its door open in plain view from the con-

plain view from the con-ference room.

At some point, he re-called saying, "I wonder what that is." And Reid replied along the lines of, "Yeah, I'm supposed to get on that plane. Or was supposed to get on that plane."

supposed to get on that plane."

The plane had been sent from Phoenix, where Reid initially had planned to go for an interview with the Arizona Cardinals.

While Hunt joked that he might have tried to prevent that rendezvous if he'd known, it turned out it would have been redundant: The conversation went on about nine hours with Reid, who somewhere along the way got word to the Cardinals that he was canceling.

"It was really just that the interview was going so

"It was really just that the interview was going so well and that we had so much to talk about," said Hunt, noting that this included Reid effectively flipping the script and interviewing Hunt. If they didn't quite

If they didn't quite come to a full agreement that day, Hunt said, "Both Andy and I left that meeting thinking that this was probably going to work out."

So it did ... after an interview that others who were there have said was all about Hunt's handling of the day. And it's also worked out

about ever since as Hunt has adapted. That's including replac-

ing Dorsey with Veach in 2017 and accepting Veach's inclination toward

2017 and accepting Veach's inclination toward the free-agent market 'more than I was accustomed to."

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### UPDATED PROPERTY TAX INFORMATION NOW AVAILABLE FOR TEXAS TAXPAYERS

Pittsburg-New and updated property tax information has just been compiled by Camp Central Appraisal District and is available now to assist taxpayers. This property tax information is current and covers a wide range of topics, such as taxpayer remedies, exemptions, appraisals, and has information for select groups, such as disabled veterans and persons who are 65 years of age

"Whether you are a homeowner, business owner, disabled veteran or a taxpayer, it's important you know your rights concerning the property tax laws" said Jan Tinsley, Chief Appraiser of the Camp Central Appraisal District. You can contact us about any property tax issues with full confidence that we will provide the most complete, accurate and up-to-date information available to assist you.

This includes information about the following programs.

Property Tax Exemption for Disabled Veterans - The law provides partial exemptions for any property owned by disabled veterans or surviving spouses and surviving children of deceased disabled veterans. Another partial exemption is for homesteads donated to disabled veterans by charitable organizations at no cost or not more than 50 percent of the good faith estimate of the homestead's market value to the disabled veterans and their surviving spouses. The exemption amount is determined according to percentage of service-connected disability. The law also provides a 100 percent exemption for 100 percent disabled veterans and their surviving spouses and for surviving spouses of U.S. armed service members killed or fatally

**Property Tax Exemptions** – Non-profit organizations that meet statutory requirements may seek property tax exemptions and must apply to their county appraisal district by a specific date. Businesses that receive tax abatements granted by taxing units; ship inventory out of Texas that may be eligible for the freeport exemption; store certain goods in transit in warehouses that are moved within 175 days; construct, install or acquire pollution control property; own and operate energy storage systems; convert landfill-generated gas; or store offshore drilling equipment while not in use may also be eligible for statutory exemptions.

Rendering Taxable Property – If a business owns tangible personal property that is used to produce income, the business must file a rendition with its local county appraisal district by a specified date. Personal property includes inventory and equipment used by a business. Owners do not have to render exempt property such as church property or an agriculture producer's equipment used for farming.

Appraisal Notices - Normally, taxpayers receive a notice of appraised value from the appropriate local appraisal district. The city, county, school districts and other local taxing units use the appraisal district's value to set property taxes for the coming year.

**Property Tax Remedies** – This Comptroller publication explains in detail how to protest a property appraisal, what issues the county appraisal review board (ARB) can consider and what to expect during a protest hearing. The publication also discusses the option to request limited binding arbitration to compel the ARB or chief appraiser to comply with a procedural

requirement and the options of taking a taxpayer's case to district court, the State Office of Administrative Hearings or binding arbitration if the taxpayer is dissatisfied with the outcome of the ARB hearing.

Homestead Exemptions – A homestead is generally defined as the home and land used as the owner's principal residence on Jan. 1 of the tax year. A person who acquires property after Jan. 1 may receive the residence homestead exemption for the applicable portion of that tax year immediately on qualification for the exemption if the preceding owner did not receive the same exemption for that tax year. A homestead exemption reduces the home's appraised value and, as a result, lowers property taxes. Applications are submitted to the appropriate local appraisal district

Productivity Appraisal – Property owners who use land for timber land production, agricultural purposes or wildlife management can be granted property tax relief on their land. They may apply to their local appraisal district for an agricultural special appraisal which may result in a lower appraisal of the land based on production, versus market value.

Residence Homestead Tax Deferral - Texas homeowners may postpone paying the currently delinquent property taxes due on the appreciating value of their homes by filing a tax deferral affidavit at their local appraisal district. This tax relief allows homeowners to pay the property taxes on 105 percent of the preceding year's appraised value of their homestead, plus the taxes on any new improvements to the homestead. The deferral postpones the remaining taxes, with interest accruing at 8 percent per year but does not cancel them.

Property Tax Deferral for Persons Age 65 or Older or Disabled or Disabled Veteran Homeowners – Texans who are age 65 or older or disabled, as defined by law, or who qualify for a disabled veteran exemption may postpone paying current and delinquent property taxes on their homes by signing a tax deferral affidavit. Once the affidavit is on file, taxes are deferred, but not cancelled, as long as the owner continues to own and live in the home. Interest continues to accrue at 5 percent per year on the unpaid taxes. You may obtain a deferral affidavit at the appraisal district.

Notice of Availability of Electronic Communication – In appraisal districts located in counties with a population of more than 200,000 or that have authorized electronic communications, and that have implemented a system that allows such communications, chief appraisers and ARBs may communicate electronically through email or other media with property owners or their designated representatives. Written agreements are required for notices and other documents to be delivered electronically instead of mailing.

**Protesting Property Appraisal Values** – Property owners who disagree with the appraisal district's appraisal of their property for local taxes or for any other action that adversely affects them may protest their property value to the appraisal district's ARB.

Informal Meetings-Property owners can request an informal meeting with appraisal district staff to try and resolve their disputes prior to attending ARB hearings.

# Hamlin starts CPR awareness campaign

Buffalo Bills safety Damar Hamlin is using his harrowing experience to raise awareness and money for CPR. In the process he's challenging three cultural titans to do the same. Hamlin announced Wednesday he is

partnering with the American Heart Association to launch the "#3forHeart CPR Challenge," a social media campaign in-tended to raise CPR education and training by challenging people on social platforms to participate. To initiate the campaign, Hamlin challenged NFL quarterback Tom Brady, who an-nounced his retirement earlier on Wednesday, former first lady Michelle Obama and Los Angeles Lakers star Le-Bron James in a message posted on his verified Twitter account.

"I'm excited to be teaming up with the American Heart Association," Hamlin said Wednesday in a news release. "It's

going to be an amazing opportunity to impact and educate millions of people

on the importance of CPR. It literally saved my life."

The challenge involves three steps. "The world watched in fear when Damar collapsed during that game,"

Nancy Brown, CEO of the American Heart Association, said in a news re-lease. "But if you follow his advice, you can become a lifesaver in 3 steps, and you'll know what to do in the event an adult or teen suddenly collapses in your presence. Because most cardiac arrests that happen outside of a hospital occur in the home, the life you save will most likely be a loved one. The volunteers, supporters and staff of the American Heart Association are so grateful that he is paying it forward and helping ensure others also have a better chance for a positive outcome."


One of the first comments Colin Kae-pernick made after his initial series of protests in 2016 was to Steve Wyche from the NFL Network.

"To me, this is big-ger than football and it would be selfish on my part to look the other way. There are bodies in the street and people get ting paid leave and getting away with murder."

That comment, and his continued protests, launched a thousand hateful ships, as the right wing, and even a

snips, as the ngnt wing, and even a president, spent years attacking him.

In the end, however, what we knew then, and especially know now, is that Kaepernick wasn't just right, he was prescient. What happened in the vears that followed were numerous incidents of police brutality against

Most recently, of course, came the horrific beating of Tyre Nichols, which led to Nichols' death and five police officers being charged with murder.

That fact has been at the core of Kae pernick's message throughout the years: injustice toward one group of Americans hurts us all.

Americans hurts us all.
"How can you stand for the national anthem of a nation that preaches and propagates, freedom and justice for all," he once said, "that is so unjust to so many of the people living there?"

Bassino earned her second gold medal at the world championships after sharing victory with Austrian skier Katharina Liensberger in the parallel event at her home worlds two years ago.

She became the second Italian skier to win the women's super-G world title. Isolde Kostner won back-to-back golds in the mid-1990s, while Deborah Compagnoni won the Olympic super-G title in Meribel at the 1992 Albertville Games.

Bassino has yet to win a super-G on
the World Cup circuit but did finish third
in two races in January.
"I'm speechless. It's my first win in
super-G, and here at the world champi-

onships. It is something I have to realize," Bassino said. "Today I just did a great last part because I lost a lot of time

watching all the other girls coming down. I'm really happy and confident in myself. It's really a great result for me."

"I had everything right in my head,"
Bassino said. "I'm really happy. The gold
in parallel two years ago was nice, but
today it's something extra, something
bigger. It's incredible. I'm really happy with myself and at the same time amazed that I did the race so well."

Shiffrin said she expected Bassino to do well after seeing her shortly before

the race "I could see her in the start she looked in the right zone," Shiffrin said. "I could see she has the flow and I (was)

like, 'Now I have to focus on myself and stop looking at Marta.' "Shiffrin, who won super-G gold in 2019 and bronze two years ago, led Bas-sino by three-tenths of a second at the second split but couldn't match the Italian's pace in the last part of the course and finished second, 0.11 seconds be-

Cornelia Huetter of Austria and Kajsa Vickhoff Lie of Norway tied for third, 0.33 seconds behind, to share the bronze medal.

"I'm so happy with my run, and emo-tional, because I don't really feel like I

should be winning a medal in super-G right now. There are so many women so strong and so fast," Shiffrin said.

"There was one moment where I thought I lost everything but then I

thought I lost everything but then I could keep it rolling until the finish."

The silver is Shiffrin's 12th medal in 15 career world championship races, giving her outright second place on the all-time list for the most medals won by a woman at the worlds, trailing only Ger man skier Christl Cranz, who won 15 in

Shiffrin had been heading for a pos-sible medal in the combined event on Monday before straddling the third-to-

Monday before stradding the third-to-last gate in the slalom portion.

"I felt like I learned from the com-bined that I have to be much more ag-gressive with my skiing and with my tactics," said Shiffrin, who was sixth in

tactics, said shiftin, who was sixth in Monday's super-G run.

"Also, this hill is difficult and it deserves respect for the terrain. You have to push the limit but if you go over the limit, it's even worse. So I was trying to

himt, it's even worse. So I was trying to be really strong, really aggressive and just also a little bit smart." Shiffrin has I wins on the World Cup circuit this season to take her overall tal-ly to 85 – breaking Lindsey Vom's women's record of 82 and moving within one of the overall mark set by Ingemar Sten-

mark in the 1970s and '80s.

Many pre-race favorites, including defending and Olympic champion Lara Gut-Behrami and Swiss teammate Corinne Suter, led Bassino by several tenths of a second before losing substantial time in the technically demand-ing middle section of the course, which was partly shadowed.

# Dawn Staley claps back at Geno Auriemma's criticism

COLUMBIA, S.C. – South Carolina women's basketball coach Dawn Staley called out UConn coach Geno Auriemma on Tuesday for comments the Huskies coach made about the Gamecocks play style after their 81-77 win in Con

play style after their 81-77 win in Con-necticut on Sunday. Auriemma received a technical foul in the rivalry game for throwing a water bottle onto the court as he shouted at officials for a decision he disagreed with in

the fourth quarter.

After the game, Auriemma repeatedly criticized South Carolina's physical playing style and the lack of calls that the Gamecocks received.

"I just couldn't keep quiet any longer. The technical was stupid, but I didn't say anything for a long, long, long time," Auriemma said. "If you want to bring Lou (Lopez Senechal) in and you can see the bruises on her body. It's just appalling what teams do to her now.

"It's not basketball anymore. I don't know what it is, but it's not basketball."

During the game, 44 fouls were During the game, 44 rouls were called: 23 against UConn and 21 against South Carolina. It was the most fouls that had been called against the Gamecocks in any game this season.

Staley was heated in her response on

her radio call-in show Tuesday and expressed frustration with her team's ac-

resear fusitation with the team's ac-complishments being invalidated. "Every time that we're successful, we're called something other than play-ers that are locked in," Staley said. "They

play the right way and approach it the right way whether they win or lose. We don't denounce anybody's play. They aont denounce anybody's play. They are always uplifting the game of wom-en's basketball, and when we were get-ting our heads beat in by UConn for all those years, I said nothing." The Gamecocks' victory over UConn

The Gamecocks victory over Ucolin was the first in program history on the Huskies' home court. South Carolina has now won four of the last five meetings in the series after losing the first eight from 2007 to 2019. The Gamecocks also beat UConn last season in the

NCAA championship game. Staley was also angered by Auriemma's comments because of their connoma's comments because of their conno-tation toward a majority-Black team led by a Black head coach. She referenced comments made on a UConn fan page on Facebook earlier this season that called the Gamecocks "thugs," as well as a post on Twitter by an LSU fan two a post on Twitter by an LSU fan two weeks ago that compared them to in-mates at a men's prison. "We've been called so many things and I'm sick of it. I'm sick of it because I coach some of the best human beings

that the game has ever had," Staley said "We've been called thugs. We've been called prisoners. We've been called

"We take this very seriously being the No.1 team in the country, being a team that young people look at and want to

that young people look at and want to emulate. We set the example of how you do it and do it the right way. "I am not going to stand down when you're going to denounce how we play, because you're denouncing our national because you're denouncing our national championship. You're denouncing the product that we put up on the floor. You're denouncing families. You're denouncing our achievements, and i'm not going to stand by and allow people just

The Gamecocks coach addressed the comment that Lopez-Senechal had "bruises," noting that the game was physical on both sides.

South Carolina star Aliyah Boston faced double- and triple-teams nearly every time she held the ball in the paint,

every time she held the ball in the paint, as did center Kamilla Cardoso. "When you say it's not basketball, when you say your player has bruises on her body, our entire post players if we ner body, our entire post piagvers if we unclothed them, you will see the bruises," Staley said. "We play in the SEC, and that's how we play and we're not going to change it."

The No.1Gamecocks (23-0,12-0 SEC)

are back in action at Auburn (13-9, 3-7) on Thursday, and the attention will then turn to another highly anticipated matchup against No. 2 LSU (23-0, 13-0) in front of a sold-out crowd at Colonial Life Arena on Sunday (2 p.m. ET, ESPN)
