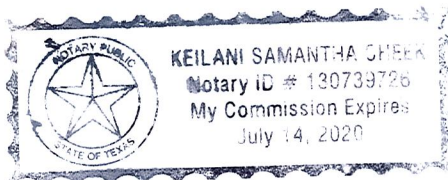



Majors loved being in college football

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – When I first met Johnny Majors, he was a third-year coach at Tennessee, and I was a second-year sports columnist at the Jackson (Mississippi) Clarion-Ledger.

We didn't talk that much about Tennessee when we had lunch at the Southeastern Conference spring meetings in 1979. I was more interested in what he did elsewhere.

Majors, who died Wednesday at 85, was a Tennessee native who came close to winning the Heisman Trophy as a single-wing tailback with the Volunteers. He returned to his alma mater after the 1976 football season to rebuild a program that he almost led to a national championship as a player in 1956.

I was intrigued by the rebuilding jobs he already had accomplished. He took Pittsburgh from college football's doldrums to an unbeaten, national championship season in 1976. Before that, he worked wonders at Iowa State, little more than a Big Eight punching bag before Majors made it competitive.

I didn't have to ask many questions because Majors relished the topics. He seemed as proud of what he did at Iowa State as the football revival he pulled off at Pittsburgh.

In 1971, the top three teams in the country were all from the Big Eight – No. 1 Nebraska, No. 2 Oklahoma and No. 3 Colorado. Those were the only three teams to beat Iowa State during the regular season.

Never mind if Majors hadn't coached a down at Tennessee, where he eventually laid the foundation for UT's historic success in the 1990s. His lofty place in college football was ensured by his suc-

cesses at programs better known for failure.

He also distinguished himself by excelling at such a high level as both a coach and as a player.

While covering Majors' UT program in the late 1980s and early '90s, I wondered how his career might have gone if he had remained at Pittsburgh. My guess is he would have presided over a football dynasty.

He didn't elevate UT football to dynasty status but restored its prominence in the SEC and nationwide. Unfortunately, his return ended badly and under strange circumstances.

Majors had heart surgery before the 1992 season after leading the Vols to 29 victories in the three previous seasons.

UT athletic director Phillip Fulmer, who was Majors' offensive coordinator at the time, was named interim head coach while Majors recovered. That was the beginning of the end for Majors as Tennessee's football coach.

As interim coach, Fulmer led the Vols to three consecutive victories. Two of those victories – against nationally ranked Georgia and Florida – were significant.

UT's start was so successful, Majors was concerned for his job. His concern proved justifiable.

If he had sat out the season while recovering from heart surgery, there's no way Tennessee could have fired him. Instead, he rushed back. The timing was terrible.

The players had bonded with Fulmer, and Majors wasn't at the top of his game. How could he have been?

I was critical of Majors at the time. Looking back, I should have been more sympathetic to his condition.

Majors was forced to resign with three games remaining in the season, Fulmer was named coach and the program won a national championship six years later.

Majors was understandably bitter. And the bitterness lingered. Many years later, he still referred to Fulmer as "Judas Brutus" among other things.

That's part of Majors' legacy. It's not how he should be remembered, though.

He's one of college football's greatest success stories. He loved the sport and loved Tennessee. That's how he should be remembered.

I'm sure he felt more stress at Tennessee than he did at either Iowa State or Pittsburgh. The pressure was self-imposed. UT was his school. Tennessee was his state. And he knew how much UT football mattered to the state.

Majors eventually succeeded at Tennessee just as he did everywhere else.

Some college football coaches don't enjoy their success as much as Majors did. You could tell how much he enjoyed being a part of a game he loved so much.

In 1979, SEC coaches spent as much time in a hospitality room as they did meetings. Card games weren't unusual. As competitive as the coaches were during the season, they genuinely seemed to enjoy one another's company in an altogether different setting.

Majors was in the middle of one of the card games, smiling and laughing, when I walked through the hospitality room one night.

I remember thinking, "Johnny Majors is the happiest guy in the room."

MLS, players union finalize plan to resume season

COLUMBUS, Ohio – The 2020 Major League Soccer season will resume after all following the league and the MLS Players Association ratifying a collective bargaining agreement that will run through 2025.

MLS and MLSPA also finalized a plan to resume the 2020 season, which would have all 26 teams in Orlando at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex for two weeks of training. Then teams would play three games in a group stage before a knockout round, which would conclude six weeks after teams arrive June 24.

After the players' union submitted its

counterproposal to the league's proposal on amendments to the CBA that was agreed to in February but never ratified, the league threatened to lock out players if they did not agree to its proposal by Tuesday at noon.

After public response to the league's stance, MLS pushed back its deadline to Wednesday at noon. The union announced late Wednesday morning that the two sides had come to an agreement and ratified it.

The two sticking points in the negotiations revolved around how much money teams would get from media rights after the league strikes a new deal following the 2022 season, and a clause that would have allowed the league to back out of the deal if attendance

dropped a certain percentage.

When the CBA was agreed to in February before the start of the season, the two sides agreed that 25% of the revenue generated from the new media rights that exceeded a \$100 million increase of the league's media rights income in 2022 would be dispersed to teams for player spending in 2023 and 2024.

In its initial proposal, the league scaled the 2023 percentage back to 10% due to financial impacts of the global pandemic. The players' union countered with 17% in 2023 and 25% in 2024.

A source with knowledge of the final agreement said the league and the union agreed on 12% of the net increase over \$100 million of the new media

rights deal in 2023 and 25% in 2024.

The source also said the league dropped its force majeure clause that it was trying to tie to attendance.

In the February agreement before the pandemic, the league and players' union agreed on a force majeure clause that allowed either side of the agreement to back out if MLS couldn't operate due to unforeseen catastrophic events, like a pandemic.

MLS then tried to tie that clause to attendance by saying if five teams had a 25% decrease in attendance from the previous year, then the league could back out of the CBA.

In the final ratified version, MLS dropped that language and went back to the original language of the clause.

Zero key for PGA this week

Much as we like to focus on personalities, the PGA Tour is really all about numbers posted: hole scores, round totals, cash earned, FedEx Cup points awarded, charitable dollars raised, eyeballs watching. All of those figures matter at this week’s Charles Schwab Challenge in Fort Worth, but they carry considerably less import as the Tour resumes action amid the COVID-19 pandemic. (Note: amid, not after, since cases are spiking across the country, not least in Texas.)

Instead, the number that matters most to the Tour at Colonial Country Club is zero.

Zero positive tests among players and caddies.

Zero drama.

If the Schwab Challenge were to be the most boring, uneventful 72 holes of his tenure as Tour commissioner, Jay Monahan would heave a sigh of relief.

The typical barometers of a good week on Tour — exciting finishes, superstar winners, scoring records — simply don’t matter as much. The yardstick being used in the coming days is much more daunting. Golf is a guinea pig for the greater sports world, and a misstep or health issue will have ramifications far beyond the Tour’s carefully constructed resumption.

Fans will of course notice everything that is amiss at this most unusual of tournaments.

Rather than presiding from his traditional 18th hole tower, CBS’s Jim Nantz will plow a lonely furrow in front of a monitor in a remote building at Colonial. His sidekick in the booth, Nick Faldo, will chime in from a studio 1,100 miles away in Orlando.

The course will seem naked, stripped of the grandstands from which crafty players have long been accustomed to expect a fortuitous bounce or generous relief.

There will be no spectators, the very lifeblood of sport drained from the proceedings until at least the Memorial Tournament in July. (That’s not entirely bad, since it provides a respite from the smattering of meatheads whose hollering plagues too many telecasts).

The last time golf’s best player hit balls in such eerie silence in Fort Worth was when Hogan was practicing 15 min-

utes away at Shady Oaks.

World No. 1 Rory McIlroy heads the best field Colonial has ever hosted. The top five players in the world ranking are all here, and 16 of the top 20. There are 148 men in the field, 101 of whom have won on Tour, the kind of wheat-to-chaff ratio seldom seen outside the Seminole Pro-Member.

It’s almost enough to make one overlook those competitors who might have been better served watching from home.

Like Keith Clearwater, who won here two years before McIlroy was born. Now 60 years old, Clearwater still takes his spot each year as an ex-champion grandfathered into the field. He has made only seven Tour starts outside this event in the last 15 years. The last time he made a cut in any Tour event was 19 years ago, in 2001.

He’s not even the oldest guy in the field. Tom Lehman, 61, is here on the same senior pass 25 years after his victory. So, too, is Olin Browne, also 61 and the ’99 champ. And David Frost, the ’97 winner, who is just 10 days younger than Clearwater. All of them are younger than Bernhard Langer, who turns 63 this summer. He’s here alongside Scott McCarron (54) and Steve Stricker (53) as sponsor’s invites.

PGA Tour stop or Cocoon cast reunion?

None are taking a spot in the field from anyone else, to be fair. This is an invitational event, and a sponsor may

do as it pleases with invitations. It’s entirely fair if Schwab wishes to invite winners of the Cup it generously finances on the senior circuit (Langer and McCarron in this instance). All of the aforementioned have earned the right to tee it up, though continuing to exercise that right might warrant reflection. If nothing else, we should at least commend this higher-risk demographic for heading back to work in a pandemic.

Everyone understands what will constitute a best-case scenario by the time we reach Sunday night in Fort Worth, and also the worst.

A positive test among players, caddies or officials — all of whom traveled there, increasing their potential exposure — would fuel skeptics who think the Tour is taking unnecessary risks and rushing its resumption. No amount of testing or safety protocols will change those minds. And even a drama-free outing in Texas just shifts that onus to next week’s RBC Heritage in South Carolina, and beyond to Connecticut and Michigan.

In that respect, PGA Tour players — whether Rory McIlroy or Keith Clearwater — really are now just like the rest of us, reckoning with a macabre new reality that means having to assume a certain amount of health risk just to go about the humdrum tasks of our workdays. Having assumed that risk, everything else is up to fate. And not even Jay Monahan has sway over that.

The PGA Tour resumes play after a three-month break with a loaded field featuring star-studded groups, including world No. 1 Rory McIlroy playing with No. 2 Jon Rahm and No. 3 Brooks Koepka (2:06 pm. ET Thursday). Justin Thomas, Rickie Fowler and Jordan Spieth are together (1:55 p.m.). Friday’s second round features the group of Dustin Johnson, Justin Rose and Bryson DeChambeau (1:55 p.m.). Kevin Na begins defense of his title alongside Mickelson and Gary Woodland (2:06 p.m.).

FedExCup

The standings have been frozen for three months since the PGA Tour halted play March 13 because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Tyrrell Hatton was the most recent winner on Tour at the Arnold Palmer Invitational, which moved him up 67 spots to No. 14. Sungjae Im took the lead on the strength of a win in the Honda Classic and a tie for third in the Arnold Palmer Invitational. The FedExCup culminates with the Tour Championship at East Lake Golf Club in Atlanta the first week of September. Rory McIlroy is the defending champion.

Tour restart might help Koepka rebound

Brooks Koepka hasn’t been right for some time now.

Not since his left knee started bothering him last year and he required surgery Sept. 2 to repair a partially torn patella tendon, which he reaggravated in October when he slipped on wet concrete.

Thus, one of the most imposing figures in professional golf with his Popeye arms, six-pack abs and barrel chest, as well as a resume just as intimidating — he won three times in 2019, including his fourth major at the PGA Championship, and posted runner-up finishes in the Masters and U.S. Open — became a bit player instead of a first-page leaderboard occupant.

Check the results. Back in August, he was leading the FedExCup standings and ranked No. 1 in the world. Now he’s 213th in the FedExCup standings and No. 3 in the world.

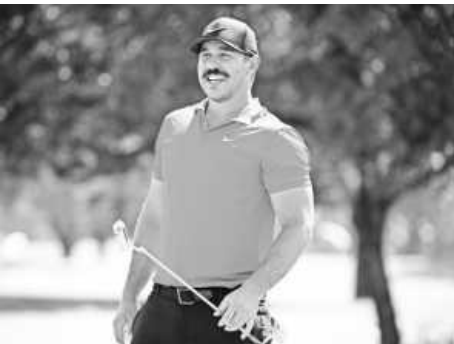
His most recent top-10 result came when he finished fourth in the Tour Championship last August. He started

this wraparound season with a missed cut in Las Vegas, a withdrawal in South Korea at the CJ Cup and then skipped the Presidents Cup because of his knee. He started this year with ties for 34th and 17th in a swing through the Middle East on the European Tour, then tied for 43rd in the Genesis Invitational, missed the cut in the Honda Classic and tied for 47th in the Arnold Palmer Invitational before the PGA Tour shut down three months ago.

Was Koepka reaching a boiling point? Not in the least.

He never lost his cool nor his confidence. Still, the three-month break due to the COVID-19 pandemic was a blessing for him. A new and improved Koepka — check out the fresh moustache — arrived at Colonial Country Club in Fort Worth, Texas, as the PGA Tour resumes play with the Charles Schwab Challenge.

“I got lucky,” Koepka said Wednesday at Colonial. “(The break) was definitely beneficial for me. I was able to kind of reassess where I was at, get the knee stronger. The knee is back. It’s a lot better. And then finally be able just to swing

the club the right way and kind of get back to the process or the way of thinking that I had before. It’s been a blessing in disguise for me without a doubt.”

Koepka has never been one to sweat, has shouldered the blame and just moved forward. He thought he was on the right track at the Players Championship before the PGA Tour’s flagship event — and the Tour — was halted after the first round in March.

“It was starting to come around. I felt

something positive. But right now it’s a million times better,” he said. “The swing feels like it’s in a great spot. I’m controlling ball flights, controlling spin, yardages, putting it good, chipping it good. I feel like a new person, honestly.

“The way I’m able to move right now is a lot better than I was three months ago, four months ago.”


Koepka admitted he dug himself a hole but is certain he’ll pull himself out. He’s been at Colonial since Saturday, played every day since, and will pull on good vibes from his only start in the tournament, when he shot a pair of 63s and finished second to Justin Rose in 2018. He also has experience in dealing with layoffs due to injuries, so concern is not in his yardage book.

“It feels like I’ve done this too many times over the last two years with injuries, having a couple months off, but to finally be back playing, it’s exciting, and I can’t wait to tee it up,” he said. “If I do what I’m supposed to do, I’ll be just fine. I didn’t do what I was supposed to do. It is what it is; I can’t change it. It’s in the past. But you play good, you win, everything will take care of itself.”

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

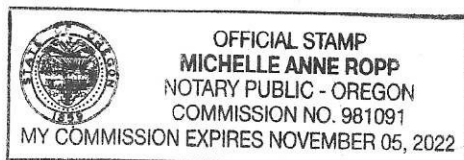
