

I, the undersigned Secretary of the Florida Parishes Juvenile Justice Commission, acting as the governing authority (the "Governing Authority") of the Florida Parishes Juvenile Justice District, do hereby certify that the foregoing constitutes a true and correct copy of a Resolution adopted by the Governing Authority on December 18, 2023, ordering and calling a special election to be held in the Florida Parishes Juvenile Justice District (the "District"), on Saturday, April 27, 2024, for the purpose of authorizing the extension of the levy of the tax authorized to be levied through the year 2025 pursuant to an election held on April 9, 2016 (the "Tax"), at a rate of three (3) mills on all property subject to taxation within the District, for an additional ten (10) years to run from the year 2023 and ending with the year 2036, and further authorizing to dedication of the use of proceeds of the Tax, heretofore or hereafter received, for the purposes authorized by the District's enabling legislation, including assisting and affording opportunities to children who enter the juvenile justice system or who need care or supervision, to become productive, law-abiding citizens by establishing rehabilitative programs within structured environments, providing physical facilities and related services for children throughout the District, and for improving, maintaining and operating the Florida Parishes Juvenile Detention Center and acquiring, maintaining and operating necessary equipment and furnishings for said Center; making application to the Louisiana State Bond Commission; and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

The polling places set forth above and situated in the District, be and the same are hereby designated as the polling places at which to hold the special election, and the Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners, respectively, shall be those persons designated according to law.

A portion of the monies collected from the tax described herein shall be remitted to certain State and statewide retirement systems in accordance with the provisions of Subchapter 1 of Title 11 of Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (La. Rev. Stat. § 11:82).

In accordance with La. Rev. Stat. § 18:285(A)(1)(a)(v), the estimated cost of holding the election will be \$508,000.00.

The special election will be held in accordance with the applicable provisions of Chapter 5 and Chapter 6-A of Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority as applicable thereto, and the officers appointed to hold the election, or such substitutes therefor as may be selected and designated in compliance with the law, will make due returns thereof to the District, and NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that the Governing Authority will meet on Monday, May 20, 2024 at 4:30 p.m. at Florida Parishes Detention Center, 28528 U.S. Highway 190, Covington, Louisiana, and will then and there, open and public session, proceed to examine and canvass the returns and declare the result of the special election. All registered voters residing in the District are entitled to vote at the special election and voting machines will be used in connection therewith.

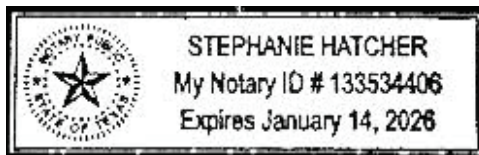

KU basketball coach Bill Self is resting starters this week

Kansas basketball coach Bill Self has resisted any temptation to hold two-a-day or even three-a-day practices this week, despite the fact the NCAA allows unlimited practice time between the fall and spring semesters before the spring semester begins at KU on Jan. 16.

"We don't have any hour restrictions. We can practice as much as we want. That includes weights and we'll do a little more of that," Self said Tuesday night on his weekly Hawk Talk radio show. The Jayhawks, who are coming off an 86-67 victory over Wichita State on Dec. 30 at T-Mobile Center, have been preparing this week for their Big 12 opener against TCU on Saturday.

"When you are playing four guys as many minutes as we have, it sounds great in theory that we could be

going two-a-days and all that stuff. All that will do is be counterproductive because you are wearing out your guys who are playing a majority of minutes," he added.

Senior Dajuan Harris averages a team-leading 35.1 minutes a game, followed by senior Kevin McCullar (34.2), senior Hunter Dickinson (32.0)

and junior KJ Adams (31.5). KU's fifth starter, freshman guard Elmarko Jackson, averages 23.4.

"We usually start (second semester) around the 15th. It's the same this year," Self said. "We get a long break. That's a long time to be able to do some different things. This is a good week for us. We could practice two days,

take tomorrow off, practice two days then play again. Starting Saturday we play two games a week the rest of the year, so there are no more breaks."

For the past several seasons, teams had a break in the league schedule in order to play a late-January game in the Big 12/SEC Challenge, which no longer exists.

"I assume it's one of the reasons why the conference is starting later," Self said. "When you are playing 18 league games, what the coaches decided to do is forfeit the bye week. We decided to start the season later as opposed to Jan. 31 and have a bye week. All the coaches decided to cram 18 games into nine weeks as opposed to 10 weeks (followed by the Big 12 tourney)."

Self said since the WSU game the Jayhawks have "been OK. Today wasn't a break. We've practiced pretty well. Attitudes are great. Guys seem to be liking each other. This is a hard time for kids to be here. They look forward to practice because that's the only thing they've got going all day. No other students are here. Not going to school. ... It's a difficult time to be on a

college campus when nobody else is around."

As usual, four of KU's starters played 30 or more minutes in last Saturday's rout of WSU.

"Elmarko would have played a few more minutes, but he got two quick fouls to start the game so he played 10 (actually 11) minutes the first half," Self said of Jackson, who scored a career-high 12 points on 5-of-10 shooting. He hit two 3s with two assists, two turnovers, two rebounds with one steal.

"I think he is getting better defensively. Defense is where he can help us in a lot of ways," Self added of the 6-foot-3 McDonald's All-American from Marlton, New Jersey.

He scored seven straight points to help bust open a 14-14 game Saturday.

"He's got to play to his athletic ability and he'll continue to do that," Self said. Jackson in that seven-point flurry accepted a pass from Harris and without dribbling soared in for a slam dunk.

KU had many stars versus the Shockers. Forward KJ Adams had a career-high 11 rebounds (eight defensive) and center Hunter Dickinson had 22 points and 13 re-

bounds (eight defensive) with three steals and four assists.

"The guy can just get numbers," Self said of Dickinson, who played 30 minutes. "He had 22. I thought he should have had 30. He was 10-of-17 shooting. The seven he missed are seven shots he can make and will make more consistently probably."

Of Adams, Self said: "I like when he gets it and brings it. When he rebounds, he knows he should bring it. He's becoming more versatile all the time. He's developing into a really nice player. ... Nobody in the country is more athletic."

No. 2-ranked KU will enter its Big 12 opener Saturday with a 12-1 record. TCU, which is unranked, is 11-2.

Former KU backup center Ernest Udeh has started all 13 games for the Horned Frogs. He has averaged 4.4 points and 5.4 rebounds but scored 13 points with 18 rebounds in TCU's last game, a 77-42 victory over Texas A&M Commerce on Monday in Fort Worth.

K-State's Ques Glover may miss season after latest injury

Ques Glover is back to where he started. After missing the first 12 games of the season with a knee injury, the transfer guard was supposed to make his Kansas State debut when the Wildcats defeated Chicago State 62-55 on Tuesday at Bramlage Coliseum. But things didn't work out that way.

Instead, Glover suffered another setback in practice this week and the 6-foot senior was forced to hobble around the arena on crutches and continue watching from the sideline.

K-State coach Jerome Tang struggled to explain the amount of bad luck and unfortunate timing

involved with that development, calling it "a tough, tough break."

"I don't know if it was a misstep or a bump or whatever," Tang said. "It was just one of those freak things. It's the same knee, the same issue. I just feel so hurt for him, because he put in so much work in rehab."

Tang doesn't know exactly how long it will take Glover to recover from this injury, but he fears that it is season-ending.

"We have this rule on our staff about no bad news on game day," Tang said. "So they haven't given me the whole thing. But I knew it was bad news because nobody would tell me what the MRI said. So just walking up here, I was told that it's possible he will need surgery. But they didn't give

me the whole details of everything yet."

If Glover is, indeed, out for the remainder of the season, then the Wildcats (10-3) will have lost two players they were expecting big minutes from at the start of the year.

Nate Owan Tomlin transferred to Memphis after he was dismissed from the K-State basketball roster following a much-publicized arrest and suspension. Now Glover might not be able to suit up for the Wildcats, either.

K-State coaches had hoped that they could add reinforcements for the start of Big 12 play, which begins with a home game on Saturday against UCF. Glover is a senior guard who transferred to K-State after previously spending time at Florida and Samford. He averaged double digits in each of the past two seasons with the Bulldogs. His mixture of experience and talent could have given the Wildcats a major boost.

Tang saw it in practice during the brief time that Glover was healthy.

"Man, we had a full team out there at practice," Tang said. "It looked pretty good. We worked on some things that we can do with two veteran guards out there that you can't do when you don't have the guard depth. It looked pretty good for three-and-a-half days."

Tang was so worried about the possibility of Glover re-aggravating his injury that he held him out of K-State's previous two games even though he was deemed healthy enough to play.

Unfortunately, that extra caution didn't help. "I'm glad we took as

much as we did to bring him back," Tang said. "He could have been back two weeks ago. But had we rushed him and this happened, we would have been sitting around think-

ing we rushed him back. We gave him every opportunity for that thing to heal. For some reason it didn't or something else happened. Now it's on to the next thing: What's the

next thing he can do and what's the next thing we can do?"

from 3-point range. They have quality outside shooters in Perry, Carter and Kaluma. All three of them are capable of erupting from beyond the arc on any given night, but that isn't happening right now.

K-State entered this game shooting just 30.4% from 3-point range and didn't do anything to improve that statistic while making 3 of 14 shots from downtown against Chicago State.

Outside shooting was supposed to be a strength for this group. Right now it's a weakness.

That needs to change if the Wildcats are going to compete for a spot in the NCAA Tournament or high finish in the Big 12 standings.

BAD INJURY LUCK FOR SENIOR GUARD QUES GLOVER

For weeks, K-State had this game circled as the long-awaited debut for senior guard Ques Glover. The transfer guard, who came to K-State after stops at Florida and Samford, missed the first 12 games of the season with a lower-body injury, but he was supposed to return to the court at full strength against Chicago State.

Things didn't pan out that way. Glover once again watched this game from the sideline, as he was spotted hobbling around the arena on crutches during warmups.

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K-State made winning look easy against West Virginia

Kansas State basketball fans are allowed to start dreaming about what the rest of the season holds for the Wildcats.

There's no such thing as an easy game in the Big 12, but K-State has made things look well, easy in its first two conference matchups of the year.

The Wildcats pulled away from West Virginia for an 81-67 victory on Tuesday at WVU Coliseum that once again showed their potential moving forward. More importantly, they remained undefeated in league play.

K-State (12-3, 2-0 Big 12) started off the conference season by trouncing UCF 77-52 and then it followed that up by going on the road and defeating West Virginia by double digits.

It's worth pointing out that West Virginia (5-10) and UCF may be the worst two teams in the Big 12. But K-State took care of business against both of them and now finds itself in an enviable position at the top of the conference standings.

The Wildcats once again looked like a NCAA Tournament team on Tuesday behind a game-high 23 points from Cam Carter. The junior guard put his team on his back in the second half and made one big play after another to make sure the Mountaineers were unable to mount a comeback. He was at his best when he drove at the rim, as he connected on 5 of 8 shots within the arc and also made all 10 of his free-throw attempts.

But he also got help from David N'Guessan (17 points, seven rebounds) and Arthur Kaluma (17 points, three rebounds) on the inside.

Rae'Quan Battle led West Virginia with 21 points. K-State coach Jerome Tang and the Wildcats will try to continue their conference winning streak when they return to the court on Saturday at Texas Tech.

Until then, here are some takeaways on the victory over West Virginia:

CAM CARTER STEPPED UP BIG FOR K-STATE
The final score might make it look like the Wild-

cats earned a stress-free victory over the Mountaineers, but there were plenty of times when K-State encountered trouble on Tuesday.

West Virginia led at halftime and stayed within striking distance for much of the second half, until Carter put the game out of reach.

The K-State guard gave West Virginia's defense all kinds of problems as he scored on dunks, driving layups, 3-pointers and a whole bunch of free throws.

When he wasn't scoring, he found other ways to help his teammates. Carter also finished with four assists and three rebounds.

This was the best Carter has looked against a power-conference opponent. He demanded the ball in important situations and he responded by playing like a go-to scorer.

Maybe a game like this will help him build confidence as the season continues.

K-STATE COMMITTED TOO MANY SILLY FOULS IN THE FIRST HALF

The Wildcats made 60% of their shots in the first half and outplayed the Mountaineers in most statistical areas in the opening 20 minutes of this game, but they went into halftime trailing 42-40.

Why? They couldn't stop committing silly fouls.

Some will argue that the officiating crew in Morgantown blessed the home team with a friendly whistle, as K-State was called for a plethora of touch fouls that could have easily been ignored in other arenas. But that doesn't change the fact that the Wildcats fouled WVU shooters four different times while they were attempting 3-pointers or that David N'Guessan got hit with a technical foul for touching Kerr Kriisa with his forearm during a dead ball situation.

Did we mention that all of those fouls happened in

the first half? Or that the Mountaineers made 12 of 14 free throws in the opening period?

K-State players flashed looks of disbelief after every call.

Tang was also visibly frustrated on the sideline after all of those calls went against K-State, and he deserved to be. The Wildcats were on the wrong end of five costly fouls in the first half and they come up with big plays in the second half on his way to 17 points, three rebounds and two assists. Best of all, he finished with only two fouls.

Tang showed trust in Kaluma and that turned out to be a good coaching decision.

STEP IN THE WRONG DIRECTION FOR TYLOR PERRY

K-State point guard Tylor Perry seemed to find his top form over the weekend when he erupted for six 3-pointers and a season-high 25 points during a dominant victory over UCF.

Some hoped he would be able to build off that with another strong effort against West Virginia and then enter the heart of conference play with all kinds of confidence. Better days may still be on the way, but this was not one of them.

Perry only scored six points against the Mountaineers. Making matters worse, he missed on one of his six attempts from the field. West Virginia made life difficult on him with a myriad of defensive looks. He struggled from start to finish.

ARTHUR KALUMA SURVIVES FOUL TROUBLE

It looked like K-State wing Arthur Kaluma was going to be in for a long night when he committed a pair of early fouls and was pulled from the game with foul trouble.

But he didn't let that stop him from putting up an impressive stat line.

Kaluma went on to play in the first half and then come up with big plays in the second half on his way to 17 points, three rebounds and two assists. Best of all, he finished with only two fouls.

Tang showed trust in Kaluma and that turned out to be a good coaching decision.

DAVID N'GUESSAN HITTING HIS STRIDE INSIDE

Not long ago, K-State forward David N'Guessan was stuck in a scoring slump that left some wondering how much he could help the Wildcats on offense.

Those days are beginning to feel like a long way away, as he scored 17 points and grabbed seven rebounds against West Virginia. That performance comes after he put up five points and 14 rebounds against UCF, 12 points and nine rebounds against Chicago State and 13 points and nine rebounds against Wichita State.

In other words, he has played four straight strong games for the Wildcats.

factor in Andonovski's decision to keep him on staff.

"He has grown into an incredible coach," Andonovski said. "He is very meticulous in the way he does things, especially with the technical nature. He's a big asset to the staff."

Ljupco "Raki" Kmetovski

Kmetovski, who goes by Raki (pronounced rock-ee), had been the goalkeeper coach with OL Reign (who changed their name back to Seattle Reign on Tuesday) since 2017, when Andonovski brought him stateside from their native country of North Macedonia. Kmetovski was the goalkeeping coordinator for the Macedonian Football Association before his move stateside.

Andonovski hailed his work with goalkeepers like Casey Murphy, a veteran who has taken it to the next level in recent years, and Phallon Tullis-Joyce, a young goalkeeper who excelled and moved to Manchester United this summer.

Kmetovski sees the goalkeeper team as one to be excited about with AD Franch, a skilled veteran, and Jordan Silkowitz, who has been exceptional on loan in Australia this winter.

THE KC CURRENT'S VISION

When asked about the Current's vision in 2024, each coach had a different word to collectively paint the picture.

"Competitiveness," Ivanovic said. "Something that this city has been: It's been a competitive city in every way you look.

Ivanovic added that flair should also be expected. Coombe piggybacked on that idea of being a team that plays attractive soccer "but with a discipline to the way in which they're gonna play."

Rodriguez added hard work and discipline to the mix.

These traits or principles align with Andonovski's longtime philosophy of "warriors and artists." A team, in Andonovski's

opinion, needs a mix of both. The "warriors" provide the structure and the solid foundation that allow the "artists" and the creative forces to have freedom.

Highlighting the talent of Debinha, Michelle Cooper, and new signing Temwa Chawinga, Andonovski said the staff has let those players be themselves.

"In a way, we have to accept that they are who they are, and they're the best when they're free," Andonovski said. "So we have to allow them to expose their creativity to be themselves. But we, as a staff and as a team, we've gotta create the framework (in which they can thrive)."

Andonovski's comments are similar to an old jazz adage: *You can play anything, but you can't play just anything.*

Freedom within form is how Andonovski is convinced he can get the best out of some of the team's most powerful creative forces.

"We create the framework," Andonovski said. "And within the framework, OK, be yourself."

WHO ARE THE WARRIORS?

An example Andonovski gave for the "warriors" was a player like Desiree Scott, who can win the ball with a well-timed tackle in the midfield and play the right pass to spring Debinha or Cooper into a position to create a chance.

There's just one problem: That type of player isn't on the roster ... yet.

The Current roster has midfield players like Morgan Gautrat and Lo LaBonta, who can be that type of player in the middle but also be "artists" with a different stroke of genius. But after the trade of Alex Loera, there's an empty hole in the roster for a pure defensive midfielder, an added "warrior" on the field outside of the defenders.

Andonovski told The Star the club is working to get a few more deals over the line, including the return of Desiree Scott

after she missed all of 2023 through injury.

"Hopefully we have Desi come back," Andonovski said. "She is one of those (players who) would be a true example of what a 'warrior' in the middle needs to look like."

Andonovski also hinted at a couple more signings, one from within the league and another, an American who had been playing abroad. The Current could also add through the upcoming NWSL Draft.



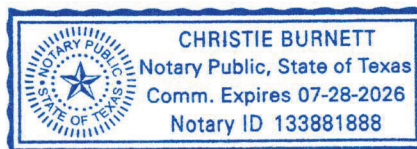

The inspiration behind Chavarria

Chavarria says his "own culture has very much inspired me" in creating his fashion brand.

"It's been just intuitive for me to take elements of Mexican and Mexican American culture and make that a part of my design philosophy, and integrate the people that have inspired me — so Mexican American people — into my work. And on my team and my extended creative family, there's a lot of Latin American people working together.

"When I first started my brand, and even now, it's a mission of mine to show the many different facets of beauty that exist. I had never seen the type of people that I cast on the runway, or I'd never seen the type of people that I use for editorials, or just modeling and branding. So it's important for me to show Latinos and see ourselves in the public eye in a very beautiful and elevated way."

Chavarria's drink to celebrate — and his go-to gift

Chavarria, who has partnered with Tequila Don Julio for the brand's global "Por Amor" campaign, keeps his drink of choice simple.

"I love (Don Julio) 1942 on the rocks, that's my jam." He says of the premium tequila. "It's like the perfect combo for all of these amazing events that have been happening. We had the Latin American Fashion Awards, we had the CFDA Awards, we had my runway show that was an incredible moment in the brand history. So all of these really

Chavarria is a "huge fan of the blazer or the sport jacket."

"That's one of my favorite things to design as well. I feel like it can make you feel very strong in any situation. But it can also just kind of add like an elegance to any look. So I will throw on a great sport jacket with sweatpants and loafers, or I will throw it on with like ratty jeans and like 3-, 4-inch high heeled boots or a suit. I feel like the sport jacket is like the most iconic piece for me. It's just that magic little piece you can throw on and pull it all together."

Which celebrity would Willy Chavarria like to dress?

Though he's dressed top names in

entertainment (and had them walk his runway), one superstar is still on his list: "I feel like I need to dress Usher."

"For some reason, I just think that he would look really good in Willy Chavarria," he says, getting excited at the prospect of being part of Usher's Super Bowl halftime show rollout. "I'm going to make that happen."

Chavarria's daily self-care process and bedtime mantra

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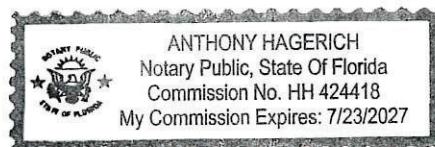

SEC headlines winners, losers this bowl season

There's only one game before the off-season: Michigan will face Washington in Monday's College Football Playoff national championship game.

This was a big postseason for the Wolverines, who finally got over the hump in the playoff by topping Alabama in the Rose Bowl and will have the chance to capture the program's first unshared national title since 1948.

In the second semifinal, Washington got past Texas thanks to a memorable night from senior quarterback Michael Penix Jr., the game's offensive MVP.

While the Crimson Tide came up short, this was a pretty positive bowl season for the SEC. Georgia, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Missouri captured wins against the Power Five, with the Bulldogs bouncing back from their first loss in two years to post a 60-point win against Florida State.

These teams are the biggest winners and losers from the bowl season:

WINNERS

Michigan

After two playoff losses in a row to Georgia and TCU, Michigan took a big step forward as a program with a 27-20 overtime win against Alabama in the Rose Bowl. The second OT game in playoff semifinal history ended with a puzzling call: Alabama running quarterback Jalen Milroe right into the teeth of the Michigan defense on fourth-and-goal. That stop tells the story of the entire season for the Wolverines, who have been the more physical and aggressive opponent in marquee wins against Penn State, Ohio State and the Tide.

Washington

The Sugar Bowl win against the Longhorns answered any lingering questions about Washington's ability to match the standard of physicality set by the other three teams in this year's playoff. And the Huskies can add to that some elite quarterback play: Penix was outstanding against Texas, as was his deep and experienced receiver corps. While slight underdogs heading into the matchup with the Wolverines, the Huskies are clearly built to win one more game and bring a national championship back to the Pac-12 before the league closes up shop.

Tennessee

The Volunteers were given an early glimpse of the future under young quarterback Nico Iamaleava in a 35-0 romp of Iowa in the Citrus Bowl. Making his first career start, the former five-star recruit completed 12 of 19 attempts for 151 yards and a touchdown while adding three scores on the ground. Overall, Tennessee's 383 yards of offense were

the second most Iowa had allowed all season, trailing the 397 yards put up Penn State in late September.

Ole Miss

The Ole Miss hype train is ready to leave the station after a 38-25 win against Penn State in the Peach Bowl. Somewhat dismissed all year long for falling well short in key games against Alabama and Georgia, the win validates the Rebels' progression under Lane Kiffin and, along with the arrival of the nation's top transfer class, builds some major momentum for including Ole Miss among the top teams in the SEC entering the 2024 season. With quarterback Jaxson Dart set to return, you can see why the bandwagon could fill up.

Missouri

Held in check by Ohio State's defense until the final drive of the third quarter, Missouri put together two scoring drives of at least 90 yards in the last 20 minutes to beat the Buckeyes 14-3 in the Cotton Bowl. With wide receiver Luther Burden held mostly in check until a late TD, the Tigers' offense continued to lean heavily on All-America running back Cody Schrader, who finished with 29 carries for 128 yards and a score. Missouri went 11-2 in this breakout season under coach Eli Drinkwitz and should finish in the top seven of the final US LBM Coaches Poll.

Kansas

A nine-win season for Kansas? The program continues to skyrocket under coach Lance Leipold, who inherited the worst program in the Power Five by a huge margin but has turned the Jayhawks into one of the top teams in the new-look Big 12. As expected, Kansas took home an offensive shootout in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl against UNLV, drawing 449 passing yards and six TDs from Jason Bean and 591 yards of of-

fense overall to win 49-36.

Northwestern

What a year it was for Northwestern, which hit on one of the program's all-time low points during the summer's hazing scandal but managed to win eight games under new coach David Braun. That included a 14-7 win in the Las Vegas Bowl against Utah, which was hurting for offensive playmakers and finished with only 211 yards and three turnovers.

LOSERS

Alabama

Up 17-13 and driving with under five minutes left in the fourth quarter, Alabama squandered a chance to put the Wolverines away and had to settle for a 52-yard field goal. That opened the door for Michigan to tie the score with 1:34 remaining in regulation and then win it in one extra frame thanks to Blake Corum's 17-yard score and the defensive stop. While both teams made mistakes, the Tide were the ones who came up short in a rare semifinal loss for Nick Saban. In the end, Alabama should be applauded for reaching this point after such a sluggish start in September but wasn't quite constructed to capture the national title.

Texas

Washington held possession for over 36 minutes and prevented the Texas offense from getting into a rhythm. Still, you have to wonder why the Longhorns didn't make a firmer commitment to the running game given their consistent success on the ground. In the end, the difference between going home and advancing to the title game was turnovers; Texas didn't do a good job protecting the football and paid the price. This is a program on the rise under Steve Sarkisian.

Ohio State

Playing without former starting quarterback Kyle McCord and star wide receiver Marvin Harrison — and then without McCord's replacement, Devin Brown, who suffered an ankle injury in the second quarter — Ohio State managed just 203 yards of offense in the 14-3 loss to Missouri. With McCord now at Syracuse and Harrison off to the NFL, there are some big questions about the state of this offense heading into next season. The loss is coach Ryan Day's fourth in six postseason games.

Florida State

FSU was playing without anywhere close to a full deck of players after losing dozens to the opt-outs and the transfer portal, quickly turning this into the ugliest result of the bowl season. Georgia's 63-3 destruction of the Seminoles in the

Orange Bowl reinforces the Bulldogs' place as perhaps the team to beat heading into 2024. How you view the loss from FSU's perspective might depend on how you viewed the makeup of the four-team playoff: If you thought the 'Noles never deserved to be there, here's a tidy, 60-point loss as evidence. But if you believed that FSU should've been in the top four as the third unbeaten team in the FBS, it's easy to look at the depleted roster and call the bowl matchup an incomplete representation of the Seminoles' season.

Auburn

After losing 31-13 to Maryland in the Music City Bowl, Auburn coach Hugh Freeze admitted he "didn't get too involved" in the Tigers' offensive game plan "because recruiting." This may be true, but the public admission makes you wonder: At a salary of \$6.5 million a year, can't Freeze coach and recruit at the same time?

Miami (Fla.)

It's been a year for Miami. On one hand, the Hurricanes beat Texas A&M and Clemson on the way to bowl eligibility after finishing with a losing record in Mario Cristobal's debut season. On the other hand, they lost 31-24 to Rutgers in the Pinstripe Bowl. This completed a late-season swoon of four losses in five games for Miami, which seemed ready in early November to build some serious momentum for 2024.

SMU

Future ACC member SMU got a preview of life in the current Power Five league with a very humbling 23-14 Fenway Bowl loss to Boston College, which finished 10th in the conference standings. There are better teams in the ACC than the Eagles, will all due respect.

North Carolina

Once 6-0, North Carolina capped a second-half collapse with a 30-10 loss to West Virginia in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. About the only benefit of the loss: Mack Brown didn't have to get doused in mayonnaise. Otherwise, this was a major letdown for the Tar Heels, who gave up a touchdown on the game's first play and couldn't get things moving on offense behind young quarterback Connor Harrell, the heir apparent to NFL-bound Drake Maye.

Eastern Michigan

As if losing 69-10 to South Alabama in the 68 Ventures Bowl wasn't bad enough, Eastern Michigan punctuated the loss by sparking an on-field brawl while the Jaguars were gathered to sing the school's fight song. That's a black eye that dwarfs even a 59-point destruction, if that's even possible.

Gilgeous-Alexander takes center stage

Through three quarters against the Boston Celtics on Jan. 2, Oklahoma City Thunder star Shai Gilgeous-Alexander had 33 points.

Celtics coach Joe Mazzulla had seen enough. All-NBA defender Jrue Holiday wasn't the answer. Derrick White struggled to slow Gilgeous-Alexander. In the fourth quarter, Mazzulla put Jayson Tatum on Gilgeous-Alexander.

That's when the Thunder guard went into play-making mode. He delivered two assists to Chet Holmgren — both 3-pointers — as Oklahoma City held off Boston for a 127-123 signature victory. Gilgeous-Alexander finished with 36 points, seven assists, six rebounds and one steal.

It showcased all of Gilgeous-Alexander's elite and expanding skills (scoring, playmaking, defending, rebounding) as he morphs from All-NBA first-team guard to serious MVP candidate.

This season, he averages 31.5 points (No. 3 in the league), 6.4 assists (career high), 6.0 rebounds (career high) and 2.4 steals (No. 1 in the league) and shoots 54.9% (career high) from the field, 35% on 3-pointers and 88.8% on free throws for the Thunder (24-11).

Gilgeous-Alexander and the Thunder are among the best stories in the 2023-24 NBA season.

"His improvement has been so consistent and incremental," Thunder coach Mark Daigneault said. "He touched up the edges on every part of

his game. He always does that. He's touched up the edges off the ball as a catch and shoot player, as an attacker, as a secondary playmaker for sure. He's played faster and faster every season, which has been essential for his improvement because teams have gotten more and more focused on him. ... The last two years he's been outstanding. He's been able to take on really any matchup. He's become an elite help defender and communicator.

"And then, he's obviously got an oversized presence in our locker room because of his talent and because of what he's accomplished to this point. And he's learning how to leverage that for the good of the team. He's always had that intention, but leveraging it intentionally from a leadership standpoint is a different thing. And it's an acquired skill and one that he's done a nice job with to this point and will only continue to refine because he cares about team success and I have a lot of admiration for him for that."

If Gilgeous-Alexander, 25, continues to play that well and the Thunder continue to win, he will finish higher than last season's fifth place in the MVP race and have a shot at winning MVP.

Spaelstra gets record-setting coach extension

Miami Heat coach Erik Spoelstra's talents are staying in South Beach.

Spaelstra has agreed to an eight-year contract extension worth more than \$120 million, ESPN's Adrian Wojnarowski reported Tuesday night. Wojnarowski, Spoelstra's new deal represents "the most committed money in North American coaching history."

Spaelstra, the second longest-tenured coach in the NBA behind only San Antonio Spurs head coach Gregg Popov-

Pat Riley hand-picked Spoelstra to be his successor as head coach, saying "he's a man that was born to coach."

"I believe Erik Spoelstra is one of the most talented young coaches to come around in a long time," Riley said in 2008, when Spoelstra was 37. "This

game is now about younger coaches who are technologically skilled, innovative and bring fresh new ideas. That's what we feel we are getting with Erik Spoelstra."

Spaelstra, now 53, led the Heat to back-to-back NBA titles in 2012 and 2013 and has racked up a 725-506 regular-season record as head coach. He has the most wins in Heat franchise history (Riley is second with 354 regular-season wins).

"Worth Every Single Cent of that contract!!! Congrats Spo!" tweeted Los Angeles Lakers star LeBron James, who

played under Spoelstra on the Heat from 2010 to 2014 and was the driving force of both championship teams.

Spaelstra has a 109-75 playoff record. Last season, he coached the Heat to the 2023 NBA Finals as a No. 8 seed, marking Spoelstra's sixth Finals appearance as a head coach. Miami lost to the Denver Nuggets in five games.

In 2022 in honor of the NBA's 75th anniversary, Spoelstra was named one of the league's 15 greatest coaches of all time, alongside the likes of Golden State Warriors coach Steve Kerr and Popovich.

Accused Olympic skater drops out of Canadian nationals

Canadian Olympic ice dancer Nikolaj Sørensen, under investigation for the alleged sexual assault of an American figure skating coach and former skater, has withdrawn from this week's Canadian national championships, where he and his partner, Laurence Fournier Beaudry, were the defending champions.

"Laurence and I have made the difficult decision not to compete in the National Championships in Calgary this week," Sørensen wrote on Instagram on Tuesday afternoon. "While we do not wish to withdraw, we feel that our participation would be distracting, and that sportsmanship must continue to be the focus of the event. I will continue to fully cooperate with OSIC's investigation. Given OSIC's Confidentiality Policy, I am unable to comment further."

Last week, USA TODAY Sports broke the news of the investigation of Sørensen by Canada's Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner for the alleged sexual assault that took place near

Hartford, Connecticut, on April 21, 2012, according to documents and emails obtained by USA TODAY Sports.

The documents said the woman, then 22, said Sørensen, then 23, held her down against her will on a bed after a party at a condominium and assaulted her.

The woman is not being identified because USA TODAY Sports does not

publish the names of victims of alleged sexual abuse.

Olympic gold medalist Nancy Hogshead, a well-known Title IX attorney who founded Champion Women, a non-profit legal advocacy organization for girls and women in sports, told USA TODAY Sports that she is representing the victim of the alleged sexual abuse. Hogshead confirmed that an investigation of Sørensen is taking place but said she could not comment further due to a confidentiality agreement mandated by the OSIC.

A day after the story was published, Hogshead called on Skate Canada, the sport's national governing body, to suspend Sørensen.

In his Instagram post, Sørensen said: "I believe that every person should feel safe and protected on and off the ice. A positive and supportive environment in sport is vital for all of us. I am aware of the allegations made against me. These allegations are false, and I intend to strongly defend myself and my reputation."

Sørensen, now 34, competed for his native Denmark earlier in his career,

then represented Canada starting in the 2018-19 skating season. He became a Canadian citizen in September 2021. He finished ninth at the 2022 Beijing Winter Olympics and fifth at last year's world championships with Fournier Beaudry. They finished fifth at the 2023 Grand Prix Final in Beijing in early December.

According to the report, the woman said she remained silent for years and never reached out to the police or sports officials because she feared that she would be blamed and that no one would believe her.

The report said she sought psychological treatment and considered filing a criminal complaint in Connecticut but discovered the statute of limitations for such action had expired.

Then, on July 22, 2023, according to the report, she opened an online article that included an interview with Sørensen in which he commented about the importance of keeping women safe in ice dancing.

According to the report, the woman filed her report with the OSIC that same day.
