

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

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Brown proves again he's underrated

The Boston Celtics have an All-NBA

player in Jayson Tatum, and the 2021-22 Defensive Player of the Year in Marcus Smart.

Jaylen Brown doesn't exactly get lost in the shuffle on a 51-win team, but he may be one of the more underappreciated and unheralded players in the league, at least outside of Boston.

Brown scored 25 of his game-high 30 points in the first half Tuesday night, establishing a presence offensively in the Celtics' 109-86 victory against Milwaukee in Game 2 of their Eastern Conference semifinals series. A lot of talk on Game 2 will center on Boston's defense and what it did to the Bucks and Giannis Antetokounmpo in particular. Rightfully so, too. The Bucks star finished with 28 points but had just five in the first

half as the Celtics built a 65-40 lead.

But coming out of Milwaukee's Game 1, Celtics coach Ime Udoka wasn't as concerned about the defense as he was the offense. Boston held Mil-

waukee to 101 points. Scoring just 89 was the problem.

How did the Celtics rectify that? They were just a more efficient team in the paint, mid-range and from 3-point range.

Brown arrived at the arena early.

"Just mental and physical preparation," Brown said. "Get my body going physically, get my mind focused, visualizing the game, seeing what's coming, and coming out and performing. That's it."

He wasn't the only Celtic with a big game. Jayson Tatum scored 29 points and Grant Williams had 21, and Brown, Tatum and Williams were a combined 17-for-29 on 3s. Boston outscored Milwaukee 60-9 on 3-pointers. It's a wonder that Milwaukee didn't lose by more.

Brown was at the forefront of that offensive movement. In the first half, he made 9 of 10 shots from the field, including all five of his 3-point attempts, and had 17 points in the first quarter, all from deep or mid-range.

"JB was locked in," Tatum said. "If I was a bettin' man, I would've bet JB was going to have a great game. He set the tone. That was big for us, just how aggressive he was coming out of the gate."

Brown is just 25 years old and has averaged at least 20 points the past three seasons, including a career-high 24.7 in 2020-21 when he made the All-Star team for the first time. This season, he averaged 23.6 points, 6.1 rebounds and 3.5 assists while shooting 47.3% from

the field and 35.8% on 3s.

Those are All-Star numbers, and they are hidden behind Tatum's stats. For context, Brown was one of 11 players to average at least 23-6-3 this season alongside other perimeter players like Tatum, Kevin Durant, Luka Doncic, Le-Bron James and Paul George.

Brown deserves more recognition.

He is capable of delivering like that all series. He might not get 30 every game, but Brown (and Tatum) needed to play better offensively than they did in Game 1. They were a combined 10-for-31 shooting for 33 points. Two days later, after watching video, practicing and stewing over a loss, they were 21-for-38 for 59 points, and it was necessary with Smart (bruised right thigh) sidelined.

"Survival of the fittest," Brown said. "Every game counts. ... We can't let one game dictate how this series is going to go."

With Ja Morant, Grizzlies are cracking the Warriors' code

MEMPHIS, Tenn. – Stephen Curry reached out his hand and Ja Morant shook it back, though neither actually broke stride. Game 2 was over, the greatest game of Morant's career, and he looked back with his one good eye as the two headed to locker rooms on the opposite ends of the FedExForum court Tuesday night.

"We going to have some fun," Morant said to Curry, and he later revealed it was what Curry had said to him and Jaren Jackson Jr. after Game 1.

So the more telling comment came from Curry, once the Memphis Grizzlies evened their series against the Golden State Warriors at one game apiece with a 106-101 win.

Once he was asked whether the compelling and increasingly contemptuous first two games of this NBA Western Conference semifinal series had taken him by surprise.

Once he answered with a hint of resignation in his voice, from knowing what Morant had just done could be done again because Golden State might not have anybody who can stop it from being done. "You just got to win four games," Curry said. "Somehow, some way." There's a vulnerability and desperation to these Warriors that didn't exist the last time they were in the NBA playoffs, a sense they have to prove they can reach that championship level again in this new decade of contention, and every bit of off-court drama in this matchup with Memphis, every emotional mood swing, should be digested and viewed with that in mind. It has been there since this series began, a series setting up to be the one talked about more than any other in this round of the postseason. Both Golden State and Memphis will head to San Francisco for Saturday's Game 3, able to talk themselves into believing they should be up 2-0 based on how they played. Memphis, the team that scored more points in the paint than anyone else in the NBA this season, is outshooting Golden State from 3-point range. Golden State, founding fathers of the smallball revolution that ranked in the top five in the NBA in every 3-point shooting category this season, is pounding Memphis on the offensive glass.

It is a strange dichotomy that produced a sensational opening flourish these past few days, full of tension and triggers.

"Dillon Brooks broke the code," Golden State coach Steve Kerr declared after Game 2, and it reads as ridiculous as it sounds coming from the coach who never brought up this code just two days earlier when Draymond Green yanked Brandon Clarke from midair.

But what if that inflammatory statement provided the Warriors with as much cover as it did rightful outrage over a selfish flagrant foul that could merit a suspension?

What if, with Morant, the Grizzlies could be on the verge of cracking Gold-en State's code?

Those 47 points Morant scored were each sensational in their own way, and the final 15 materialized in a fantastic closing kick, as well-timed as any moment in franchise history.

It was Morant beating Curry and Klay Thompson and Jordan Poole and whoever else the Warriors threw at him, on layups and floaters and more 3-pointers than he had hit since Dec. 29. It happened because Golden State doesn't appear to have anyone capable of sticking with Morant for any significant amount of time anymore. Brooks' controversial foul left Garv Payton II with a fractured elbow three minutes into Game 2. Golden State should have been angry. Just like Grizzlies fans were mad at Green. It was a dangerous play by Brooks. It seemed Kerr, Curry and Green were all pushing for Brooks to be suspended without actually using those words, the argument being that Payton's injury deserved further retribution. If Golden State is going to be without its Morant stopper for the time being – although Payton didn't exactly shut down Morant in Game 1 - the Grizzlies might as well be without their best possible option at stopping Curry for an extra game. But what does "The Code" say about an elbow injury when a player awkwardly braces for a fall?

Spicy pork and broccoli fueled goalie for surprise entry in 3-overtime win

Pittsburgh Penguins goaltender Louis Domingue thought the referees were joking when he was told to enter Game 1 of the NHL playoff series against the New York Rangers midway through the second overtime.

In fact, the backup goalie had eaten a meal not long beforehand.

"Spicy pork and broccoli," Domingue said. "It's not great. ... I needed something in my belly."

That probably fueled him because he made 17 saves in relief of injured starter Casey DeSmith (48 saves) and Pittsburgh got the win Tuesday night when Evgeni Malkin scored at 5:58 of the third overtime for a 4-3 victory. It was the first playoff win of Domingue's career and just his second appearance.

"It's crazy, but I guess that's my life, and that's hockey," Domingue said.

He had played four NHL games over the last three seasons and is up with the Penguins because of an injury to No. 1 goalie Tristan Jarry.

Domingue said he was ready, even with being unable to warm up. "It was a lot coming at me fast but it's something you prepare for as a backup," he said. "You've got to be ready at all times. The guys played super well for me the time I was in there, and I think Casey put us in a position to get to overtime." Penguins coach Mike Sullivan said Wednesday that DeSmith is day-today and Jarry is continuing his off-ice rehab. Forward Rickard Rakell, who left the game after a hit from the Rangers' Ryan Lindgren, is also day-to-day.

Capitals upset Panthers

The Washington Capitals upset the Florida Panthers 4-2 Tuesday, handing the NHL's No 1 overall team its eighth home loss this season.

Capitals captain Alex Ovechkin returned to the lineup after missing the final three regular-season games with an upper body injury and played a key role with a defensive play.

He knocked the puck loose from Panthers defenseman MacKenzie Weegar in the third period and Evgeny Kuznetsov swept in on a breakaway and beat goalie Sergei Bobrovsky to tie the score 2-2.

"That's why he's legend, right?" Kuznetsov told reporters. "It's a good thing he didn't touch the puck after so I got a breakaway."

T.J. Oshie put Washington ahead less than three minutes later.

The Capitals did get bad news. Tom Wilson, who scored the first goal, played only three shifts. He is getting treatment for a lower body injury, coach Peter Laviolette said Wednesday, and is a gametime decision for Game 2.

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High stakes: Bauer's fight over ban moves to powerful MLB figure

One of the most powerful people in Major League Baseball has been handing down judgments behind the scenes for decades, always in the middle of some of the game's most high-stakes

disputes: In 1975, it was MLB versus free agency rights for players. In 2013, it was MLB versus superstar

Alex Rodriguez. And now it's MLB versus Trevor Bauer.

This person in power is the impartial that dates to 1970. It has belonged to pri-vate judges who are tasked with making rulings in contentious cases off the field, including the performance-enhancing drug suspension of Rodriguez and soon drug suspension of Rodriguez and soon the upcoming appeal of Bauer, the Los Angeles Dodgers pitcher accused of as-saulting women during sex. Will Bauer's 324-game suspension from MLB be upheld, overturned or re-

duced?

Arbitrator Martin Scheinman in New York is set to decide unless Bauer nego-tiates a settlement beforehand. Schein-man is baseball's current arbitration panel chair and is the fourth "perma-nent" impartial arbitrator in baseball since 2012 after the other three were fired, including his predecessor, Mark Irvings, who was ousted by the MLB commissioner's office in 2020.

commissioner's omce in 2020. "They are difficult cases," Irvings told USA TODAY Sports, speaking of the general workload for the job. "They're high-stakes. Both parties have high ex-pectations. You have to be available for pectations. You have to be available for them, and they have the potential for high visibility. So it's more stressful than most cases." In Bauer's case, the circumstances are unprecedented. This will be the first

time a player has fought and appealed a suspension under baseball's sexual as salt and domestic violence policy, es-tablished in 2015. It is by far the longest suspension under that policy, and Scheinman will have to find "just cause" to uphold it after a hearing. But can he? Bauer was never arrested or charged

"History shows Major League Base-ball plays a little game here," former ball plays a little game here; former MLB Players Association executive Gene Orza told USA TODAY Sports. "They impose massive discipline, which gives them great public relations to show how tough they are, but with the knowledge that the arbitration process are amaliared that meaning discipline". can ameliorate that massive discipline

on appeal. MLB declined to comment, citing the onfidentiality required in the proceed-ings under the collective bargaining agreement with the players union.

In fairness to MLB. Orza concedes that Commissioner Rob Manfred knows more about the Bauer case than has been revealed publicly and is using it to justify this suspension.

But Orza also cites a long list of long MLB disciplinary suspensions that were commuted by the arbitrator, in-cluding Rodriguez's 211-game suspen-sion getting cut to 162 games in January 2014

In other cases, the arbitrator's decisions have had similarly big conse-quences, including for the arbitrator's job security.

The arbitrator is jointly selected by MLB and the MLBPA and can be fired by MLB and the MLBPA and can be fired by either side at any time. The job involves hearing grievances over player disci-pline and contract issues between teams and players, not salary arbitra-tion. Whatever the arbitrator decides,

High stakes, high turnover

In 2012, MLB fired longtime arbitrator Shvam Das after he overturned a 50game drug suspension for slugger Ryan Braun. Braun had tested positive for ele-vated testosterone but his legal team argued his testing sample was not properly handled.

Among other decisions, Das also re-duced MLB's suspension of pitcher John Rocker from 28 to 14 days in 2000 after Rocker disparaged gay people and minorities in a magazine interview.

Das served on the job for 13 years, the longest run for one person since the po-sition was established in the 1970 basic agreement between players and own-ers. He didn't return a message from

USA TODAY Sports seeking comment USA 10DAY Sports seeking comment. "Das' firing sent a clear signal to fu-ture arbitrators that job security is con-tingent upon favorable rulings for MLB," said a lawsuit filed by Rodriguez in 2014 against MLB and the MLBPA.

But the players union has a say, too, as it did with Das's successor, Fredric Horowitz, when he was fired by the players in 2016. Horowitz had reduced Rodriguez's MLB suspension, but Rodriguez called the arbitration hearing a "farce." In his lawsuit, he took a few farce. In his lawsuit, he took a few shots at Horowitz before deciding to drop the case. The suit stated Horowitz has been "widely described as a hard-core baseball fan." It also accused Horo-

witz of "blatant partiality toward MLB." Horowitz still lasted more than two more years in the job before being re-moved after another ruling against the players union in a separate case over an injury assignment for Dodgers player Charlie Culberson. Horowitz now par-ticipates on panels in baseball's sepa-rate salary arbitration process. He de-clined to apmont

clined to comment. "We all fully understand that there

are going to be cases that for whatever reason, one party or the other can't stand the outcome," said Richard Bloch, who served a short stint as baseball arwho served a short stint as baseball ar-bitrator in the 1980s. "They simply be-lieve it was the wrong outcome or in some cases it's a political matter, where their clients are wondering why they would continue to retain this guy who they think didn't understand what was going on."

After Horowitz's firing, Irvings got the call from baseball in 2017 and went 2020 involving then-Chicago Cubs slugger Kris Bryant. The players union claimed Cubs management manipulated his service time to delay his free ed his service time to delay his free agency, but Irvings found that the union did not adequately show that Cubs ex-ecutive Theo Epstein acted in bad faith. Despite that victory over the union, the MLB commissioner's office canned

Irvings later that year without an explanati

"They decided to go in a different di-rection," said Irvings, who declined to discuss specific cases. Asked why he was fired, Irvings said, "I have specula-tion but Leading doc't manu".

The job involves serving on baseball's arbitration panel of three members, which includes one representative appointed by MLB and one by the MLBPA. As the only independent arbitrator on that panel, the impartial arbitrator typically decides cases on a 2-1 vote.

That decision is considered binding though Bauer can make a long-shot bid to have it thrown out in court if he doesn't like it, much like Rodriguez did in 2014.

"They brought me in to decide whether he should be fired. I reinstated Tom, and we always laughed about it for years because he always said
