

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

Penn State really doesn't have a No.1

renn state really doesn't nave a No. I running back, once again. And the run game is struggling at a most inopportune time. The Nittany Li-ons go into a crucial road game at un-defeated lowa with their starter battling

through some type of injury and the backups inconsistent. The Lions are 11th in the Big Ten in rushing yards per game (137.2). They are 12th in third-down conversions (36.5%).

Noah Cain, the official starter, played little against Villanova two weeks ago and was ineffective against Indiana. He's not resembling the rugged, sled dog who pulled Penn State to a fourthquarter victory at Iowa two years ago.

quarter victory at lowa two years ago. He starred with a handful of big plays in the second half of the opener at Wis-consin. Overall, though, he's averaging just 3.2 yards per carry. Head coach James Frankin did not provide details

on his health. "I'd like for us be more physical and pound it up there and get the four or five

Line opening game. Two years ago, the Lions rotated runners beginning to end. Penn State has mostly used three runners with modest success. After starring as a rookie, Keyvone Lee has gotten much less work recently even though he was billed as faster, better and more experienced in preseason

camp. He's carried the ball just 28 times. He does hold a 6.2 average and has the longest run from scrimmage, a 44-yar-der up the middle against Indiana. But he's also struggled at times, especially trying to bounce runs to the outside where's he been caught and dropped. Franklin admitted that rotating run-

ners doesn't easily allow for any to get into a rhythm. "But until somebody steps up and shows they are the guy, it's hard for us ... to just crown somebody.

We'd love for that to happen again." While the offense, overall, ran the ball more effectively against the Hoosiers it still was stop-and-go and strugsiers it still was stop-and-go and strug-gled decisively on short-yardage situa-tions. Quarterback Sean Clifford still balls the team at times by breaking away from the pocket. The Lions look even worse when they are the lions look even worse when they

Iowa defense keying in on Penn State QB

Iowa's defense has made a habit of

benching quarterbacks in 2021. Maryland's Taulia Tagovailoa was the latest to receive the Hawkeyes' de-

fense harsh treatment in Friday's 51-14 thrashing: 157 passing yards (compared to his 335 season average) and five in-terceptions (compared to one entering the game).

Maryland coach Mike Locksley had no choice but to remove his starter from the game, making him the fourth coach in five weeks to do so. While benching quarterbacks isn't an official statistic or even a goal for Iowa's defense, this metric provides context to their early sea success

son success. "It's given us a lot of confidence," vet-eran defensive back Kaevon Merri-weather said. "I think we understand what we need to do. I think we're an experienced group now, with a young de-fensive line they have a lot more experi-ence going on game six. We understand what needs to be done each week."

This week's assignment? Penn State

quarterback Sean Clifford is a familiar quarteroact Saturday's game will be the third meeting against Clifford, and in 2019 he came into Kinnick Stadium and led the Nittany Lions to a 17-12 win. Without question, this will be the best version of Clifford yet. This season

best version of clinord yet. Inis season he ranks third in the Big Ten in passing yards (1,336), passing touchdowns (II) and completion percentage (67.3%). And like Iowa's Spencer Petras, he's riding an impressive winning streak of

his own with nine in a row as a starter.

"(Clifford) is a veteran player, can make any throw that they ask him to make," head coach Kirk Ferentz said. "He's a veteran player, a leader, a guy they look to." Like any guarterback, the main com

ponent in stopping Clifford the passer is with consistent pressure by the defen-sive line. Fourth-ranked Penn State's of-fensive line shut out Indiana's defense in sacks in Saturday's 24-0 win. Statis-In sacks in Sacurday's 24-0 will. Statis-tically, the matchup between the re-spective lines in this game is a toss-up. Penn State ranks sixth in the Big Ten in sacks allowed (8) and Iowa ranks seventh in team sacks (13)

Without pressure, Clifford has

proved to be one of the most accurate proved to be one of the most accurate passers in the country. According to Pro Football Focus, Clifford is completing 72% of his passes when in a clean pock-et this season; this is an 8% upgrade since he first became the starter in 2019. A clean pocket for Clifford means he can some with his torisping labor.

A clean pocket for Clifford means he can connect with his top receiver Jahan Dotson at a dangerous rate. Dotson, like Clifford, has third-ranked Iowa's full at-tention in game planning. The two have connected for the most touchdowns in Connected for the most codendowns in Penn State history (18) and Dotson has recorded at least one 20-yard reception in eight consecutive games. Neutralize Clifford means neutraliz-ing Penn State's big-play ability. "Everything," Ferentz said when

asked what impressed him about Dot-son. "That's what you have to realize: You're playing a team that can close the gap really fast because they've got some guys. ... He's the guy, really good guy.

"As dangerous as anything" Ferentz said of Clifford. "If it's not there for him. sand of Childra. If it's not there for him, something opens up, he'll pull it down and go. He'll throw off the run or take it and make the yardage necessary for a first down or even more than that."


