Anna D. Shapiro goes swimming with Larry David

Director dives into fresh waters in 'Fish'

Tony Award-winning director Anna D. Shapiro remembers being asked if she would work with Larry David on his Broadway debut. "I totally panicked," she says. "I said, 'I cannot do that. I just cannot do that.'"

Shapiro told Scott Rudin, lead producer of Fish in the Dark, which is written by and stars David, that she wasn't funny enough for the gig. David is a comedic legend, co-creator of Seinfeld and creator and star of Curb Your Husbands. "I thought, 'I do not want Larry David flaming out that I'm not funny.'"

Surely, Shapiro protests too much. She is, after all, the woman who helmed Tracy Letts' tragicomic epic August: Osage County — first at Chicago's renowned Steppenwolf Theatre Company, where she becomes artistic director this fall, then in New York. Her Broadway credits also include Stephen Adly Guins'

fiercely acerbic The Motherf---er or With the Hat, which featured Chris Rock in its cast.

Fish, now in previews for an opening Thursday, finds the director in a different milieu, but it's one she's not unfamiliar with: "Seinfeld had a huge impact on Curb, but there are moments when Larry's about to go down a certain road that I think, 'I can't watch that, because it's so horribly, wonderfully real.'"

Fish, while lighter in texture than Shapiro's previous New York efforts, has made her face her fears, she says. As the play opens, a Jewish patriarch is dying; his sons, played by David and Ben Shenkman, must soon deal with

the fallout — chiefly, what to do about their mother, portrayed by celebrated stage veteran Jayne Houdyshell. (The cast also includes Rita Wilson as David's character's wife.)

Shapiro has been impressed with her leading man, onstage and off. "Larry has described himself as a failed stand-up, so I figured live performance would be something he'd have to learn about," she says. "But he understands perfectly how to calibrate his performance for the frame that he's in."

After performances, David goes outside "every night in the freezing cold" to sign autographs, Shapiro says. "I tease him and tell him that anyone can fake being nice for a few months. I don't want people saying, 'Oh, he's got her convinced that he's a prince of a guy.' But I must tell you — I think he's a prince of a guy."

Harrison Ford's engine died on takeoff

The engine on actor Harrison Ford's vintage plane failed on takeoff from a Santa Monica airport, then clipped a tree before a crash-landing on a golf course, said a preliminary report by federal in-

vestigators found Tuesday. The National Transportation Safety Board's findings confirm details of the crash Thursday that sent Ford, 72, to the hospital with broken bones and a gash to his head. The World War II-era plane, a Ryan Aeronautical ST3KR, took off from Santa Monica Airport at

2:21 p.m. Thursday. Ford did not file a flight plan. The badly damaged plane, registered to MG Aviation Inc., has been taken to a "secure location for further examination," the NTSB said. A completed investigation could take up to a year. Son Ben Ford, a chef, has said his father is doing well.

Box 309, Avinger, TX 75630-0309, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for a renewal and revision of Federal Operating Permit and Acid Rain Permit (herein referred to as Permit) No. O32. Application No. 22035, to authorize operation of the Lone Star Power Plant, an Electric Services facility. The area addressed by the application is located at the intersection of highways 259 and 729 in Lone Star, Morris County, Texas 75668. This application was received by the TCEQ on October 17, 2014.

The purpose of a federal operating permit is to improve overall compliance with the rules governing air pollution control by clearly listing all applicable requirements, as defined in Title 30 Texas Administrative Code § 122.10 (30 TAC § 122.10). The draft permit, if approved, will codify the conditions under which the area must operate. The permit will not authorize new construction. The executive director has completed the technical review of the application and has made a preliminary decision to prepare a draft permit for public comment and review. The executive director recommends issuance of this draft permit. The permit application, statement of basis, and draft permit will be available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ Central Office, 12100 Park 35 Circle, Building E, First Floor, Austin, Texas, the TCEQ Tyler Regional Office, 2916 Teague Drive, Tyler, Texas 75701-3734, and the Morris County Courthouse, 500 Broadway St., Daingerfield, Texas, beginning the first day of publication of this notice. At the TCEQ central and regional offices, relevant supporting materials for the draft permit, as well as the New Source Review permits which have been incorporated by reference, may be reviewed and copied. **Public Comment/Notice and Comment Hearing.** Any person may submit written comments on the draft permit. Comments relating to the accuracy, completeness, and appropriateness of the permit conditions may result in changes to the draft permit.

A person who may be affected by the emission of air pollutants from the permitted area may request a notice and comment hearing. The purpose of the notice and comment hearing is to provide an additional opportunity to submit comments on the draft permit. The permit may be changed based on comments pertaining to whether the permit provides for compliance with the public notice procedures were not satisfied. The TCEQ may grant a notice and comment hearing on the application if a written hearing request is received within 30 days after publication of the newspaper notice. The hearing request must include the basis for the request, including a description of how the person may be affected by the emission of air pollutants from the application area. The request should also specify the conditions of the draft permit that are inappropriate or specify how the preliminary decision to issue or deny the permit is inappropriate. All reasonably ascertainable issues must be raised and all reasonably available arguments must be submitted by the end of the public comment period. If a notice and comment hearing is granted, all individuals that submitted written comments or a hearing request will receive written notice of the hearing. This notice will identify the date, time, and location for the hearing.

Written public comments and/or requests for a notice and comment hearing should be submitted to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, Office of the Chief Clerk, MC-106, P.O.
