Hunter Hayes is ready to rock the red carpet at CMAs

Hunter Hayes needs caffeine. The CMA award-winning singer has just rebounded from his gig as an opening act for Lady Antebellum's international *Wheels Up Tour*, which wrapped Oct. 3. Now he's on a cross-country, college campus tour to promote Friday's release of his latest compilation, *The 21 Project* — a three-disc set co-produced by Hayes and musician Dann Huff and comprising acoustic, studio and live concert arrangements for seven songs.

Wednesday night is Hayes' one "break" in the nationwide sprint, and he'll spend it under the lights of the AT&T CMA Awards Red

Carpet. "It's super-cool this year; everybody kind of geared up for the show," the 24-year-old says. "It's always a fun time for everybody. It's chaotic. It's full of ener-

gy, and it's kind of a chance to see — not quite the backstage experience — but kind of the vibe for what's going on that night."

AT&T will offer an exclusive live stream of the event beginning at 6 p.m. ET at att.com/cmaredcarpet. Hayes will perform along with country music singer and former *One Tree Hill* star Jana Kramer during the pre-show for the 49th annual awards ceremony.

It's a chance for fans who couldn't make the tour to hear some of the songs from Hayes' experimental new collection.

"I wanted to do something a little more (with this compilation)," Hayes explains. "We always have these weird, wild and wacky acoustic arrangements and the live arrangement always have a different energy as well, so my

thing was like, 'Let's just have all those as part of the story. ... Why not make it all a part of a project? Why not give the fans 21 songs at once vs. just seven?' It just sounded like more fun to me."

Hayes says he can't wait to take the stage Wednesday night. For him, performing is a quasi-spiritual experience. The rush of the crowd, the symbiotic exchange between artist and fan, the evanescent intimacy — none of that can be orchestrated or faked.

"I think a show day is when I kind of get to live in the moment and, you know, for those few hours, I get to experience something that could never be planned or prepared," he says. "You go through rehearsals, sound checks, but what happens onstage during the show is just spirit — it's just what happens."

Hayes and his band treat every show as if it's the most important show they've ever played. And for a musician from Breaux Bridge, La., who still doesn't believe any of this is real, it is.

"It's still a miracle in a way," Hayes says.

It is Hayes' tacit recognition of the surrealism of it all that keeps him working — even as the holidays loom.

"I'm kind of taking advantage of the couple of extra days and doing some more creative stuff."

What's next for the rising star? In a word? More.

More albums. More tours. More challenges. More growth.

"I want to make songs that mean something to people and that they hold onto," he says. "I want to write songs that really resonate, that connect."

Estefans celebrate themselves in 'On Your Feet'

ON YOUR FEET ★★★☆
Starring Ana Villafañe
Marquis Theatre

NEW YORK There are few shades of gray in *On Your Feet*, the new musical hagiography of Emilio and Gloria Estefan now on Broadway.

The show traces the Cuban-American power couple's rise, using songs they made famous in the '80s with Miami Sound Machine, as well as Gloria's solo fare.

There are scenes set in Miami and Havana, where dancers costumed by ESosa (Emilio Sosa) in pastel and fluorescent hues perform Sergio Trujillo's exhilarating choreography — the production's best feature, by far.

Sadly, the broad, obvious strokes used by librettist Alexander Dinelaris, the Oscar-winning

screenwriter of *Birdman*, prove not so appealing. In crafting a book that tells the Estefans' back story, weaving in their songs, Dinelaris follows a template used before in jukebox musicals, perhaps most successfully in *Jersey Boys*, which follows Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons.

On Your Feet is saddled, for starters, with a less rich catalog. The Estefans' success with Miami Sound Machine certainly helped open ears to Latin-influenced music in their day, but to suggest that feather-light dance-pop tunes such as *Conga* and *Rhythm Is Gonna Get You* were revolutionary is overstating the case.

The musical, for which Estefan Enterprises Inc. is one of the lead producers, attributes a similar sense of grand accomplishment to other aspects of its subjects' lives. After their parents flee Fidel Castro's revolution, young Gloria and Emilio work tirelessly

and encounter prejudice before outwitting record company suits to achieve success on their own terms.

If *On Your Feet* condemns such intolerance, it doesn't reject all stereotypes. A Jewish record-company executive played with a

whiny New York accent (by Lee Zarrett) is introduced as a despicable bigot before he's persuaded that the Estefans' music might turn a profit.

The Latin characters also can suffer from lack of nuance, notably Gloria's beloved, feisty *abuela*

— who is played, happily, with great warmth and unabashed gusto by Alma Cuervo.

The performers, under Jerry Mitchell's predictably astute direction, honor the heart under *On Your Feet's* mix of self-importance and hokum. As Emilio, Joshua Segarra affects a hoarse voice suggestive of a chain smoker with a bad cold, but manages a nicely wry chemistry with Ana Villafañe's Gloria.

Villafañe is undeniably the show's star. Her singing uncannily evokes Gloria's slight but distinctive alto.

Her closing number, an inspirational easy-listening hit, is delivered after Gloria has faced her biggest challenge yet, and triumphed.

Certainly, no one would begrudge this likable, admirable pop veteran a happy ending. Still, *On Your Feet* is recommended only to the most diehard of fans.

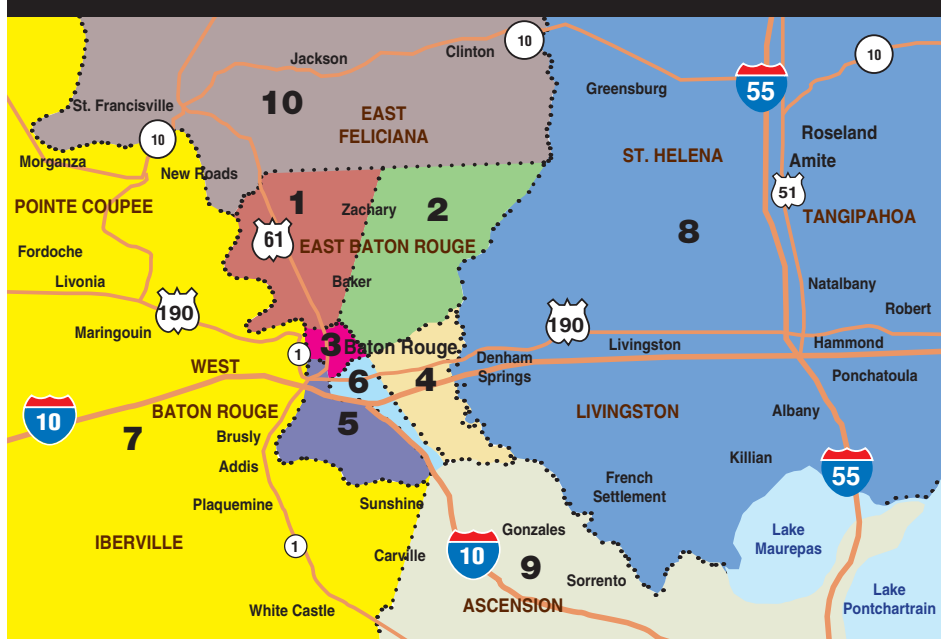
