



Special session to begin on Oct. 9

Given a leader sindicating a special session will be gin on Oct. 9 dealing with what he has called 'school choice' but is more widely known as vouchers.

The Austin American-Statesman reported Abbott has threatened another special session if lawmakers can't come to an agreement this month, and then will take the issue to voters by finding candidates to run against those opposing vouchers.

During the regular session, a coalition of Democrats and many rural House Republicans blocked legislation concerning vouchers that had easily passed the Senate. Abbott has spent much of this year traveling the state encouraging parents and pastors to advocate for school choice.

"I will keep fighting every step of the way until we have school choice in the state of Texas," Abbott said.

Opponents of vouchers say they would divert taxpayer money from public schools. Many public school district leaders say they already struggle to balance their budgets and retain teachers.

Delayed farm bill passage worries ag producers

One of the key bills delayed by the wrangling in Congress is the massive farm bill, which is renewed every five years. The Texas Tribune reports a temporary extension of the current bill is expected to pass, however. The farm bill is key to a host of programs, from crop insurance to food access for low-income families through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or SNAP.

"In a perfect world, we get a farm bill this year. If we don't, though, let's extend it. And let's not pass a farm bill just to say we passed a farm bill," Laramie Adams, national legislative director for the Texas Farm Bureau, said. "We want to make sure that the farm bill is meaningful."



Since the last farm bill was passed in 2018, farmers have been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, Russias invasion of Utraine cutting world grain shipments, and rising costs for equipment and fuel. Meanwhile, market prices for most agricultural products remain stagnant.

"As you look at that and inflation and adjusting for inflation, from our perspective, we need to look at strengthening crop insurance," Adams said. "And that is not an easy task."

Supreme Court to decide on Paxton's back pay

After being acquitted in his impeachment trial, Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton is seeking around \$50,000 in hack pay. However, the state comptroller's office says the best course of action is to let the Texas Supreme Court decide, the Austin American-Statesman reported.

The comptroller's office is responsible for authorizing payments, and Paxton's pay was withheld when he was impeached and suspended from office in late May by the Texas House. Paxton was acquitted by the Senate in September.

"Because we disagree with your interpretation of the Texas Constitution on this very important issue, we encourage you to file a writ of mandamus with the Texas Supreme Court for a definitive ruling," read the letter signed by Victoria North, the comptroller's general counsel on fiscal and agency affairs.

Meanwhile, four ex-employees of Paxton have asked the Texas Supreme Court for permission to move forward with a wrongful termination suit against their ex-boss since they still haven't received their settlement money, kut.org reported. The four had reached a §3.3 million settlement with Paxton in February, but the Texas Legislature never approved the settlement. They are now seek ing to move forward with the lawsuit in Travis County.

"After seven months and after the positions taken at the impeachment trial, there is no reason to believe a final settlement agreement is achievable at this point," Monday's filing with the court reads.

Anti-drag law ruled unconstitutional

A federal judge last week ruled a law restricting drag performances in Texas violates free speech and is unconstitutional, the Texas Standard reported. Senate Bill 12 banned sexually oriented performances in the presence of minors.

U.S. District Judge David Hittner, appointed to the bench by then-President Ronald Reagan, said the law was overly broad.

"Based on evidence and testimony presented at the hearing, the court finds there is substantial likelihood that SB 12 as drafted violated the First Amendment of the United States Constitution under one or more of the legal theories put forward by the plaintiffs, 'Hittner wrote in the temporary restraining order.

The state is expected to appeal.

Camp CAD Appraisers will begin field work

The Camp Central Appraisal District is beginning its field appraisal work in certain parts of the county for the 2024 year

The Appraisal District divided Camp County into three regions for the purpose of reappraisal. Region 1 covers properties within the city limits of Pittsburg and properties along Lake Bob Sandlin. Region 2 covers properties north of Highway 11 (with the exception of properties in Region 1) and Region 3 cov-ers properties south of Highway 11. Properties in Region 2 are scheduled for inspection for the 2024 tax year.

The re-appraisal plan requires an on-site property inspection at least once every three years, and the CCAD conducts its reappraisals according to the every three years, and regions listed above.

With the number of properties to be seen, appointments are not made. Camp County has great neighbors who look out for each other, and word will get around when the staff is in a particular neighborhood.

Appraisers will not ask to enter homes, but will go to the door to make anyone who is there aware they are on the property if they need to measure a new structure or re-measure an existing one.

Each appraiser is required to carry appropriate identification listing their TDLR issued number and a photo ID issued by the district. In addition, field apprais-ers will have "CAMP CENTRAL APPRAISAL DISTRICT" signs on their vehicles with the district's phone number.

Property owners are encouraged to contact the CAD office at 903-856-6538 to confirm an appraiser's identity if there is any question

The appraiser has a checklist for each property, which includes measuring or re-measuring structures. In addition, based on the field manual, appraisers are to "ensure correct classification, condition, and depreciation of all structures; identify if there are any additional issues regarding the structures or the land; ensure correct leveling and identifiers on manufactured homes"; and take a cur rent photograph if necessary.

The appraiser will NOT be able to discuss the value of the property. Valuations are based on sales information and cost schedules that are applied later in the year. At this point, the appraiser is gathering information and performing visual inspections, not setting a value. Exemption applications are not available in the field, but will be mailed to you upon request or when the property's ownership changes.

The staff works diligently to gather accurate information, however, with locks gates or pets, some dimensions may be difficult to confirm in the field. The appraiser will then estimate the measurements using the district's mapping er, with locked system.

Each year, new construction, permits and requested rechecks are done, but property in the Reappraisal Zone must also be completed. There is a strict time-line to accomplish this task and the field staff will need to move quickly to be completed by March. Plans call for completing the reappraisal zone by the first week in February, and then start rechecks and permits.

US men's gymnastics claims bronze at world championships

ANTWERP, BELGIUM For nearly a decade, the U.S. men's gymnastics team left global competi-tions with a familiar sense of disappointment after falling short of the medal podium.

But at the world championships Tuesday, the Americans stormed back from early trouble and capitalized on Britain's mistakes in the final rotations to secure a bronze medal. The U.S. men hadn't won a team medal at the world championships or the Olympics

ician he claims shoved him into such a corner, someone who camouflages his attacks by pretending to be on the defensive.

The woke mob, as he lovingly terms it, moved on from Rodgers, a lost cause long ago, so now he is publicly shooting his bow and arrow at someone else's — what did he call it? — *bodily autonomy*.

His words. You know, back when he argued bodily autonomy should be free from scrutiny.

When he first spoke about his decision to not get vaccinated, he felt so confident in that decision he initially lied to media about it, then said he was allergic to the vaccinations, only to then say something about governmental control or something. He finally settled on this, from November 2021:

"I believe strongly in bodily autonomy and the ability to make choices for your body, not to have to acquiesce to some woke culture or crazed group of individuals who say you have to do something. Health is not one-size-fitsall for everybody."

Which is why it only makes sense that he surely would praise Kelce for coming to his own deci-

sion, even if that decision is different than his. Bodily autonomy and all. Oh.

Wait.

Instead, last week, Rodgers referred to Kelce as "Mr. Pfizer," another example of his true feelings concealed as goodnatured ribbing. Kelce, who has appeared in commercials for Pfizer encouraging people to get the COVID and flu shots, acknowledged the quip was "good" when I asked him about it last week, and added, "Who knew I'd get into vax wars with Aaron Rodgers, man?"

OK, so that was that. Moving on, right? Rodgers, who also once said aloud. "What about 'my body, my choice?" as a defense for his choices, surely wants to stay in harmony with his own words by just putting this all to rest and letting each man make his own decisions. He certainly wouldn't get triggered by Kelce's decision or opinion. His body, his choice, after all.

Oh. Wait.

Instead, Rodgers wants a "John Wick 4" duel pitting Kelce and former National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Disease director Anthony

Fauci on one side, and himself and Robert F. Kennedy Jr. on the other. Because nobody has a better handle on COVID than a next-level conspiracy theorist who even a hardcore conspiracy theorist reads about and thinks, OK, that dude's a little out there.

Why seek medical advice from doctors when you can find someone who believes chemical exposure causes gender dysphoria, antidepressants are the culprits for school shootings and that the 2004 presidential election was stolen? Check the date on the last part of that sentence. "That'd be big ratings,"

said Rodgers, the man who claims to not understand how this is getting so much attention.

Rodgers, mind you, had the opportunity to explain his "own research," which included a medication used to de-worm animals, and replied, "I don't know that exactly or wanna get into that exactly.'

Well, this should be some kind of debate then.

And let's backtrack once more to how Rodgers previously explained the rationale for that vaccine stance: "Health should not be political."

If I can find any agreeable ground with Rodgers through the haughty ignorance, it ought to be there. Doctors, not politicians,

should be aiding healthcare decisions.

Which, you know, is why Rodgers wants RFK Jr., who just so happened to declare this week that he would run for president as an independent, to get involved in the conversation. Just to ensure none of this gets political.

Rodgers is nothing if not remarkably inconsistent.

In his defense, maybe his only defense, it's much more difficult to stay on track when the facts rest on the other side. There's not a case presented in the world that will change anyone's mind about the pandemic, or solutions to the pandemic — an unfortunate truth that I realize. But Rodgers, increasingly seen as some sort of deity to the anti-vax crowd, is an imposter for what he even claims to believe.

On Tuesday, he referred to Kelce as "shilling for a potentially corrupt company."

True to there's-alwaysa-tweet-for-it form, you only have to backtrack to his own history, and not even that far back: Rodgers was once happy to take money from a healthcare organization, Prevea Health, even deep into the pandemic, until they turned off the faucet in November 2021, making clear that they are "encouraging and helping all eligible populations to become vaccinated

against COVID-19 to prevent the virus from further significantly impacting lives and livelihoods.

This would be laughable if not for those last four words. But, hey, the brahs are having a good time with it anyway.

Rodgers is blissfully ignorant to how the millions of viewers on stream might be responding in the moment, but he has a willing audience with host Pat McAfee and sidekick AJ Hawk – and evidently in their new employer, ESPN, which is apparently just fine with being the gateway for their spread of misinformation, so long as it comes with ratings. McAfee has served as nothing more than an automated sit-com laugh track for Rodgers, and the moment the interviews end, he promotes them on social media.

So did ESPN NFL Insider Adam Schefter, for that matter, calling the Rodgers' proposal of the four-way duel "the potential next great American debate.

Ah, yes, right after we get to the bottom of whether Neil Armstrong really landed and walked on the moon.

McAfee boasted Tuesday that the network, which recently gave him a five-year, \$85 million contract per the New York Post, has stayed out of his business, even as Rodgers outwardly mocks those

who choose to receive the vaccine.

"They haven't said a single thing to us," he told Rodgers. "Not a single thing."

In other words, these appearances are uninterrupted campaign speeches, Rodgers stumping for, well, himself as the smartest guy in the room. And don't think for a moment that RFK Jr. didn't enjoy his free advertisement on national TV, either. If anyone pushes back too hard, careful, you might shove Rodgers - and his ratings attraction - right out the door.

McAfee has only once come even close to calling out his friend on any of the obvious hypocrisy, pointing out that Rodgers is the quarterback for the Jets, a team owned by the heir to the Johnson & Johnson pharmaceutical fortune.

On Tuesday, McAfee began to ask Rodgers about his comfort in that dynamic. But Rodgers appeared stuck on a reply, because, guess what, hypocrisy can be hard to defend. So McAfee quickly let his boy off the hook, interrupting the reply he initially sought with, "We'll get your answer next week." Sure. Can't wait.

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

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
