Penn has been the Chief of Police since 2008 and has been with the department for 20 years. In that time, Penn has lived and worked under one tenet: "The police are simply an extension of society, folks that are paid to do what we all ought to be doing anyway."

Penn has worked diligently to create and maintain good relationships between law enforcement and the community, speaking at NAACP events, assisting with fundraisers for local children, and pitching in wherever he can. He even gives out his personal cell phone number so community leaders can reach him at any time.

"We have to start listening and we have to do that multiple times, but it's got to be done," he said.

Last year, the Pittsburg Lions Club asked Penn to speak at one of their meetings. Penn told of the many positive things going on between the department and the community, sharing how thankful he is that things have remained

peaceful throughout the widespread adversity endured in recent years.

In the announcement of his retirement, Penn said, "This decision was not made lightly and makes me excited and sad at the same time. It has been an honor to serve the citizens of Pittsburg. I truly feel that you are served by the finest group of men and women there are, and I'm proud to work side by side with them... This is our community just as it is your community, and we have a commitment to it just like you do."

He stated that he has received wonderful support from the community and from city leaders. He said that the boys and girls in blue are supported not just with words but with actions, and they truly appreciate it.

"The first day they gave me a payhave to talk things out. It may be that we check, I said I can't believe I get paid to do this," said Penn in a recent interview. 'The last day I get a paycheck, I'll say the same thing."

Smoothies are a delicious, easy way to pack a lot of produce and nutrition into a meal. And if you're processing the toughest whole foods, like dark, leafy greens, be sure to use a high-powered blender such as the Ascent Series A3500, which offers five program settings, including one for smoothies. A recipe for the "Everything Smoothie," which incorporates a wide variety of produce found at your farmers' market, is available at vitamix.com.

Take advantage of tomato season, preparing pasta sauces to enjoy now or freeze for those months when they aren't readily available from local growers. Try adding red and green bell peppers, and even carrot shavings, to boost the nutritional value of a veggie Bolognese.

Soups make use of veggies now and later. Warm weather calls for cool concoctions like gazpacho or cucumber dill soup. A cabbage soup that combines hearty potatoes, onions and carrots can be made for cool fall nights or stored in your freezer for winter.

Remember that nearly all parts of produce are usable. Vegetables like beets, carrots, kohlrabi and turnips have edible greens that make an excellent addition to morning smoothies or a nutrient-rich stir-fry. Compost any remaining scraps.

Don't be afraid of bruises or dents. Greens with slightly wilted leaves can be blended with a bit of water and frozen in ice cube trays for future use in soups or smoothies. If you see a great deal on fruit like strawberries or cherries, buy them and combine with sugar and pectin for an easy freezer jam, or dry them out for on-the-go snacks.

Shopping for whole foods at farmers' markets is an opportunity to help local farmers and explore your culinary interests. The availability of specific fruits and vegetables ebbs and flows; capture each at its peak to enjoy the bounty throughout the year.

DeChambeau says he's hitting it even farther than a year ago

DETROIT - Frank Sinatra sang that luck be a lady tonight. Hall of Fame golfer Gary Player said luck is the residue of design, and film producer Samuel Goldwyn often is credited with saying that the harder he worked, the luckier he got.

Bryson DeChambeau apparently believes in the old saying it's better to be lucky than good. Asked what went wrong when he shot a final-round 77 and blew a lead on the back nine on Sunday of the U.S. Open two weeks ago, De-Chambeau, who was attempting to defend his title, chalked it up to bad luck.

"People don't realize how much luck plays a big factor," he said. "You can control a lot but, at the end of the day, still luck is a huge component of it.'

It raised the follow-up question: Was DeChambeau feeling lucky this week? "I hope so," he said. "Hope I get a little

lucky; it would be awesome." DeChambeau is back at Detroit Golf Club this week to defend his title at the Rocket Mortgage Classic. He bludgeoned the course, leading the field in driving distance with an eye-popping average of 329.8 yards en route to carding 23-under 265 to win by three strokes. Of all courses played on the PGA Tour, it was the longest average in four years (not counting events played at elevation), and more than 10 yards longer than the second-longest hitter, Cameron Champ. DeChambeau's final three drives? They tallied a combined 1,055 yards. It was a victory that validated his decision to bulk up and train as if he were a long-drive contestant.

"It was a milestone to show everybody that this is a different way that I can do it and still win," DeChambeau said. "It gave me the confidence to win the U.S. Open (in September)."

DeChambeau didn't just outmuscle the field; he out-putted it too. He led the Rocket Mortgage Classic in strokes

gained: putting, becoming the first player in the ShotLink era (2004-present) to finish first in both SG: off-the-tee and SG: putting. Here's the scary thing: De-Chambeau claims he's hitting it even farther and straighter than a year ago.

"If I can take advantage of the wedges, I'll give myself a good chance," he

DeChambeau's length could be an even more decisive advantage this year. Detroit Golf Club has been soaked by nearly 6 inches of rain since June 21, with 4.25 inches falling on Friday night. Patrick Reed recounted seeing photos of the course the next day and marveled at the job the course superintendent and his staff has done to ready the course.

Reed noted that the fairways played like concrete with soft greens the first year when Nate Lashley shot 25-under 263. Last year, the course still played short, but the greens were firmer as De-Chambeau won with a total two strokes higher. This year, drives won't be bounding down the fairway, leading to longer approach shots, but the field will be throwing darts at spongy greens. Expect another birdie barrage and for the conditions to play right into DeChambeau's wheelhouse.

"It's huge," he said of his distance advantage to carry bunkers off the tee. Reed is counting on the setup to be tough, but fair, to neutralize the advantage of bombers. He won't be counting on is luck being a critical factor.

"Four days, 72 holes, you're going to get good bounces, you're going to get bad bounces," Reed said. "It's the guy who's playing consistently the best golf that week that's going to win."

That was the lowest scoring average among all PGA Tour tournament courses that played as a par 72 (with only one course hosting) during the 2019-20 season. The 36-hole cut at Detroit Golf Club landed at 5-under 139. The winning score in 2019 was 25 under and 23 under last year.

Tee times

The Rocket Mortgage Classic field isn't as top heavy as those in recent weeks, having lured just seven of the top 30 players in the world. Golf Channel's coverage Thursday will feature World No. 9 Patrick Reed playing with former U.S. Open champ Webb Simpson and Jason Kokrak (1 ET). DeChambeau, the defending champ, is out with Cameron Champ and Sunday's loser of an eight-hole playoff, Kramer Hickock (1:10).

Ganassi selling its NASCAR operation to Trackhouse Racing

Trackhouse Racing has purchased Chip Ganassi Racing's NASCAR operation and will take control of all of its assets at the end of the racing season.

Ganassi emphasized he is not out of the racing business and will continue to run his NTT IndyCar Series operation, among other programs. However, Ganassi is getting out of NASCAR, where he currently fields two cars for former Cup Series champion Kurt Busch, the No. 1 Chevrolet, and Ross Chastain, the No. 42 Chevrolet.

"I think this is a great day for NAS-CAR as it seems like there are so many people that are wanting to get into the sport as owners - Michael Jordan, Pitbull, Denny (Hamlin), and plenty of others," Ganassi said. "They are bringing a new perspective, vision and insight, which is great for the sport. NAS-CAR has been building momentum over the last few years, and I am confident that it will continue to do so.

"Also, I can honestly say that my NASCAR team was not for sale. Justin (Marks, Trackhouse team owner) simply came to me with a great offer and an even better vision. ... I care deeply for my employees, so selling to someone like Justin, who is part of the CGR family, made the reality of selling much easier. He knows our organization and the people. That gives me comfort.

"Everyone needs to know that I am still completely dedicated to the motor sports industry and will continue to run my other teams in IndyCar, IMSA and Extreme E with the same enthusiasm that I always have."

Ganassi won the Daytona 500 and Brickyard 400 in 2010. He began fielding cars in the NASCAR Cup Series in 2001.

Trackhouse Racing will field two fulltime cars in the Cup Series in 2022. Daniel Suarez will continue to compete for the organization, while a second driver will be announced.

"This is a landmark moment for Trackhouse Racing," Justin Marks said. "It is humbling to know we have secured our position in NASCAR for the next decade. These are never decisions made without a lot of thorough consideration and deep reflection by both parties. This process took several weeks, and I want to thank Chip for being so open and candid with me every step of the journey.

"Chip has built an iconic motor sports empire and the Ganassi brand is globally recognized as a winner in the auto racing industry. It is truly an honor that we can build from that foundation. 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
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SECONDARY BREAK An NBA Dad's Story







Frittelli title defense on tap

It's an interesting week for Dylan Frittelli, the former University of Texas star who is still the reigning John Deere Classic champion, even though he won the title – his only PGA Tour victory – two full years ago.

The event in Silvis, Illinois, was one of those canceled during the COVID-19 pandemic, so his defense was pushed back, but the South African said he did have a few emotions resurface on the back nine while playing a practice round this week.

"It's quite a long time ago. I played the back nine today and had some good memories coming through there, but yeah, two years is quite a long time in a young person's life," he said. "If I'm only 31 years old it's almost – what is that, 5% of my life, 10% of my life?"

Frittelli, who bought a home in Austin in 2018, is 31 in calendar years but has always acted beyond his age. Texas men's golf coach John Fields told the Austin American-Statesman's Kirk Bohls a few years back that "all our guys thought he was a 40-year-old guy playing college golf here. He had a real maturity when he came to Austin."

So the level-headed Frittelli certainly sees that while he's maintained his high world ranking through big showings on major stages, his week-to-week performances have been lackluster. He's No. 91 on the Official World Golf Ranking.

One of the issues? The flatstick. Frittelli's putting has dropped considerably. For the current PGA Tour season, he's fallen to 186th in strokes gained: putting.

He's tackling the issue head-on.

"I've worked with my coach obviously intensely to try and figure it out. We've outlined short irons and putting. Putting is a major one. My putting stats have been terrible this year, to be blunt," he said. "But I know my technique and everything related to it is pretty sound. It's more so trying to make putts and be more creative and stop trying to be so

analytical and worry about that technique. Trying to be more creative, more productive on making putts and doing drills that challenge me to make putts."

As for the rest of his game, Frittelli is tweaking, but he thinks a few minor adjustments will put him back on top soon enough. With a fairly weak field at the John Deere this year – many of the top names have headed off to the Scottish Open in advance of next week's British Open – a good week could again put him in the winner's circle.

Oh, and then there's his personal life, where he's found additional free time.

"I guess I'm driving it a little bit more in the rough with the gained distance

and I'm hitting driver more often, so I find myself in that 160- or 150-and-in yardage a lot more often. I've also focused on that, trying to get that better," he said. "In general, I'm playing pretty well. I don't think, as a lot of guys say, my results don't reflect how I'm playing. I think mental side I've been a little bit distracted the last few months. I haven't really been too focused. Came out of a relationship recently, so hopefully, that's going to get me on a nice straight trajectory to playing the good golf again.

"Once that kind of clears up and I've worked on those two things, I think I'll be back to top-70, top-60 player that I know I can be."

Packers quarterback Aaron Rodgers played in TNT's "The Match" while avoiding questions on his situation, but the commentators knew they couldn't end the program without asking the NFL MVP if he will be playing in 2021.

(The Packers play the

Bears Oct. 17, in Week 6.) "Yeah, I don't know, BA, we'll see," said Rodgers.

"How about Sept. 12th then, will you go for that one?" Anderson asked.

"What's that one?" Rodgers replied

"That would be the opener against

the Saints," Anderson said. "Yeah, I don't know, BA, we'll see," Rodgers declared again.

Anderson seemingly gave up with his line of questioning after that, but Rodgers quipped to Anderson, "I know you're a Milwaukee guy."

Rodgers and Bryson DeChambeau

teamed to take a 3-up lead with six holes to play in The Match and never looked back. The quarterback and 2020 U.S. Open champion defeated 2021 PGA Championship winner Phil Mickelson and seven-time Super Bowl champion Tom Brady 3 and 2 at The Reserve at Moonlight Basin in Big Sky, Montana. After an iffy start, Rodgers got hot off the tee to lead he and De-Chambeau on a stretch of six birdies over eight holes to take the late lead.

Others on the commentating team tried their best to force an answer out of Rodgers. Future Hall of Famer Larry Fitzgerald was on hand and proclaimed "Everybody is on their toes, they want to know." Rodgers quickly changed the subject to Brady, saying, "I'm trying to talk to him about if he's going to keep playing or not."

Charles Barkley couldn't resist bringing some funny, stating, "Hey Aaron, we go way back, you can just tell me, I'll keep it a secret."

Rodgers left Barkley on a cliffhanger, saying "Charles, I'll tell you this week in Tahoe."

Rodgers and Barkley will be a part of the American Century Championship, a celebrity golf tournament in South Lake Tahoe, Nevada.

Three Currys will play in celebrity golf tournament

RENO, Nev. – The celebrity golf tournament will be a little more 'Curryier' this summer.

Golden State Warriors star Steph Curry, who has played in the event eight times, along with his father, Dell Curry, who played six times, will be joined by his younger brother, Seth Curry, making his debut at Edgewood-Tahoe in Stateline in the American Century Championship, beginning Thursday.

Seth Curry is a guard with the Philadelphia 76ers, who lost to the Atlanta Hawks in June in the NBA playoffs.

They join Justin Timberlake, Annika Sorenstam, Aaron Rodgers, Patrick Mahomes, Tony Romo, Michael Strahan and Charles Barkley in the lineup of 90 sports and entertainment celebrities.

Steph Curry's best finish in the tournament is fourth, three times, including last year. He had the best final round in 2020 of any player in the 54-hole tournament, scoring 26 points in the Modified Stableford format. Curry will also be one of the leading choices in the sportsbooks.

The event features a \$600,000 purse, with \$125,000 to the winner.

Many of the players contribute their winnings to non-profits. The American Century Championship has donated more than \$5.5 million to nonprofits since its inception.

In recent years, Steph and Dell have had a wager with the loser having to dive into Lake Tahoe or singing the winner's choice of song at karaoke night before a large group. The wager this year is to be determined in conjunction with Seth's participation.

The tournament was conducted in 2020 without spectators amid the global pandemic and raised \$600,000 for COVID-19 and social justice charities.

Besides Seth Curry, first-timers to the tournament include Buffalo Bills head coach Sean McDermott, Los Angeles Rams offensive tackle Andrew Whitworth, two-time New York Giants Super Bowl champions Strahan and teammate Justin Tuck, and former New York Yankees star pitcher CC Sabathia.

The field collectively represents 17 Hall of Famers, 13 MVP awards, 15 Cy Young Awards and eight Player of the Year Awards.

The tournament will be televised live

on NBCSN from 5-8 p.m. ET Friday and and on NBC from 2:30-6 ET Saturday and Sunday.

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
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
