Say 'I do' to 'The Gown,' historic royal wedding tale

From "The Crown" to ... "The Gown." The British royal family is all the rage these days, and Queen Elizabeth II remains the mother of all matriarchs at a sprightly yet stately 92.

But as history lovers and fans of "The Crown" know, Elizabeth was once a young princess bride.

"The Gown" (William Morrow, 371 pp., ★★★☆) is subtitled "A Novel of the Royal Wedding," a clever come-on likely to sell books, if a bit of a misleading tease.

The main players in Jennifer Robson's intelligent and intriguing tale are not the betrothed Elizabeth and Philip, but rather three decidedly non-royal characters: Ann Hughes and Miriam Dassin in 1947 London, and Heather Mackenzie, Ann's granddaughter, in 2016 Toronto.



Toggling between past and present Heather, a journalist - is tasked with has become a predictable and often annoving device in historical fiction, especially with "women's fiction." The character in the present - in this case,

unraveling a mystery, the secrets her beloved "Nan" took to the grave.

Happily, Robson shines when she whisks us back to 1947, where Ann and

Miriam squeak out an income amid the privations of postwar Britain, working in the exclusive fashion house of Norman Hartnell, real-life couturier to the royal family. The two young embroiderers are cut from very different bolts of cloth, but they become good friends when Miriam moves in as Ann's housemate.

Miriam, who is French and has come to England for a fresh start, has secrets of her own: She survived the Holocaust. She is a particularly well-spun character, who becomes a famous textile artist during her lifetime.

In 1947, though, Ann and Miriam are mere talented peons on the team tasked with stitching the intricate, delicate embroidery on Elizabeth's wedding gown. All the world would love a glance at Hartnell's top-secret design.

Enter the men in the story, some wonderful ones and one terribly bad apple. Robson has the chops of a very good mystery writer, and "The Gown" is at its best in its darkest (and most moving) moments.

The novelist tries, though, to be all things to all readers, and of course we must have a happy, semi-improbable (if predictable) romance bud overnight when Heather arrives in London to unlock her grandmother's past.

I doubt most readers of "The Gown" will mind. After all, didn't they come for a love story, one that has endured for more than 70 years?

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

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Dallas' run game best bet to slow Donald

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FRISCO, Texas - Cowboys running back Ezekiel Elliott sees him.

"Big 9-9 in the middle," he said of Aaron Donald (and referencing his jersey number) when asked Tuesday. "Could be one of the most disruptive defensive players in this league. He's a guy you've got to game plan around, guy who has a lot of production. He's a special player."

Shutting down the Rams' all-pro defensive tackle will be key as the Cowboys chase an upset Saturday night in the NFC divisional round.

Donald led the league with 20½ sacks this season, 4½ more than the runnerup, the Texans' J.J. Watt. Donald registered three consecutive multi-sack games while anchoring a unit that won plus-11 in the turnover battle. Since coach Sean McVay and defensive coordinator Wade Phillips joined Donald in 2017, the Rams are 18-0 in games when he has a sack.

Consider a Cowboys team that allowed 56 sacks in the regular season (second worst) warned.

"He's a combination really of everything that's good in a defensive tackle," said all-pro right guard Zack Martin, who has played against Donald since college. (Martin went to Notre Dame and Donald attended Pittsburgh.)

"A lot of times when you play a defensive tackle, they're really strong but may not be as quick. He's pretty much every-

thing." Donald will face a quarterback in Prescott who has won 16 of 19 games (postseason included) when taking zero or one sacks. The Cowboys are closer to .500 at 17-14 when Prescott is sacked at least twice.

One of those defeats came in 2017 to the Rams, a two-sack game Dallas lost 35-30. Donald had two quarterback hits

in 59 snaps but no sacks as Prescott spun out of a neck hold on 3rd-and-7 to complete an 18-yard pass to Dez Bryant.

"It's picking and choosing our spots ... where we can apply pressure and activate things that put pressure," McVay said of the pass rush in a conference call with Dallas reporters. "Dak's a tough guy to bring down."

But Donald, fellow tackle Ndamukong Suh, outside linebacker Dante Fowler Jr. and defensive end Michael Brockers are among those who will try.

Pro Football Focus ranked the unit third best among defensive front sevens this season (after the Eagles and Jaguars). A Cowboys' offensive line that struggled with consistency dropped from fourth to 14th in a year.

The Cowboys' best bet?

Capitalize on a leaky run D.

The Rams' 122.3 rushing yards per game this season ranked 23rd. Their 5.1 yards per carry allowed ranked dead last.

"Teams that have been successful have done the little things right, executed, hit some big runs against them,"

"At the same time, you can't look at that stat and think it's going to be easy sledding running the ball."

Elliott, the league's rushing champion with 1,434 yards, averaged 4.7 yards per carry. He rushed for 95.6 per game, averaging 125 total yards from scrimmage while also lead blocking on key plays such as red-zone quarterback draws for Prescott. Those run-pass options will factor into the Cowboys' game

But Dallas can't rely on the Rams to run to victory, Elliott said.

"The regular season is over," Elliott said. "This is playoff football. I think all that stuff gets thrown out the window once we get out there.

"Everyone is going to be playing hard. Everyone is going to be playing to win."

Rivers still having fun in postseason after 15 seasons

COSTA MESA, Calif. - Perhaps the most surreal special moment of the Chargers' improbable season came last week, deep in the wild-card victory that would secure a shot at the Patriots this

In the fourth quarter against the Ravens and leading 20-3, Philip Rivers, 37 years slow, suddenly took off into open space. He tottered his way to nine priceless yards, absorbed a tasty hit at the end of the play, then spontaneously unraveled the move that would launch a thousand social media grins.

Rivers rose to his feet, tilted his head to the side, paused statue-like for a moment, then theatrically thrust out his arm to signify "first down."

The 15-season veteran is no-nonsense and practical to a fault, pretty much the last guy you expect to take off and (kind of) sprint and an improbable candidate for an on-field celebration. All of which made it all the more wonderful, of course, unless you are a Ravens fan.

In pro football, where the loosening of restrictions on how players respond to big plays has provided gif gold and shifted the No Fun League into the Now Follow League, Rivers' jab was the celebratory version of a dad joke. Hammed up, unashamedly so. Utterly dorky, and completely lovable. Predictably the internet adored it, and so did everyone

And the underlying message? In case you hadn't noticed, Rivers and his barn-

San Di....sorry, L.A., is coming off a 12-4 thrill ride of a campaign and poses a threat the five-time champion Patriots are refusing to take lightly. Tom Brady is 7-0 against Rivers but has never faced his fellow future Hall of Famer in form like this. Or as relaxed as this. Celebrations and all.

'The little 15-year-old boy came out in me," Rivers said on Wednesday, when quizzed about his impromptu showmanship. "It was good. It was the first thing my wife said when I got home, she was just so happy to see (me) having so

The value of Rivers' focused but lowkey approach to the postseason is not lost on second-year coach Anthony Lynn, who unlocked the puzzle of the surging Ravens two weeks after losing at home to the same team.

'Guys who haven't been in this situation, he can help them out," Lynn said. "He is relaxed. He can slow things

For the second week running the Chargers will head to the East Coast for a game that kicks off, according to their body clocks at least, at 10 a.m. The antidote, says Rivers, is enjoying the proc-

"You have to (have fun)," he added. "It is a job, an important one. There are families and many people involved, but at the same time ... it is a game. That was important for us last week, to not feel that all of a sudden we have got to play a perfect game, because this is the playoffs. Let's just play."

Rivers brings veteran leadership and a steady hand to the camp. His ninth child is on the way, the oldest of whom was born when third-string quarterback Cardale Jones was just 9. He dresses in cowboy boots and listens to country but his fellow signal-callers, Jones and Geno Smith, think he's plenty cool.

"Rivers has swag man," Smith told USA TODAY. "He is the swag master. That celebration? That was one of the coolest things I've ever seen."

Rivers has miserable memories of the Patriots, and it is in some ways fitting that if the Chargers are to go a step further in what has been a golden season

that nearly landed them the No. 1 seed in the AFC, overcoming New England should be part of the journey.

It all started with a heartbreaking divisional-round defeat in January 2007, ending a Chargers' season that had seemingly unlimited promise after La-Dainian Tomlinson spearheaded a 14-2 regular-season record.

A year later came the only other playoff meeting and another unsatisfactory conclusion. Rivers, playing through a torn ACL, repeatedly took the Chargers down the field, but not into the end zone, resulting in a 21-12 defeat.

It was a long time ago now, and a lot has changed. Mock the Chargers if you like for leaving San Diego and parking temporarily at Dignity Health Sports Park, a 30,000-seat soccer stadium. But underestimate this team, with its exquisite defense and Rivers' solid guidance,

At a combined age of 78, Brady and Rivers will be the oldest pair of starting quarterbacks in playoff history. It will be a rare occasion in which Rivers is the comparative youngster, four years shy of Brady in both age and NFL longevity.

"It doesn't happen so much anymore where I'm the young one," he said.

Maybe it is appropriate then that Rivers, invigorated by the Chargers' return to significance after years in the doldrums, has the vibe and enthusiasm of a rookie as one of his long career's greatest opportunities approaches.

"If it becomes not fun," he said, pausing for a moment with a beaming smile, "then we're in the wrong deal."
