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

For ‘Martins!’ it’s barbells and lattes

The reigning World’s Strongest Man says he usually wakes up between 8 a.m. and noon. He makes a latte. He strolls over to his balcony, which overlooks the Pacific Ocean. And before he does anything else, he spends a few moments just sitting, taking in the view.

“I think about life,” Martins Licis says. “Listen to the birds chirp.”

Licis is 6-foot-3, 355 pounds and, by all measures, one of the strongest human beings. He won last year’s World’s Strongest Man competition by, among other things, dragging a pair of monster trucks and squatting a 750-pound barbell nine times.

But as the coronavirus pandemic has swept through the country, grinding much of American life to a halt, Licis now spends his social-distancing days more or less like the rest of us. He says he’s cooking more frequently and eating healthier. Connecting with loved ones. And spending more time on hobbies, such as playing video games and painting.

“Sometimes I get into these binges of painting,” said Licis, noting he prefers acrylics to oils. “I love painting people. ... Our brains are wired to see imperfections or notice things are off in the human face or figure more than anything else in nature. So I love being challenged by that.”

Licis was born in Latvia but raised in Massachusetts. He now lives in California and represents the United States in strongman competitions, which generally combine elements of powerlifting and endurance.

Although his nickname – “King Dragon” – is fittingly ferocious for a strongman, it belies his affable personality. The 29-year-old will often celebrate a successful lift by yelling his name, “Martins!” and grinning. He describes himself on his YouTube page as “The Most Serious Goof in Strength Sports.”

A strongman’s training (and eating) routine seems ill-suited for social distancing, but Licis said he’s getting by just fine. Although he’s been saddened to see and hear about the widespread impacts of COVID-19 over the past few weeks – the lives and jobs that have

been lost to the disease – he’s trying to focus on the silver linings.

“I get to recover my body, because I’m not competing in any competitions,” Licis said. “I can scale back from ridicu-

lously heavy weights, focus more on my rehab, on health.”

Licis said he’s been dealing with nagging ailments in his left knee and right hamstring for about two years now. So-

cial distancing has given him a chance to lift lighter – “I don’t do anything over 500 pounds,” he said – and focus on moving more slowly during workouts and with more precise technique.

With the 2020 World’s Strongest Man competition postponed from May to November, there is no flipping tires or pushing cars – at least at this point in Licis’ training regimen. And with gyms still shut down, he usually just rides his electric bicycle to a friend’s garage, where they take turns using a single barbell for workouts.

“Give me a barbell and some weights, I’m happy,” he said. “I can do everything I need to do.”

Licis, who edged out Poland’s Mateusz Kieliszewski and Hafþór “The Mountain” Björnsson to win the 2019 World’s Strongest Man competition, also isn’t eating quite as much as he otherwise would have been at this time.

Instead of the 7,000 to 10,000 calories he’d been consuming in the lead-up to a competition, his daily intake is about 5,000. Breakfast is usually eight eggs, English muffins, vegetables and perhaps an orange. Lunches, dinners and other intermittent meals usually include steak or some sort of burger meat with potatoes, spinach and carrots.

“In the beginning of this quarantine, (finding meat) was pretty awful. But now it’s kind of leveled out,” he said. “The only thing is toilet paper. It’s still impossible to get that.”

Besides painting, Licis said he’s been spending quite a bit of time playing video games, primarily “Overwatch,” which has become extremely popular in the world of esports. (“I’d love to become also a professional gamer down the line,” he added.) He also posts regularly to his YouTube page, which has racked up more than 160,000 subscribers.

“We really try to be honest with everything I’m going through, to show that it’s not all badass and lifting heavy and pedal to the metal,” Licis said. “A lot of this is difficult and painful. A lot of days I’ll have to pull back or miss lifts. So to portray that and how I overcome these obstacles, so people don’t just think we’re all just genetic freaks and can push through everything. It’s always problem solving.”

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PGA TOUR SEVEN RESTART TAKEAWAYS

Golf plans to begin anew in June

On Tuesday evening, Golfweek obtained a copy of a presentation outlining how the PGA Tour planned to restart professional golf in the United States. On Wednesday morning, that presentation was shared with a select group of media members on a teleconference.

The Tour's restart plan addresses all aspects of an event, from agents and Tour players' families not being allowed on-site to the modification of practice facilities to hand sanitizer being available throughout the grounds. Players can take chartered flights from one event to the next and would be encouraged to stay at hotels that are partnering with the PGA Tour.

On the conference call, PGA Tour officials also outlined several other details and gave further clarification about how they hope to bring the game back in the era of COVID-19. Here are seven key takeaways from that call.

1. Optics are important

The PGA Tour recognizes that being one of the first major sports to restart will bring an increased number of eyes and scrutiny in how tournaments are run. Players, caddies and officials have received a resource guide that explains how things will be different. Along with testing, social distancing will be crucial and expected, even between a player and his caddie. For example, players will be expected to take their ball out of the hole, and caddies are expected to clean rakes and flagsticks after they touch them. No one is going to high-five or shake hands during or after the round.

"It will come down to, on the field of play, relying on players and caddies to have that social distancing requirement in the forefront of their minds," said Andy Pazder, the PGA Tour's chief tournament and competitions officer. "We will have constant reminders. We're confi-

dent that they understand the significant responsibility they carry in making our return very successful."

2. Local labs can quicken testing

Upon arrival, golfers, caddies and many tournament officials will have to complete a questionnaire, thermal test and RT PCR Nasal Swab or Saliva test. In most cases, results from the swab test take 24 to 48 hours, but the Tour plans to use local labs that have the capacity to quicken the process of getting results. The hope is that results can be determined within a matter of hours, but the PGA Tour has made it clear it will not take over local resources that are urgently needed in order to test golfers. The PGA Tour anticipates needing to test about 400 people at each event.

3. Positives won't be disclosed

If a player tests positive for COVID-19, he will not be allowed to compete and will be forced to self-isolate for at least 10 days. The PGA Tour does not release the medical information of the players, so if a player tests positive the Tour will not make a formal announcement about it. Players, however, are free to confirm or announce the positive.

4. Fewer people will be in common areas

To maintain social distancing, the number of players allowed in the locker room, dining areas and scoring areas will be greatly reduced. As a guideline, the Tour is implementing a square footage allowance of 36 square feet per player in common areas. That equates to 27 people in a 1,000 square-foot space.

5. Help for overseas players is coming

Approximately 25 PGA Tour players are currently outside the United States, and during Wednesday's call the Tour

explained that it is working with the federal government to help get those players who want to compete back in the country.

"We are optimistic that we will be able to facilitate their return prior to our return to competition," said Andy Levinson, the PGA Tour's senior vice president of tournament administration.

6. Players should stay inside the bubble off the course, too

While the PGA Tour is not mandating that players take the chartered flights between event locations or stay in the Tour's designated hotels, it wants players to have a "Safer at Home" mentality when they leave the course.

Using ride-sharing services like Uber or Lyft is forbidden and golfers are being told to avoid crowds.

If a player feels safer and more comfortable at a different hotel or on a differ-

ent plane, that's fine, but the Tour is trying to create havens that go above and beyond to ensure player safety.

7. Fans may not be back for a while

We already knew that spectators will not be allowed at the Charles Schwab Challenge, the RBC Heritage, Travelers Championship or the Rocket Mortgage Classic.

However, the Tour made it clear there is no line in the sand or certain date when fans will be back.

"We are not wedded to any specific date," Pazder said. "Obviously it is going to be dependent on local, state and federal regulations that will largely dictate when we are able to resume having some number of fans.

"I would absolutely anticipate that whenever that occurs, it would initially be on a limited basis to ease ourselves back into having spectators on site."

White produced the blueprint for boxing's restart

UFC President Dana White demonstrated that it can be done successfully.

White staged UFC 249 this past Saturday night at VyStar Veterans Memorial Arena in Jacksonville, Florida, his first event since the coronavirus pandemic took hold in March. And consensus is that things went well. The fights were fun to watch even without the energy of spectators.

In fact, I found it interesting to hear low-decibel sounds – the referee's warnings to the fighters, for example – that might've been lost amid the din of the crowd.

Bottom line: White proved that a high-quality combat sports event can be staged in a responsible manner amid the ongoing COVID-19 threat. And it's a good bet the powers that be in boxing were paying close attention.

White took all of the necessary precautions.

All of those connected to the event were screened beforehand, which included COVID-19 testing. Production crews were limited to essential personnel who were required to wear masks and gloves. Social distancing was encouraged. Fighters trained in separate areas. The mat was disinfected between fights. And the list goes on.

"The whole world is weird right now. Everything's weird. This event's weird," White told reporters, including MMA Junkie, after UFC 249. "It's different. We live in a different world than we did two months ago. The bottom line is the system worked.

"What you don't want to do is two days after the fight say, 'Awe, Jacare (Souza) tested positive.' So it worked.

The system worked that we put in place."

Indeed it did. And it served as an example for those in boxing. Bob Arum, who was critical of White, said he plans to begin staging cards the first week of June. He and other boxing promoters will have benefited from the work White and Company did on Saturday.

It wasn't a perfect promotion. Middleweight "Jacare" Souza and two of his cornermen tested positive for COVID-19 on Friday, the day before the event. That's bad.

UFC's reaction to the news was good. White pointed out that UFC officials tested 300 people during fight week. Souza and his cornermen were the only ones who tested positive. The 23 remaining fighters tested negative.

Souza was removed from the competition and, along with his cornermen, he left the host hotel to self-isolate elsewhere. UFC's medical team reportedly monitored their condition and provided

any assistance they needed, medical or otherwise.

The rest of the show apparently went off without a significant hitch.

"We administered 1,200 tests this week, on 300 people," White told ESPN. "It's not unexpected one person would test positive. The system works.

"And what's good about this is now we know Jacare tested positive, he's doing what he needs to do, and we're in a position to help him if he needs it."

So not only did White pull off a successful event, he and his team demonstrated that a positive test doesn't have to be a disaster.

Now it's important to ask one question: Could we learn later that some of those involved contracted the virus at UFC 249?

That's possible. And if those numbers turn out to be significant, we might have to reassess the event. However, in terms of what we know at this moment, White scored a knockout.

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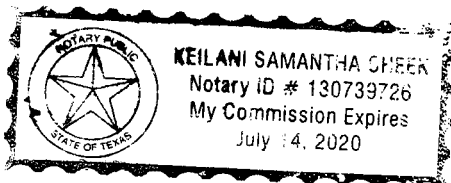

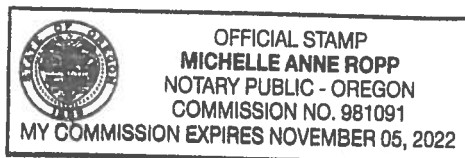
