



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

Kidnapping Cont. from page 1

On Friday, June 24, at approximately 5:30 p.m., the Pittsburg Police Department was notified by the Longview Police Department that there was a young female missing from Fort Worth.

The mother of the girl had received a text message from her daughter stating that she had been kidnapped and was in the Longview area.

A ping on her phone showed her real location to be in Pittsburg at what was later discovered to be an address with no residence. A second ping placed the girl's location at the Budget Inn.

Upon arrival, the police were informed that a man identifying as Corey Lee, who had apparently possessed no identification, had rented a room with multiple young females.

After 10 minutes of attempted communication at the door to the room, the male answered and was arrested. All three of the girls stated they were from the Fort Worth area and were being held against their will. They said they were terrified of Pearson as he had threatened to kill them if they spoke to law enforcement.

The three girls told the Pittsburg Police that Pearson had picked them up in Fort Worth, agreeing to drive them to Dallas and give them money. However, they became concerned when they passed Dallas and

didn't stop. When they started questioning him and wanted to get out, he threatened to kill them, displaying a firearm and threatening to use it if needed. He then took their phones away.

Upon arriving in Longview, the girls stated that Pearson bought narcotics and forced the girls to take Ecstasy pills. Marijuana, Alprazolam (Xanax) and other (at the time) unidentified pills were found on the bed of the room. The girls also stated that Pearson sexually abused them in the car, but did not force them to engage in sexual contact until reaching the Inn.

Upon rescuing the girls, their parents were contacted and the victims transported to the Northeast Texas Child Advocacy Center where one of the girls' mother arrived and picked them up.

Pearson was placed in custody at approximately 6:46 p.m. and transported to the Camp County Jail.

On June 27, the Pittsburg Police were notified that Pearson had given false information concerning his identity. Morris County had received an anonymous call stating that Pearson was not Lamarcus Dorel Pearson, but actually Joseph Eugene Pearson. This was confirmed and it was discovered that he had an outstanding warrant out of Morris County for deadly conduct and discharge of a firearm, thus adding a couple more charges to his list.

Pearson's bond is set at \$1,214,500. He will face a Grand Jury, and, if indicted, a trial date will be set.



Chestnut regrets contest headlock

Joey Chestnut expressed regret for briefly putting a protester in a headlock during the annual Nathan's Hot Dog Eating Contest – and he also explained his actions during a phone interview with USA TODAY Sports.

Chestnut, standing at the center of the raised stage on July 4 on Coney Island in New York, quickly resumed shoving hot dogs into his mouth after the incident. Video of the moment went viral after Chestnut won his 15th title in 16 years.

"As soon as a I grabbed the guy, I realized he was a kid," Chestnut told USA TODAY Sports on Tuesday. "I felt bad afterwards. I was just amped up, just focused on getting back to eating. It's just unfortunate. I wish that it didn't happen. It's a bummer."

The protester was Scott Gilbertson, 21, of Berkley, California, who was charged with criminal trespass, disorderly conduct and harassment, according to the New York Police Department (NYPD). He was one of three protesters, all animal rights activists working with a grassroots group called Direct Action Everywhere.

"I felt like it was unnecessary for sure," Gilbertson told USA TODAY Sports of Chestnut's reaction. "I had the mask on so I couldn't see who it was. I assumed it was a security guard. And

then when I saw the video, it was Joey. I was surprised."

Chestnut, 38, said the mask that hindered Gilbertson's vision also triggered Chestnut's reaction.

"I was freaked out a little bit because he had the mask on," Chestnut said. "I saw the mask and I think that's when I realized he doesn't belong here."

Gilbertson and two other protesters wore masks of Star Wars' "stormtroopers" and of Darth Vader and displayed "Expose Smithfield's Deathstar" signs.

"The 'Deathstar' reference compares the villainous megaweapon from the Star Wars film series to the largest factory pig farm in the country, Smithfield Foods' Circle Four Farms in Milford, Utah," Direct Action Everywhere wrote in a press release.

Nathan's is a brand licensed by Smithfield, which Direct Action Everywhere has alleged compromises worker safety, public health and animal welfare.

Matt Johnson, the press coordinator for Direct Action Everywhere, said Chestnut's reaction was "excessively violent."

"I think it was pretty plain to see," Johnson said. "I'll cut him a little slack. You're in the heat of the moment, this is really intense, he's trained a lot for it, it means a lot to him. He's not public enemy No. 1 or anything, but a pretty excessive response to a peaceful protest."

After watching the video, Chestnut

likened his reaction to a dog exhibiting food aggression - in this case, a protester threatening to get between Chestnut and his hot dogs.

"That's what it reminded me of," he said.

"It looks excessive," he added. "But in my position, I don't know, I had been waiting a long time for the contest and I wish (Gilbertson) had just stood by me and I never would have touched him. If he hadn't elbowed me and got in front of me, it would have not been a problem. But I also wish they didn't get on stage."

Gilbertson said his neck is sore as a result of the headlock but he doesn't think it's anything serious.

"I don't really have anything against Joey as a person," he said. "I was just trying to get my message out there and my organization's message out there. I wasn't trying to nudge him. I had the mask on and my peripheral vision was hindered.

"I was trying to get in front of him. I couldn't see how close I was to him and I kind of nudged him. So I can understand, I guess, why he may have overreacted. But I think the extent to which he reacted was unnecessary."

The whole encounter lasted no more than five seconds, with emcee George Shea pulling the protester away from Chestnut as the competitive eating champ resumed devouring hot dogs and buns during the 10-minute contest.

The two other protesters - Robert Yamada, 42 of Phoenix and Joshua Marxen, 31, of Santa Clara, California – were charged with criminal trespass and disorderly conduct during the incident, according to the NYPD.

Chestnut said people's reaction to how he handled the protester has been mixed. He said his fiancee received a direct message on Instagram saving the incident was a red flag for abusive behavior and she shouldn't be with Chestnut

"For the most part," Chestnut said, "my family, they're happy that I didn't let it bother me and I was able to keep going."

Chestnut said he thinks the incident with the protester may have cost him three hot dogs. He ate 63, 20 ahead of runner-up Geoffrey Esper.

17-year-old girl makes history at high school fishing championship

It was a scorching sunny afternoon in June at the High School Fishing National Championship in Florence, Alabama, when Fallon Clepper used her St. Croix Mojo rod to make history alongside her partner on Pickwick Lake.

Seventeen-year-olds Clepper and Wyatt Ford won the annual tournament June 25 with a three-day total of 39 pounds and 9 ounces - a victory that earned them four-year college offers totaling \$180,000 each, among other money prizes. With 236 boats competing, their margin of victory was by 5 pounds, 5 ounces.

Fallon became the first female competitor to win the high school national championship. With the 50th anniversary of Title IX on June 23, she was hoping to inspire the next generation of girls and others to get into the sport. "I hope that me being the first girl (to make history) gave other girls an opportunity to go out there and see that you can do anything," Clepper said. "So I hope that I can encourage girls to get out there and start fishing." The high school fishing national championship is a competition comprised of teams from the United States and several other countries. Each team features three people to a boat, with two being high school fishers and the other their adult captain or coach. The goal is to have the greatest three-day total in

The chemistry between Clepper and Ford was forged by the people who know them best - their parents, who were longtime friends and reconnected during Clepper and Ford's freshman year at Lake Creek High School in Montgomery, Texas.

We were at Meet the Teacher (our) freshman year and I was walking out of the classroom," Clepper said. "Then I asked him if he had a partner and he said no.'

After initial hesitance from Ford, he realized his choice was a simple one.

"We're very successful because we both like to fish different styles," Ford said. "Whenever you're fishing, if both people are fishing the same style, like let's say we're both throwing moving baits and the fish don't want that? Then you're not going to catch as many fish." The two have developed a love for catching bass fish since they were children, and their backgrounds have made them one of the most talented tandems in the country. Clepper's love for fishing developed at an early age with her father, Julian, who also is a competitive fisherman. She began competing competitively when she was 11 and won numerous events and qualifying tournaments.

Moore now parent with husband she helped free

Moore and Irons were married in 2020, shortly after Irons was freed after spending 23 years in prison. Irons' story went viral after his 1998 conviction was overturned in March 2020, with the support of Moore and her family.

She told the GMA crew that she is ecstatic over the opportunity to become a mother and extremely excited to be sharing this moment with Irons.

"Delivering JJ was one of the proudest days of my life. Witnessing Jonathan be a Father, priceless." Moore said via her Instagram account.

to a place that you know is right and you're moving into something that's really meaningful," Moore said on "NBC Nightly News" in 2020, "it makes it a little less hard.' The two met through a prison ministry she became involved in with extended family in Missouri while she was playing for Geno Auriemma and the UConn Huskies. Moore and Irons built a strong friendship, while Moore learned the details of his case. In March 2020, a Missouri judge said the case against Irons was "very weak and circumstantial at best" in a court order. The lead prosecutor declined to retry his case and Irons was ultimately freed.

Moore, who won four WNBA championships with the Minnesota Lynx as well as league MVP in 2014, put her decorated career on hold in 2019 to advocate for the release of Irons for wrongful conviction.

He was sentenced to 50 years. Police did not discover any fingerprints, DNA or blood that could link Irons to the crime.

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'THIS WILL BE LIFE CHANGING'

INDIANAPOLIS – The NBA board of governors voted Tuesday to pay \$24.5 million to former American Basketball Association players, many of whom are struggling to pay rent, medical bills and buy the basic necessities.

The agreement reached by the NBA and its players association ends a yearslong battle launched by the Indianapolis-based Dropping Dimes Foundation.

Dropping Dimes, a nonprofit founded in 2014 to help struggling former ABA players and their families, has been pleading with the NBA to give players of the now-defunct ABA the money it says they deserve.

About 115 players are eligible for the payout, which the NBA is calling "recognition payments," not pensions. Those players either spent three or more years in the ABA or played at least three combined years in the ABA and NBA and never received a vested pension from the NBA.

The agreement pays players an average \$3,828 annually for each year they were in the league. For example, a player with the minimum three seasons will receive \$11,484 a year. A player with the most years of service, such as Freddie Lewis who has nine, will get \$35,452 a year.

"It's an incredible day for former ABA players," said Scott Tarter, CEO and founder of Dropping Dimes, "one that we and the players have been hoping for and working so hard toward for many years."

The money to fund the ABA payments is a 50-50 split between the NBA and the National Basketball Players Association.

"Our players have a genuine sense of appreciation for those who paved the way and helped us achieve the success we enjoy today," said Tamika Tremaglio, NBPA executive director. "We have always considered the ABA players a part of our brotherhood and we are proud to finally recognize them with this benefit."

After the vote, NBA Commissioner Adam Silver said the players and team governors "felt a need to act on behalf of these former ABA players who are aging and, in many cases, facing difficult economic circumstances.

"These pioneers made meaningful contributions to help grow the game of professional basketball and we all believe it's appropriate to provide financial recognition to this group for their impact."

'This means so much to them'

Tarter was in a warehouse alone sur-

tremendous contributions to today's NBA game."

What the NBA approved gives threeyear players about \$957 a month, rather than the \$1,200 Dropping Dimes had asked for. For some, that's still not enough, said Tarter, who expects many players will still be turning to Dropping Dimes for help.

In other situations, the money will be life changing for these players, he said. Tarter points to Bird Averitt, who won an ABA championship with the Kentucky Colonels in 1975. When he died in 2020, he was using kerosene to heat his home because he couldn't afford to pay the electric bill.

There are many former players in similar situations or even worse off than Averitt, Tarter said.

When the ABA merged with the NBA in 1976, just four ABA teams were absorbed, leaving many players suddenly without paychecks, health insurance and pensions.

Beyond the financial help the NBA deal provides, it gives honor to the pioneers of the professional game, Tarter said.

"This means so much to them personally," he said, "from the standpoint of their own legacy in basketball."

'Not asking for a handout'

The Indianapolis Star, part of the USA TODAY Network, published a story last year revealing that 80% of former ABA players struggling financially are Black. Those are the players coming to Dropping Dimes for help.

Those players blazed the trail for what the NBA game is today, fast-paced with 3-pointers and slam-dunk contests, and they deserved something for that, Tarter said. who played for the ABA's Denver Rockets, told IndyStar in February 2021.

At the time, Card was a retired public bus driver, living in a rented apartment.

"I'm not asking for some kind of handout or something I didn't work for or deserve," Card said. "I don't know why these guys don't step up and say, 'Why shouldn't we take care of them like they took care of us?' "

After the article published, the NBA spoke publicly on the issue for the first time.

"We are in discussions with the Dropping Dimes Foundation on this issue," Tim Frank, senior vice president, league operations communications, told IndyStar in 2021.

The discussions weren't soon enough for Card, who died two months later at 76. In lieu of flowers, his obituary asked that donations be made to Dropping Dimes.

'Forgotten about'

Former ABA player Sam Smith died while waiting for a pension from the NBA and left a chilling photo behind. George Carter died penniless with no family. Many other players who had sought help from Dropping Dimes died as they waited for a decision from the NBA.

When the ABA disbanded in 1976, merging with the NBA, four of its 11 teams were absorbed by the NBA – the Pacers, Nuggets, New York Nets and San Antonio Spurs. Many players were left with no pension, salaries shut off and health insurance gone.

"They've just been forgotten about," Tarter said in 2021.

Maurice McHartley, who played four years in the ABA, talked to IndyStar last

money, a new suit for church, a rehab session.

And it has helped with big things – funeral expenses, major medical bills and rent.

And now, Dropping Dimes has helped get these players what they needed most.

"This, these pensions, has been our big mission from Day 1," Tarter said. "This, what is happening now, getting these guys what they deserve."

'I felt like I was talking to Mel'

Dropping Dimes has an advisory board backed by big names in sports, media and basketball. Among them are Bob Costas, Reggie Miller, George McGinnis, Julius Erving, Myles Turner, Peter Vecsey and Bob Netolicky.

But one name on the board (now in memoriam) is Mel Daniels, and he was the fiercest fighter that Dropping Dimes had, Tarter said.

As Tarter sat in that ABA warehouse downtown last week on the call with the NBA, he said he looked up to the ceiling and thought of Daniels.

"I literally looked up as I was listening to this and I felt like I was talking to Mel," he said. "Too bad Mel is not here to see this in person. This was his idea all along, saying, 'We've got to do something for these guys.'"

As Daniels helped former player Charlie Jordan pick out a new suit in 2015, he talked to IndyStar about how sad it was to see his league and teammates suffer. "There are some ABA players living under bridges," he said. "They don't have anything. People don't know how bad off they are."

That includes former ABA players, like Randy Denton, who had no idea the men he played with were struggling.

"I didn't stay in touch with anybody and then this thing bubbles up some years ago and my first thought is, 'I'm so sorry,' " said Denton, who played five seasons in the ABA and a year in the NBA. "It was emotional seeing those guys suffer."

Denton started following the plights of the players and felt helpless.

"I'm not as bad off as some of these guys. I read these stories and I just cried. I wished I had a million dollars to give them," he said. "I knew these guys. I played with these guys."

While Denton knows the money will help other players more than him, he also said money is not the only reason this NBA deal matters.

"It would mean a lot to me from a basketball standpoint. It would mean a lot because we were as good as the NBA players, we played just as hard," he said. "And we are getting peanuts, getting nothing, no recognition."

rounded by ABA memorabilia when he got the call from the NBA last week. A call he had been waiting for.

"I was literally shaking," Tarter said. "Is this really happening?"

While the NBA did not give ABA players everything Dropping Dimes had asked for – covering all 140 living former ABA players and paying \$400 a month for each year of play – Tarter said he is still celebrating.

"In some ways, we feel these aging ABA players, who broke so many barriers in the 1960s and '70s, deserve even more recognition," he said. "But I can't overstate how much it means to them to have the NBA and NBPA recognize their He and his organization have been on a mission to get the NBA "to do the right thing," Tarter said.

The former ABA players are now in their late 60s, 70s and 80s. Some are homeless, living under bridges. Some die alone with no money for a gravestone. Others can't afford dentures or a new suit to go to church.

More than 10 players on Dropping Dimes' pension list, now 140, have died in the past three years. Time was a factor in pushing the NBA to act, Tarter said.

"As far as this pension thing, the NBA is waiting for us to die off," Frank Card, year. He is retired from a job as a newspaper truck driver and lives in subsidized housing in Atlanta. He said he has been forced to ask for financial help many times in recent years.

"A pension, there's a lot of things it would go toward," said McHartley, who during his career played for the ABA's Miami Floridians, Nets and Dallas Chaparrals. "Car insurance, upkeep on your car, food intake, rent. So, it's a lot of things that would help out with your overall living."

Dropping Dimes heard from Mc-Hartley and so many other former players. Through its eight years, the foundation has helped with little things – gas Until now.

"The financial benefit will be life changing to many of these former players, who were paid so much less when they played," Tarter said. "That said, not every former ABA player qualifies for the recognition benefit and there will still be players in need."

Even as Dropping Dimes and former players celebrated Tuesday night, Tarter said he knew his work isn't done.

"Dropping Dimes is rededicating itself to continue to assist as best we can, with the respect and dignity these players deserve for what they've done for their sport," he said. "We're a small operation, but we're a determined group."

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
